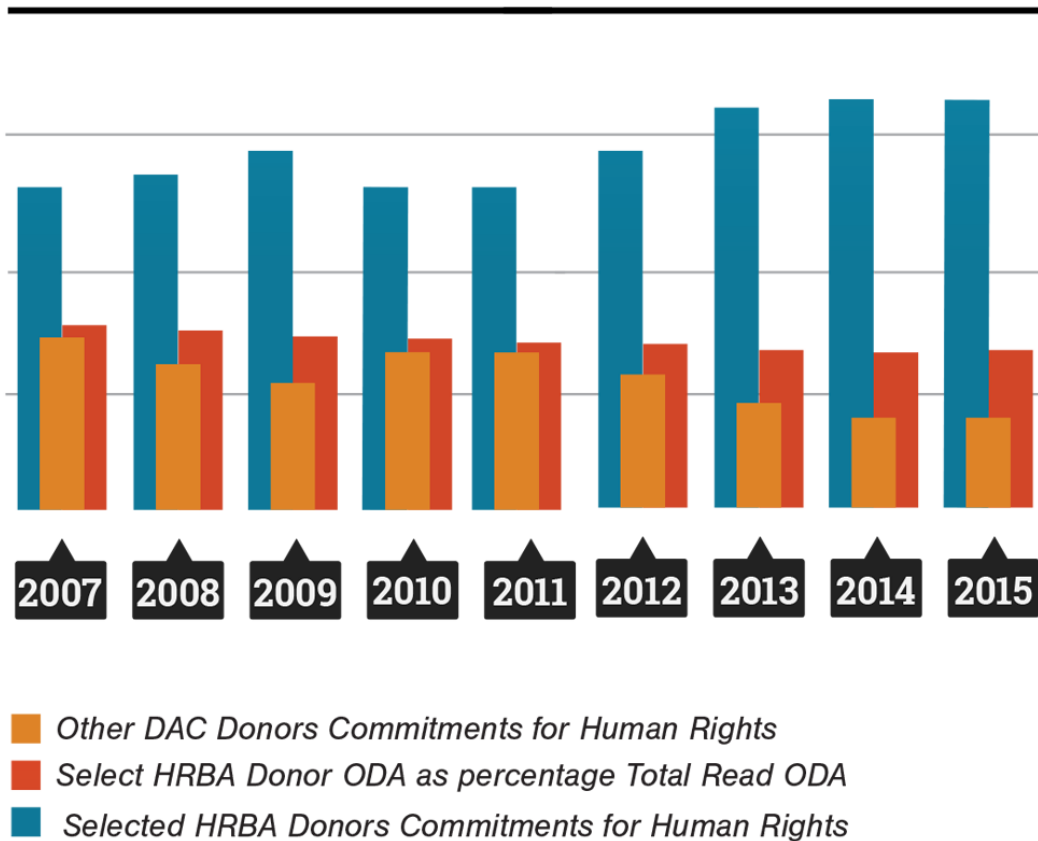


## Selected HRBA Donors support for human rights as a percentage of total commitments for this purpose

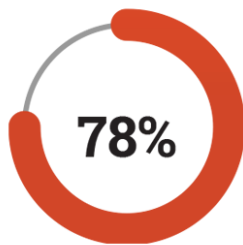

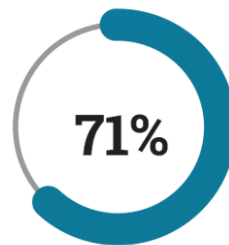
A mere 2% of “real aid” was spent on HRBA in 2015

# HRBA is based on five legal principles

1

The explicit, accurate use of the international human rights framework

2

Participation in development decisions as a right

3

Empowerment as a right and a precondition for effective participation

4

Non-discrimination and prioritisation of groups vulnerable to human rights violations

5

Accountability of duty-bearers to rights-holders
