Dear 2019 CHSRA State Finals Qualifiers and Parents,

Congratulations on your qualification for the 2019 California High School Rodeo Association (CHSRA) State Finals Rodeo in Bishop, CA. The events that you have qualified in for the 2019 state finals are provided by your district secretary.

Please print and read this full entry packet and all of the information related to entries and the rodeo in general before accessing the online entry portal. This important step will help you understand the details, deadlines and requirements which will save you time, additional fees and duplicated entries. Forgetting to enter an event or reserve stalls, camping, etc. will cause you to incur additional transactions with additional office fees which will not be reimbursed. Most all questions about the state finals rodeo can be answered by reading and referring to the informational packet.

Entries for the CHSRA State Finals rodeo are only taken via the **online portal**. All entries, stalls, camping and payments will only be accepted via the online portal. The link to enter the entry system is included in your qualification email from your district secretary, as well as on the CHSRA website, www.chsra.com. **Entries are open from May 10 through May 17 at 9:00 pm. Late entries will be accepted until May 19, 2019, 9:00 pm with a \$100 late fee.**

In addition to entering online, you are required to submit the following 4 documents/pages via U.S. mail, to **CHSRA, P.O. Box 279, Arroyo Grande, CA 93421**; postmarked on or before May 17, 2019.

1. Grade Verification Form/Concussion Protocol/Medical Release
2. Most Recent **ORIGINAL** Report Card (the original copy will be returned at check-in)
3. Contestant Biography for rodeo announcers to use during rodeo
4. Bishop Gun Club Release of Liability **if entered in the shooting contests**

If these items are not received with a postmark on or before the deadline, your entry will be rejected and the next alternate will roll up into your position. A Certificate of Mailing should be used as your proof of mailing. Do not send documents via any method that requires a signature. **If your documents require a signature for collection, such as registered mail; you will be fined \$25.** The \$25 fine will be collected before you are allowed to check in.

Rodeo Entry Procedures

Entries open on May 10 and close on May 17, 2019. (Late entries accepted through May 19, with a \$100 late fine.)

- Payments must be made at the time of entry with either Visa or Mastercard.
- To avoid additional fees or multiple entries, please **complete the sample entry planning form** in this packet for your own use before accessing the online entry portal. This step will help to ensure that you have all of the necessary information ready for a smooth and complete entry process. Forgetting to enter an event or reserve stalls, camping, etc. will incur an additional transaction with additional office fees which will not be reimbursed.

Required Documents

You are required to submit the following 3 printed and signed documents along with your ORIGINAL report card via U.S. mail, **CHSRA, P.O. Box 279, Arroyo Grande, CA 93421**; postmarked on or before May 17, 2019. **Anything sent via registered mail or any method that requires a personal signature for receipt will be assessed a \$25 fine.** The fine will be payable before the contestant is allowed to check-in.

Rodeo Check-In (refer to the full rodeo schedule within the information packet)

Check-in Schedule: Saturday, June 9, 4 - 6:00 pm (All Queen and shooting contestants must be checked in before contests begin)
Sunday, June 10, 7:30-8:30 am AND 12 – 5:00 pm
Monday, June 11, 10am- 1 pm **MUST BE CHECKED IN BY 1:00 pm**

- Contestants are required to show membership cards at check-in. Replacement cards may be purchased for \$10 in the rodeo office in Bishop.
- Contestants must wear their district vests while checking in at the rodeo.
- **All contestants must be checked in by Monday, June 11, 2019 @ 1 pm or may be disqualified.**

Stall/Pen Rentals

All stalls/pens are reserved and paid for through the online entry portal. Please fill requests out on entry portal. Additional questions and or special needs related to stalling after close of entries should be directed to Melissa Budden (530) 520-8730

- Contestants may rent the same number of stalls/pens as events qualified in for \$70 each. 1 event = 1 stall
- Extra stalls beyond the number of events qualified in are available for \$140 each and will be located in the uncovered pens.
- There are box stalls, covered pens and uncovered pens. You will identify the type of stall/pen requested. Attempts are made to fulfill requests but cannot be guaranteed.
- Only one horse is allowed per stall/pen.
- All stalls/pens come with one bale of shavings.
- Mandatory stall/pen cleaning information
 - Box Stalls: Full clean out box stalls of shavings and manure outside of the door.
 - Paneled Pens: Scrape all shavings and manure to the center of the pens.

