

# Saint Paul's Sustainable To-Go Packaging Ordinance

The City of Saint Paul is proposing an ordinance that would require all to-go food packaging distributed within the City's limits to be either reusable, recyclable, or compostable.

# What the Ordinance would require:

The City of Saint Paul is developing an ordinance that would reduce waste, protect the environment, and ensure that disposable items are reduced, reused, recycled, or composted. The Sustainable To-Go Packaging Ordinance would require food businesses to provide to-go packaging that is reusable, recyclable, or compostable.

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

## Q: How readily available is compostable or recyclable to-go packaging?

There are now over 6,000 products certified compostable and many more that are recyclable. There are alternatives that would fit within these guidelines for nearly every product on the market, and most local distributors currently offer a variety of options.

#### Q: Will there be an increase in cost for businesses?

There will be an increase in cost for some items. Many products are already cost-competitive. In the long term, costs will continue to go down as demand increases (as has been the case in other markets with similar ordinances). In the short term there are opportunities to help mitigate these expenses like grants from Ramsey County, cooperative purchasing, and reduction in trash bills.

#### Q: How will businesses know what is allowed and what is not?

Businesses will have a year to learn how to implement these regulations into their business model. Vendor/product fairs and educational outreach events are going to be critical piece in the success of this Ordinance roll-out. Eureka Recycling is committed to working collaboratively with distributors, businesses, and the City of Saint Paul to support a smooth transition for our community businesses owners.

### Q: Will any products be exempt?

Exemptions (meaning products that don't meet the criteria are still allowed for a period of time) can be a tool to help businesses transition to meeting the requirements overtime in a way that supports both their sustainability and the health of the community. However, too many exemptions or exemptions of particularly harmful products can dramatically weaken the ordinance and reduce the positive environmental impacts.
