

2018 PARADE CODE OF CONDUCT

In order to ensure the safety of our spectators and parade participants, all parade participants must abide by the following:

- Parade Participants should arrive at Wason Ave, Springfield, MA before 10am for parade line-up. (A line-up number will be issued upon registration)
- Arrivals after 10:00am will lose their spot in the lineup and will be staged at the end
 of the parade no exceptions.
- The 2-mile parade will begin promptly at 11:00am and end at the corner of Main Street and Boland Way.
- The parade will take place rain OR shine.
- No person should jump on or off moving mobile units at any time nor should anyone be hanging onto a moving unit.
- Entries with live animals are responsible for clean-up.
- Please respect the residents and their property along the parade route
- Be respectful to parade organizers and follow their instructions
- NO alcoholic beverages allowed.
- Music/Noise: follow staff direction on music and noise volumes
- The Springfield Puerto Rican Parade is a family-friendly event, there is to be no use of profanity (verbal and music)
- Vehicles: no burning out or excessive engine revving
- City Officials, Police Officers and the Springfield Puerto Rican Parade Committee reserve
 the right to remove any unit or participant(s) at any time for failure to follow any criteria,
 rules or unsafe acts
- Your entrance fee must be paid to the Springfield Puerto Rican Parade Committee Prior to September 7, 2018.

Springfield Puerto Rican Parade Release and Waiver of Liability & Indemnity Agreement

Instructions: One person with the authority to bind your organization or group for purposes of this RELEASE AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT (hereinafter, RELEASE) and associated with your entry (parent or guardian, for a minor) must carefully review, complete and sign in the appropriate spaces at the bottom. Return the signed and completed form along with your parade application. You are welcome to print out extra copies of this form and collect additional signatures from any/all of the participants in your unit prior to the Parade, however only one signed waiver for each unit is required by the Parade Committee.

- 1.IN CONSIDERATION of being granted a position as an entrant and/or permission to participate in the Springfield Puerto Rican Parade, (the "Parade"), or on behalf of a minor child, the Undersigned, for herself/himself, her/his personal representatives, heirs, and next of kin, and on behalf of his/her organization or group (THE UNDERSIGNED): HEREBY RELEASES, WAIVES, DISCHARGES, AND CONVENANTS NOT TO SUE The Springfield Puerto Rican Parade Committee and Bilingual Veterans Outreach Centers of Massachusetts, Inc. All participants in the Parade and/or other activities of Springfield Puerto Rican Parade Committee and Bilingual Veterans Outreach Centers of Massachusetts, Inc., in Springfield, Massachusetts or elsewhere, sponsors of the Parade, and the Parade's directors, officers, volunteers, or agents of the foregoing, all of whom are referred to as "releases," from all liability that the undersigned, his/hers personal representatives, assigns, heirs, and next of kin for any and all loss or damage, and any claim or demands therefore on account of injury to the person or property or resulting in death of the undersigned, whether caused by the negligence of the releases or otherwise while the undersigned is observing, working for, or for any purpose participating in the Parade (including, but not limited to, all preparation therefore, the Parade itself, all incidental activities including pre-parade and post-parade activities, and the return of Parade materials to storage locations), the Parade, or any other activities of Springfield Puerto Rican Parade Committee and Bilingual Veterans Outreach Centers of Massachusetts, Inc.
- 2. It is THE UNDERSIGNED's express intent that this Waiver and Hold Harmless Agreement shall bind the members of his/her family, including his/her minor children, and spouse, if he/she is alive, and his/her heirs, assigns and personal representative, if he/she is deceased, and shall be deemed as a RELEASE, WAIVER, DISCHARGE, AND COVENANT NOT TO SUE the above-named RELEASEES. The UNDERSIGNED hereby further agrees that this RELEASE shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Massachusetts and that any mediation, suit, or other proceeding must be filed or entered into only in Hampden County, Massachusetts. Any portion of this document deemed unlawful or unenforceable is severable and shall be stricken without any effect on the enforceability of the remaining provisions.
- 3. THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY AGREES TO IDEMNIFY AND SAVE AND HOLD HARMLESS the releases and each of them from any loss, liability, damage, or cost they may incur due to the presence of the undersigned in any way observing, or working for, or for any purpose participating in the Parade (including, but not limited to, all preparation therefore, the Parade itself, all incidental activities including pre-parade and post-parade activities, and the return of Parade materials to storage locations), the Springfield Puerto Rican Parade Committee and Bilingual Veterans Outreach Centers of Massachusetts, Inc., and whether caused by the negligence of the releases or otherwise.

- 4. THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY ASSUMES FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR ANY RISK OF BODILY HARM, DEATH OR PROPERTY DAMAGE due to the negligence of releases or otherwise while observing, working for, or for any purpose participating in the Parade (including, but not limited to, all preparation therefore, the Parade itself, all incidental activities including pre-parade and post-parade activities, and the return of Parade materials to storage locations), the Springfield Puerto Rican Parade Committee and Bilingual Veterans Outreach Centers of Massachusetts, Inc., or any other activity of Springfield Puerto Rican Parade Committee and Bilingual Veterans Outreach Centers of Massachusetts, Inc.
- 5. THE UNDERSIGNED hereby promises that the state of his or her physical health (if this release is on behalf of an individual), or the physical health of the persons representing the UNDERSIGNED in this Parade (if this release is on behalf of an organization) will, on the day of the Parade, be sufficiently sound to permit such person(s) to safely participate. If such person(s) will be handling any animal, motorized vehicle, apparatus, device, firearm, or other thing in the Parade, he/she/they is/are possessed of sufficient experience in doing so such that the life, limb or property of self and others will not be exposed to unreasonable risk of harm.
- 6. THE UNDERSIGNED understands and acknowledges the RISKS, HAZARDS AND DANGERS ASSOCIATED WITH PARADE PARTICIPATION. Parades involve inherent risks, hazards and conditions that may be dangerous to life, limb and property and that can arise in an incalculable variety of unforeseeable or foreseeable ways which may include (as examples, but not necessarily as a complete list) the following: The presence and use of horses and other animals, motor vehicles, machinery, firearms, floats, fireworks, acrobats, projectiles, aerial demonstrations, baton twirling, wind, rain, hail and other forces of the elements, and other threats to life and limb, such as the possibility of slipping and falling and complications associated with weather conditions and physical exertion (such as heat stroke, fainting, collapse, exhaustion or other more serious complications).
- 7. THE UNDERSIGNED further expressly agrees that the foregoing release, wavier, and indemnity agreement is intended to be as broad and inclusive as is permitted by the laws of the State of Massachusetts.
- 8. IN SIGNING THIS AGREEMENT, THE UNDERSIGNED ACKNOWLEDGES AND REPRESENTS THAT he/she has read the foregoing RELEASE, understands it and signs it voluntarily as his/her own free act and deed; no oral representations, statements, or inducements, apart from the foregoing written agreement, have been made; the UNDERIGNED is at least eighteen (18) years of age and fully competent; and he/she executes this RELEASE for full, adequate and complete consideration fully intending to be bound by same. The UNDERSIGNED certifies they he/she has the authority to execute this RELEASE on behalf of the organization named in part 9.