Camping

Camping reservations are made and paid for through the online entry portal. Each contestant is allowed to reserve ONE camping site. Additional sites may be reserved at an additional charge. The length of your trailer/RV will be required, so have the information available when you begin your entry. Questions about camping after the close of entries should be directed to Melissa Budden (530) 520-8730.

- **IF YOU PLAN TO CAMP AS A GROUP, YOU MUST ARRIVE AT THE FAIRGROUNDS AS A GROUP, NO EXCEPTIONS**
- Parking will be FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED
- RV or Trailer - \$235 per site w/hook-ups and/or portable septic pumping every other day
- Dry/tent camping - \$100
- Additional camping sites - \$285
- Campsites 40' in length.
- Horses are not allowed in any camping areas. Make arrangements to transport tack to the barn/stall areas.

Personal Motorized Vehicles

The Tri-County Fairground prohibits the use of any golf carts, motorcycles, ATVs, motorized scooters or anything similar on the grounds. The only exceptions are motorized wheelchairs.

Automobiles/Trucks on Fairgrounds Property

ONLY licensed drivers are allowed to operate registered vehicles on the fairgrounds. Public traffic laws are applicable within the fairgrounds. Unlicensed drivers are NOT allowed to drive on the fairgrounds for any reason. If unlicensed drivers are observed driving anywhere on the fairgrounds property, they run the risk of back number revocation and rodeo disqualification. Please drive slowly everywhere on the grounds.

Dress Code

Please be aware of the areas where full western attire is required for both constants and associate members as dress code will be enforced per CHSRA and NHSRA expectations and rules.

- Contestants must be in rodeo dress code during the rodeo whether in the arena or in the grandstands. (See Contestant Disqualification, rule a. Attire – Page 28 of NHSRA Rule Book)
- Associate members must be in rodeo dress code when helping contestants in or near the arena. Watch for display signs for areas that required you to be in dress code. If in doubt, BE IN DRESS CODE.
- All contestants are required to wear their district vests and rodeo back numbers at all times whether at the fairground or in the community.

Mandatory Ground Rules Meeting

Monday, June 10, 3:00 pm in the grandstands

- Contestants are required to attend (in full dress code, including cowboy boots)
- Parents are STRONGLY encouraged to attend
- Student event directors are introduced during the meeting
- District team pictures immediately follow in the arena

Contestant Welcome BBQ

Monday, June 10, 2019 – The Bishop Chamber of Commerce hosts a free welcome dinner for all of the CHSRA contestants and their families. Please RSVP the number in your party that will attend so we can give them a count. Please attend and thank them for their hospitality.

Student Officer Elections

Student members may nominate themselves for a state office (President, Vice President or Secretary) in the rodeo office by 5 pm on Wednesday, June 12th.

Contestant Dances

Contestants are required to wear their district vests and back numbers at all contestant dances. Jeans and shirts are required for the casual dances. No spaghetti straps, short tops or tank tops are allowed. Insignias on clothing must be positive and cannot advertise alcohol or tobacco products. Cowboy hats and boots are optional, baseball caps are acceptable. Queens must also wear vests and back numbers. Contestants who do not comply with dress code requirements will not be allowed in to the dances.

Dance Rules

- If contestants leave the dance, they will not be allowed back in.
- Inappropriate, lewd or lascivious dancing will constitute removal from the dance after one warning.
- Any contestants or participants suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be removed from the dance with local law enforcement notified. Additionally, the contestant's parents, district president and state executive board of directors will be notified and appropriate consequences will be administered as per the NHSRA rule book.

CHSRA Prom

Contestants are required to wear western dress or formal wear, along with district vests and back numbers. Extremely short, low cut or revealing dresses are not allowed. Contestants wearing formal wear may turn in their district vests and back numbers at the dance door to be picked up when leaving the dance.

