Fishin' at Harvest Square Preserve June 6, 5:30-7:00 pm

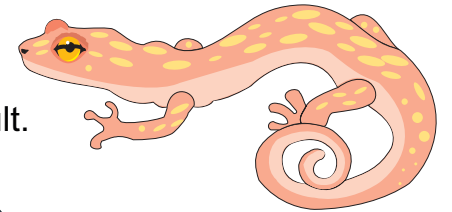

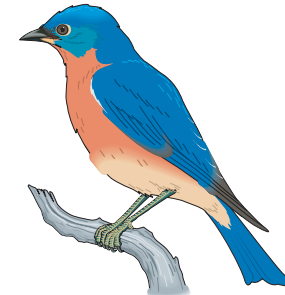
Critters Can Tell the Tale - Water Quality 101 June 13, 9:00 am

See 1/4 Million Endangered Grey Bats

July 11, 7:15 pm, Sauta Cave near Scottsboro NO reservations required

Nick Sharp, Nongame Biologist with the Alabama Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Nongame Wildlife Program, will tell us all about the 250,000+ Gray Bats of North Alabama's protected Sauta Cave. **Sauta Cave is the largest and most important summer cave for grey bats on the planet.** This is the largest bat emergence east of the Mississippi River and the bats emerge about 30 min. before true dark.

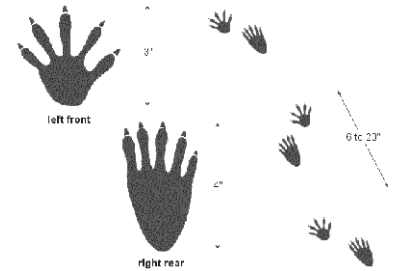
Sauta Cave Drive (closed to cars) is located just past mile marker 131 on Hwy. 72 driving east toward Scottsboro.

*Park on Hwy. 72 and walk app. 200 yards to observation platform. **Please bring a poncho with hood and a flashlight.***

Learning how to track and identify the footprints of animals is an ancient and largely forgotten art — one that enhances any experience in the wild.
