School Uniform Policy

Policy Statement

Uniform is important in so many respects. It creates a sense of identity and pride in belonging to a school and portrays a good image to the community. It also promotes equality amongst pupils and minimises the impact of issues surrounding fashion and current trends. It is the expectation of staff and governors at Moor Green Primary Academy that pupils attend school wearing the appropriate uniform and that parents support us in this.

Aims

- To ensure every child wears uniform which promotes pride in appearance on the part of the pupil.
- To promote a positive image of the school to the community and visitors.
- To foster a sense of pride in belonging to the school community. parents in ensuring that their child has an acceptable level of attendance.

The school expects parents to support the following guidelines regarding uniform in school:

Boys:

School jumper

White polo shirt

Black or grey trousers.

Girls:

School jumper/cardigan

White polo shirt

Black or grey skirt (or trousers if preferred).

Girls are able to wear green gingham style dresses in warmer weather.

Grey/black/white socks or tights

Footwear

Footwear worn in school must be smart flat black shoes. Trainers are not permitted.



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Jewellery

Earrings must not be worn for health and safety reasons but simple ear studs are allowed if there is no alternative.

Necklaces are discouraged but the school acknowledges circumstances where they may be related to religious or cultural reasons. In these instances the issue must be discussed the Headteacher. The school takes no responsibility for loss and/or damage to any item of jewellery worn to school.

PE Kit

PE kit must be a white t-shirt and black shorts or PE trousers. Pumps must be worn during PE lessons. Trainers are permitted for outdoor PE lessons.

Hair

Hairstyles should be appropriate for the purposes of school. Long hair should be tied back wherever possible for health and safety reasons.

Monitoring of the policy

The effectiveness of this policy is evaluated annually during the latter part of the Summer term by the Headteacher and Governing Body of the school.