Each CHSRA State Finals contestant may bring one student guest. The student guest must be registered with the rodeo secretary and be issued a guest back number. Guests must follow all CHSRA contestant rules and dress code regulations. CHSRA State Finals contestants are responsible for their registered guest's behavior and can be disqualified for their guest's behavior.

CHSRA Scholarship Foundation Golf Tournament Fund Raiser

The Scholarship Foundation will host a fun golf tournament fundraiser on Sunday, June 9, 2019, 12:00 pm at the Bishop Country Club. All adults and students are welcome and recruited to attend. Please see the flyer included in the information packet for more information.

Adult Conduct during CHSRA State Finals Rodeo

As a reminder, we are all on site to support and celebrate our student athletes' opportunities to compete and enjoy their state finals. Therefore, no alcoholic beverages are allowed outside of private campsites. This NHSRA rule will be strictly enforced. State board members will monitor the fairgrounds each evening to ensure that our contestants and families are safely enjoying themselves within appropriate boundaries. All of the state finals volunteers are fellow parents so please don't put anyone in an awkward position requiring them to have to address another parent about inappropriate alcohol use or conduct.

Awards Dinner and Ceremony

The awards dinner and ceremony are Saturday, June 15th at 6:00 pm. Awards are given to the top ten in each event and based on average times of the 2 long, progressive and the short-rounds. State finals event champions are determined by the lowest average time or highest total scores regardless of the total points in the events. The national finals qualifying team will be announced at the award ceremony.

CHSRA All-Around Cowboy and Cowgirl

State all-around awards are based ONLY on the CHSRA state finals rodeo.

National Finals Qualifier Team Meeting– (Top 4 contestants in each event)

- A mandatory contestant and parent meeting for all national qualifiers is at 8 am Sunday, June 16th
- The CHSRA National Rodeo Finals is July 14-20, 2019 in Rock Springs, WY. If your contestant qualifies, you will need to declare a decision to participate during this meeting.
- All national finals rodeo paperwork must be completed and turned in to the state representative, at this meeting. Some of the paperwork must be notarized so please have your government ID with you. Notaries will be available on site and will charge per signature.
- National finals rodeo camping and stalling will also be paid with paperwork submission.
- If you would like to complete any/all of the CHSRA paperwork ahead of time, it will be available on the CHSRA website in advance of the CHSRA finals rodeo.

CONCUSSION INFORMATION SHEET

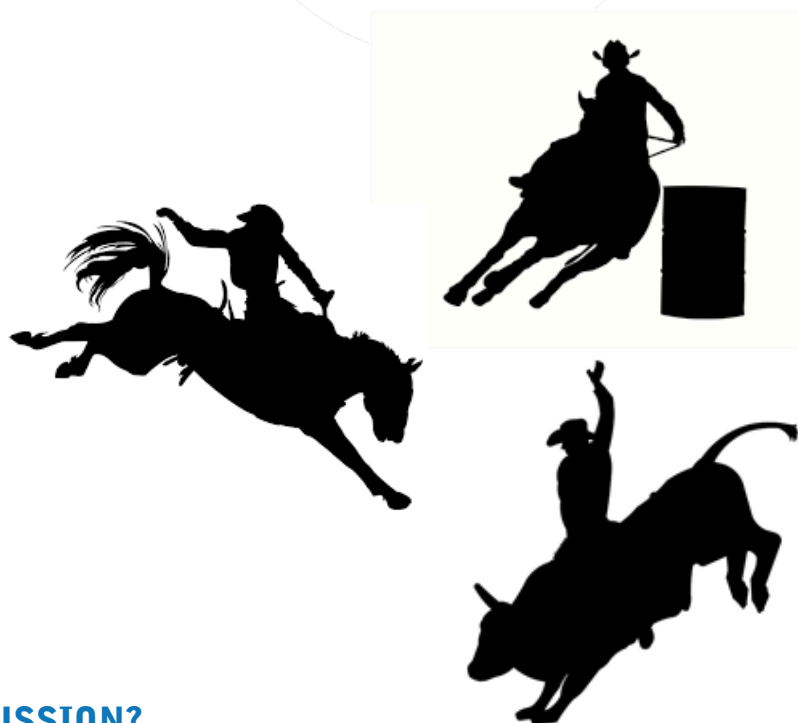
This sheet has information to help protect your children or teens from concussion or other serious brain injury. Use this information at your children's or teens' rodeo, events and practices to learn how to spot a concussion and what to do if a concussion occurs.



