

#### Walton High School- Schedule

#### 2660 students

- Traditional seven period schedule
- Six classes, plus lunch (four core academic, 2 electives—one is usually world language)
- Fall, spring semester--classes meet every day
- Schedule will change second semester and will include different teachers & classmates.
- May change electives second semester (if not year long course)

#### 8<sup>th</sup> grade academics matter

O EOG scores in Language Arts/Mathematics determine promotion to high school

O Placement in courses is based upon the assessments grades earned in Middle School

O Students should work hard so their grades are representative of their abilities

#### General Information About Placement Current eighth grade teachers will make course recommendations for core classes based on standards set by data of student success

- will depend on student's assessment grades
- not teacher discretion based on specific guidelines given by Walton
- may have different levels in core classes
- Possible to change level of study during high school—we encourage you to challenge yourself!

### Levels of Study

#### <u>AP</u> - Advanced Placement-college level work

#### <u>Honors classes</u>

• leads to Advanced Placement classes

#### **College preparatory**

• students are well prepared for college classes

**Level three** - Studies move at slower pace

#### Advanced Placement Courses

- Equivalent to freshman college course
- Curriculum developed by The College Board
- National test at end of course
- College credit for course
- 73% with one AP Course finish college in 4 years
- 26% without an AP Course finish college in 4 years
- Walton offers 34 Advanced Placement courses

## What are Honors Courses? Who should take honors and AP?

- Honors course are more rigorous and require more critical thinking
- If a student has an A average on test grades in middle school, they should qualify for an honors level class.
- They need to be <u>self-motivated</u> and <u>self-directed</u>.
- They need to have a <u>high level of interest</u> in the subject.

Waivers—Parents look at the total picture and make final course decisions.

#### Math Curriculum and Honors

O Accelerated Courses- increased rigor and pace Accelerated Geom/Adv Alg and above – 1/2 quality point

O Honors Math- more rigorous includes an opportunity to take two math course at the same time and reach AP Calculus

## Graduation requirements for high school diploma

 4 units required must include 1 unit of 9<sup>th</sup> grade Literature and 1 unit of American Lit.

#### **Mathematics**

4 units required

#### <u>Science</u>

 4 units required must include 1 unit of Biology, 1 unit of Physical Science or Physics, 1 unit of Chemistry, Earth Science, Environmental Science or an AP Science, and 1 additional unit

#### Graduation requirements

#### Social Studies

 3 units required must include 1 unit of World History, 1 unit of US History, ½ unit of American Government, and ½ unit of Economics

#### Health and Physical Education

 ½ unit of Health and ½ unit of Personal Fitness required

#### <u>Career Technology and/or World Language and/or Fine</u> <u>Arts</u>

 3 total units are required – Students planning on attending a University System of Georgia institution must take 2 units of the same foreign language

## International Spanish Academy - ISA

-Students in the Academy take 4 years of Spanish at Walton along with a minimum of 4 additional content area classes (honors and AP level) that include a component of Spanish in the coursework.

-For full participation in the International Spanish Academy, students may earn double academic certification (receiving a diploma from the government of Spain as well as their Walton High School diploma.)

-Students should be recommended for Honors Ninth Lit and AP Human Geography

#### STEM Academy

O Passionate about area of study

- O Take 4 years of courses major area along with a minimum of 4 specific honors or AP level science courses
- O Cumulative group research project senior year
- O Extracurricular participation required
- O STEM Academy distinction on diploma

#### Entry Requirements

- O Course sequence and admission standards are different for each major
- O Biomedical Science & Engineering majors should be recommended for GSE Honors Algebra and Honors Science. Four years of major course as well as one Honors/AP science class.
- O Advanced Mathematics/Science must be recommended for Acc Geom/Adv Alg. Accelerated math course each year plus an AP science.
