COWELL NAMED TO ROANOKE

AMARILLO'S COWELL NAMED ROANOKE CITY MANAGER

Amarillo deputy city manager Robert S. "Bob" Cowell has been named the newest city manager for the City of Roanoke, Virginia, according to WDBJ7.

It was announced this morning that reports from within the City of Roanoke indicate that Cowell will be named the next city manager of Roanoke today. Cowell was chosen by Roanoke officials to succeed Chris Morrill as city manager.

Cowell was previously in consideration for city manager jobs in Amarillo, San Marcos, and Tacoma, Washington, this year. Cowell was a finalist in all three cities, but was not finally chosen.

Cowell has served as deputy city manager of Amarillo, since 2015. Cowell also served as interim city manager in Amarillo for a short time in 2016 and 2017, before council members announced San Marcos city manager Jared Miller as the new city manager for Amarillo.



Local Attorney James Abbott to Run for Randall County Court at Law Bench

Local attorney James Abbott is running for the Randall County Court at Law No. 2 position, according to information posted to Facebook.

Abbott announced his campaign on Friday, posting his logo for his campaign for the bench currently held by Judge Ronnie Walker. Abbott, of the Abbott Law Office, is the second candidate to announce his candidacy for the bench. Stewart Werner announced his candidacy last week.

Abbott is seeking the office as a member of the Republican Party.

It is not yet clear whether Judge Walker, the incumbent, has plans to seek re-election.

Former Texas Governor Mark White Has Died at Age 77

The Texas Tribune reported this weekend that former Texas Governor Mark White has died at the age of 77.

White served as governor of Texas from 1983 until 1987. White, a Democrat, was instrumental in the passage of several notable Texas laws including the famous and controversial "no-pass, no play" law.

Following the report of White's death, officials from around the state reacted with grief and respect for the former governor. U.S. Congressman Beto O'Rourke (D-El Paso) issued a statement on White's passing, saying, "Governor Mark White won some tough races against the odds to serve the people of Texas. I'm grateful for his courage and service."

Governor Greg Abbott put out a statement, saying, "I just spoke with Linda Gale White to express our sorrow for the passing of a great Texan and long-time friend."




