Maria Stanton (American Theological Library Association)

Mandy Lupton (Queensland University of Technology)



Dr Mandy Lupton is a senior lecturer in the Faculty of Education at the Queensland University of Technology. She is the coordinator of the Master of Education (teacher-librarianship). Mandy's research areas are information literacy, inquiry learning and connected learning. Her current project involves analysing the digital identities of pre-service and practising teachers. She is also working on building a model of the connected educator.

Erin Mollenhauer (Moore College)



Erin began her career in information studies as a cataloguer at Moore College Library in 2012, while completing her Masters in Librarianship through Charles Sturt University. After developing an interest in rare books and archives, Erin obtained a further qualification in archives and records management and was appointed Moore College's archivist and special collections librarian in 2017.
