2. Veterans For Peace My Lai Memorial Exhibit In Downtown Detroit October 12-13-14



In the spirit of exposing the true costs of war, and seek justice for the victims of war, Veterans For Peace Chapter 74 and the Swords Into Plowshares Peace Center & Gallery are sponsoring the My Lai Memorial Traveling Exhibit - http://mylaimemorial.org - on October 12, 13 and 14. The 40-panel exhibition, on the 50th anniversary of the My Lai massacre in Vietnam, includes photos, printed memories of survivors and interactive stations. The exhibit experience invites participants to make a renewed commitment to peace and social justice and provides opportunities to support initiatives working to reduce violence and militarism both at home and abroad. The exhibit will be at the Swords Into Plowshares Peace Center & Gallery, 33 East Adams (near Woodward – map

at https://goo.gl/maps/SxMspVwfkgH2) and next to Comerica Park in downtown Detroit. The exhibit hours will be...
