A young boy sentenced to transportation for stealing a horse turned out to be Molly Haydock, later to become Mary Reibey, the face on the \$20 banknote. After a successful career in business, she retired to Newtown with her fami-

ly. At nearby Camden Villa lived prominent local politician, Thomas Holt, who soon moved to The Warren to breed rabbits for hunting. Join Beatrice Scheepers for a revealing walk through this historic territory at the often forgotten end of Newtown.
