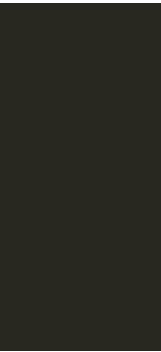
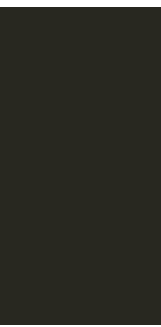
THE RAILWAY HERITAGE HAS A LONG HISTORY. SOME

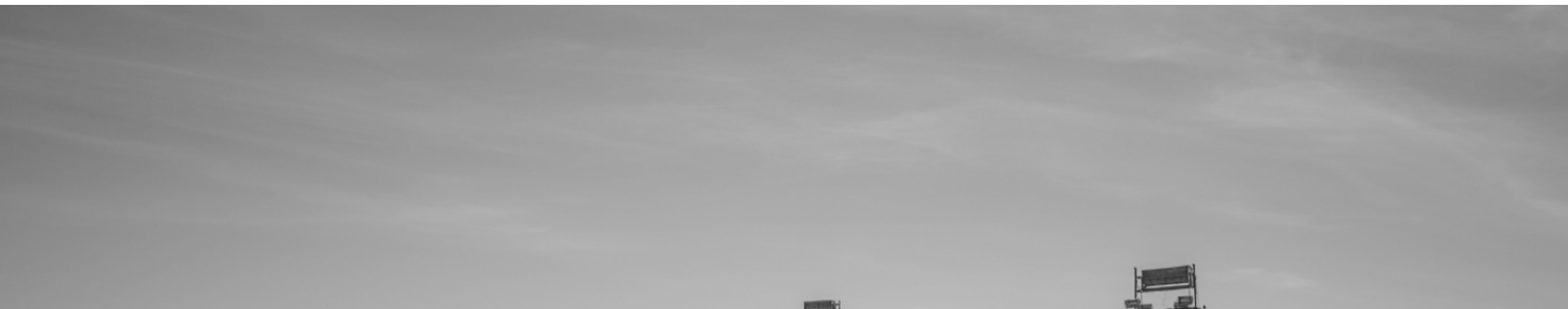




TRAIN AND PHILATELY
