THORNBERRY: FOR KIRKPATRICK ACT

THORNBERRY VOTES FOR WHISTLEBLOWER PROTECTION ACT

Representative Mac Thornberry (R-Clarendon) voted in favor of the Dr. Chris Kirkpatrick Whistleblower Protection Act of 2017 today.

According to a roll call from the U.S. House of Representatives, Thornberry voted in favor of the act this morning, as part of a unanimous consent of the present members of the House. Thirteen members of the House were counted as "not voting."

The bill was introduced by Senators Ron Johnson (R-Wisconsin) and Kelly Ayotte (R-New Hampshire). Johnson and Ayotte's bill was named for Dr. Chris Kirkpatrick, a psychologist at the Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Tomah, Wisconsin, who "was fired after he questioned the over-medication of veterans being treated at the facility," according to Johnson's office. On the day of Kirkpatrick's firing, he committed suicide.

The bill, if passed, would create enhanced protections and expedite investigations of instances in which probationary federal employees are fired for blowing the whistle on wrongdoing within their agencies. The bill would also enact some reforms on whistleblower protections and would establish new measures on medical records in the VA office.

APD Investigating Tuesday Robbery

The Amarillo Police Department is investigating a robbery that took place on Tuesday morning.

According to APD, officers responded to the call of a robbery in the 4600 block of South Virginia Street. Three victims reported that they had been inside of an apartment when they heard a knock at the door. When the victims opened the door, several people entered the apartment and held the victims at gunpoint while they rummaged through the location.

APD reports that the suspects hit the victims several times with the guns, causing minor injuries.

The suspects took multiple items from the victims and left. No suspect descriptions have been given and no arrests have been made in the case.

Albrecht Says Amarillo "Far From" Qualifying for Amazon Project

In a new article released this week, Amarillo Economic Development Corporation president Barry Albrecht detailed why he believes Amarillo is "far from" qualifying to host a new headquarters for Amazon, Inc.

Earlier this year, Amazon, Inc. announced that it would be seeking a location for a second headquarters. The economic deal is projected to cost upwards of \$5 billion and is expected to employ up to 50,000 workers. Albrecht said this week that while he feels Amarillo is "far from" qualifying for the project, the AEDC staff ran numbers to see what would hinder Amarillo from achieving such a project.

Albrecht wrote that the company is seeking a location in a metropolitan area of at least 1,000,000 people. Other cities have also developed strategies such as offering gifts to Amazon, installing Amazon boxes and placing ads in national newspapers.

In writing his article, Albrecht said that while Amarillo will "likely not" be the home for the new Amazon headquarters, the event has given Amarillo the "ideal opportunity" economic stability.

From Albrecht's article, it is unclear whether the Amarillo Economic Development Corporation plans to court the Amazon project. Other cities vying for the project include: Austin, Texas, Birmingham, Alabama, Boston, Massachusetts, Dallas, Texas, Denver, Colorado, Gary, Indiana, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Stonecrest, Georgia and Tuscon, Arizona.

Vicki McLean, artistic director for the Lone Star Ballet, said that the show is a love story between people and a love story about the state.

"We all know what loving Texas is all about," Vicki McLean said, "This is a love story between people but also with the amazing state we live in."

Straus Forms Business Climate Board

Joe Straus, the speaker of the Texas House of Representatives, has announced the creation of a new committee that is set to examine the business climate in Texas.

On Thursday, Speaker Straus announced the formation House Select Committee on Economic Competitiveness. According to information from Straus' office, the committee will examine issues such as "workforce readiness, infrastructure and state and local economic development tools."

Straus' committee will feature Representative Byron Cook (R-Corsicana) as the chair. Representative Senfronia Thompson (D-Houston) will serve as vice chair. Members also serving on the committee include: Representatives Angie Chen Button (R-Richardson), Sarah Davis (R-West University Place), Charlie Geren (R-Fort Worth), Joe Moody (D-El Paso) and Rene Oliveira (D-Brownsville).

No representatives from the Texas Panhandle area are set to serve on Straus' committee.

Straus announced the formation of the committee today, saying, "The world is watching, from CEOs to the best and brightest workers. They need to see that Texas welcomes them and is determined to stay at the front of the pack when it comes to economic development."

The new committee will report its findings by December 12th of this year.