**HEADS UP
CONCUSSION**

WHAT IS A CONCUSSION?

A concussion is a type of traumatic brain injury—or TBI—caused by a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or by a hit to the body that causes the head and brain to move quickly back and forth. This fast movement can cause the brain to bounce around or twist in the skull, creating chemical changes in the brain and sometimes stretching and damaging the brain cells.



HOW CAN I SPOT A POSSIBLE CONCUSSION?

Children and teens who show or report one or more of the signs and symptoms listed below—or simply say they just “don’t feel right” after a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body—may have a concussion or other serious brain injury.

SIGNS OBSERVED BY PARENTS, DIRECTORS OR JUDGES

- Appears dazed or stunned.
- Forgets their turn, is confused about the rodeo or is unsure of an event, time, or score.
- Moves clumsily.
- Answers questions slowly.
- Loses consciousness (even briefly).
- Shows mood, behavior, or personality changes.
- Can't recall events prior to or after a hit or fall.

SYMPTOMS REPORTED BY CHILDREN AND TEENS

- Headache or “pressure” in head.
- Nausea or vomiting.
- Balance problems or dizziness, or double or blurry vision.
- Bothered by light or noise.
- Feeling sluggish, hazy, foggy, or groggy.
- Confusion, or concentration or memory problems.
- Just not “feeling right,” or “feeling down.”

WHAT ARE SOME MORE SERIOUS DANGER SIGNS TO LOOK OUT FOR?

In rare cases, a dangerous collection of blood (hematoma) may form on the brain after a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body and can squeeze the brain against the skull. Call 9-1-1 or take your child or teen to the emergency department right away if, after a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body, he or she has one or more of these danger signs:

- One pupil larger than the other.
- Drowsiness or inability to wake up.
- A headache that gets worse and does not go away.
- Slurred speech, weakness, numbness, or decreased coordination.
- Repeated vomiting or nausea, convulsions or seizures (shaking or twitching).
- Unusual behavior, increased confusion, restlessness, or agitation.
- Loss of consciousness (passed out/knocked out). Even a brief loss of consciousness should be taken seriously.

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF MY CHILD OR TEEN HAS A POSSIBLE CONCUSSION?

As a parent, if you think your child or teen may have a concussion, you should:

1. Remove your child or teen from the rodeo.
2. Keep your child or teen out of their events the day of the injury. Your child or teen should be seen by a health care provider and only return to competition with permission from a health care provider who is experienced in evaluating for concussion.
3. Ask your evaluating health care provider for written release instructions for your child or teen return to rodeo competition.

Do not try to judge the severity of the injury yourself. Only a health care provider should assess a child or teen for a possible concussion. Concussion signs and symptoms often show up soon after the injury. But you may not know how serious the concussion is at first, and some symptoms may not show up for hours or days.

The brain needs time to heal after a concussion. A child's or teen's return to rodeo practice and competition should be a gradual process that is carefully managed and monitored by a health care provider.

HOW CAN I HELP KEEP MY CHILDREN OR TEENS SAFE?

Rodeo is a great way for children and teens to stay healthy and can help them do well in school. To help lower your children's or teens' chances of getting a concussion or other serious brain injury, you should:

- Help create a culture of safety for the team.
 - » Teach ways to lower the chances of getting a concussion.
 - » Talk with your children or teens about concussions and ask if they have concerns about reporting a concussion. Talk with them about their concerns; emphasize the importance of reporting concussions and taking time to recover from one.
 - » Ensure that they follow the CHSRA/NHSRA rules for safety and the rules of the sport.
 - » Tell your children or teens that you expect them to practice good sportsmanship at all times.
- When appropriate for their events, teach your children or teens that wearing a helmet can lower the chances of the most serious types of brain or head injury. However, there is no "concussion-proof" helmet. So, even with a helmet, it is important for children and teens to avoid hits to the head.
