- INSTRUCTIONS FOR DRAIN POCKETS -

Cutting The Pockets

- 1. Use pretty quilters cotton which usually comes 45" wide
- 2. From 1 yard of fabric you will get 12 pockets (24 pieces in total)
- 3. Cut 7" x 9" pieces using a rotary cutter, cutting mat and large ruler (much easier than scissors)

Hemming The Top Edge

1. Fold over ½" and another ½" and iron. This makes a double hem that won't fray.

Sewing The Pocket Together

- 1. Take two sides which have already been hemmed and with right sides together, pin around the 3 unhemmed edges
- 2. Sew on the sewing machine
- 3. Turn right side out and push the corners out
- 4. Iron

Embellish (only one side of the pocket!)

- 1. Use HeatnBond LITE (make sure it's this one) and iron on to the back of some of the quilters cotton
- 2. Now the fabric will have glue on it DO NOT PEEL THE BACKING PAPER OFF YET
- 3. On the backing paper draw hearts, either different shapes and sizes or use a stencil
- 4. Cut out the hearts then when you are ready to use them peel off the backing paper, position on front of pocket and iron to heat the glue
- 5. This is LITE and only holds the decoration in place for you to sew around
- 6. Using embroidery floss, hand stitch around the edge of the heart
- This is where people get creative and sometimes add embroidery stitches, for example LOVE.
- 8. Stitch the SOUL RYEDERS® label on
- 9. If you want to skip the fusible paper you can just have people embroider the pockets with stitches but I found the hearts to be easier and less intimidating.

Package

- 1. Put two pockets in a cellophane bag (I used Recollections Transparent Archival Bags 7" x 10" from Michael's) and enclose 8 medium sized safety pins, the instruction card (attached to this) and a handwritten note for a survivor.
- 2. Fold over the top of the bag and stick down with a SOUL RYEDERS® sticker (or tape if not available)
