



WINTON SCHOOL ENROLMENT SCHEME PROCEDURE

HOME ZONE

All students who live within the home zone described below (and/or on the attached map) shall be entitled to enrol at Winton School.

- Starting point rapid number 21 Lady Barkly Road
- Move east to corner of Devereux Road and Lady Barkly Road
- Travel along Forrester Rd to Tippett Road, then along Tippett Road to the end of the road
- Travel overland in a direct line to Gill Road, Forest Hill RN 292
- Follow road to join Thomsons Crossing RN 266 along to Toogood Road RN 349
- Travel overland to midway between Spar Bush-Winton Rd RN 770 and 728
- Travel north and move along Spar Bush Winton Road to intersection SH 96
- Turn right and move along SH 96 to Campbell Road.
- Turn left and travel north along Campbell Road to join SH 6 (intersection), then along Lady Barkly Rd to Rapid Number 21
- All boundaries include both sides of the road.

Proof of residence in the home zone may be required.

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS

1. Each year, applications for enrolment for the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.
2. Each year the Board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school during May and November for mid year and new year intakes respectively. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.
3. Applications for out of zone enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:
 - a. **First Priority:** will be given to applicants who are siblings of current pupils.
 - b. **Second priority:** will be given to applicants who are siblings of former pupils.
 - c. **Third priority:** will be given to children who are children of Board employees.
 - d. **Fourth priority:** will be given to all other applicants.
4. **Note:** If there are more applicants in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot in accordance with the instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989.

Applicants seeking first and second priority status may require proof of a sibling relationship.
