



### NAVY BAND BRASS QUINTET COMING TO FAIRFIELD GLADE

America's United States Navy Band Brass Quintet from Washington, D.C. is coming to Fairfield Glade, Tennessee as one of five cities in two states to host performances during the 2017 tour – a signature outreach program of the US Navy. The Brass Quintet is one of six performing ensembles of the Navy Band. They tour nationally 14 -15 weeks each year. Sailors in the Navy Band are full time professional musicians.

The performance is scheduled to take place at Fairfield Glade Community Church on Friday, September 22, 2017 at 7:00 pm. The church is located at 521 Snead Drive in Fairfield Glade. The performance is sponsored by the Fairfield Glade Community Church Fine Arts Initiative which brings four presentations each year to enrich the community, all of which are free to the public. Community Church is an inter-denominational Stephen Ministry congregation.

Please note that, although the performance is free, **you must obtain a ticket at one of the following locations** beginning Tuesday, September 12: the Palace Theater Box Office at 72 South Main Street in Crossville, First National Bank at 5011

Peavine Road in Fairfield Glade, and Cumberland Eye Care at 57 Fairfield Blvd. in Fairfield Glade. Tickets are limited to 550 seating and will be given out on a first-come/first-serve basis. Only 4 tickets will be given to any one individual or family. It is suggested that you get tickets as soon as possible as they will be in high demand. If you find you cannot use your tickets please call 931-484-6939 so they may be released to the public.

Since 1971, the Navy Band Brass Quintet has performed at ceremonies and events throughout the Washington area, including high visibility performances at the White House, Pentagon, State Department and Washington Navy Yard. Notable performances include inaugural events for President George W. Bush and Vice President Richard Cheney in 2000 and 2004, the dedication of the Flight 93 Memorial in Shanksville, Pennsylvania, and remembrance services at the National 9/11 Pentagon Memorial. Additionally, the group has been featured on NBC's Meet the Press and the Today Show. Committed to educational outreach, the quintet is an active participant in the Navy Band's Music in the Schools program, and has presented masterclasses and clinics nationwide at high schools, universities and international music conferences.

The quintet's repertoire includes over 400 works spanning six centuries, with many compositions arranged by its members. The group is comprised of Chief Musicians [Carl Lindquist](#) and [Brandon Almagro](#) on trumpet, [Chief Musician Jason Ayoub](#) on french horn, and Musicians 1st Class [Colin Wise](#) on trombone and [James Hicks](#) on tuba. Brass Quintet members are often featured soloists and principal players with the Concert Band. Selections will include something for every musical taste, ranging from classical, to folk music, to jazz, as well as patriotic selections.

Maximum attendance is expected for the 550 available tickets. Parking will be tight although overflow space will be available with a shuttle. Please car pool as much as possible. Doors will open at 6pm for the 7pm concert. You are urged to arrive by 6:45pm to assure you have a seat. At 6:45pm, the general public will be admitted for unused seats. No saving of seats will be allowed except for your driver.
