

Job Description for 3 Posts, offering a One Year Advanced Training in Obstetric Anaesthesia for ST Year 6-7 Trainees.

1. FULL TIME POST commencing at the Royal London Hospital in **February 2018**, rotating to Queen Charlotte's & Chelsea Hospital in **August 2018**

2. FULL TIME POST commencing at Queen Charlotte's & Chelsea Hospital in **February 2018**, rotating to the Royal London Hospital in **August 2018**

3. FULL TIME POST commencing at the Royal London Hospital in **February 2019**, rotating to Queen Charlotte's & Chelsea Hospital in **August 2019**

The aim of an advanced period of training is to prepare those with a special interest in Obstetric Anaesthesia to be capable of taking up a consultant post with Obstetric Anaesthetic sessions. **Trainees should be ST6 or ST7 level at the time of commencing the post.**

- You will contribute to the one-in-nine on-call covering the 1326 (Obstetric) rota at the Royal London Hospital. Salary particulars available on request.
- The remaining time is spent on the Delivery Suite where you will gain extensive experience in providing Obstetric analgesia and anaesthesia, as well as experience working as a multidisciplinary team caring for the sick parturient.

Research

- The candidate is expected to participate in ongoing projects and is warmly encouraged to initiate own ideas.

Audit & Quality Improvement

- The candidate would be expected to participate in the department's quality improvement projects, many of which are presented at national meetings in either verbal or poster formats.

Teaching

- There will be many teaching opportunities available to you during the placement, including clinical supervision of CT2 trainees on the Labour Ward, lecture-based midwifery teaching, multidisciplinary team training days and Obstetric Anaesthesia in the Simulation Centre.
- The candidate will also be expected to attend antenatal classes – advising pregnant women what choices are available for labour analgesia.

Management

- As an advanced trainee, you will be expected to take the opportunity to attend risk management and multidisciplinary team meetings on the Delivery Suite.
