"Reflections on the Greek brain drain: past and present" a lecture with Professor John Joannidis

One of the grave aspects of the current Greek crisis is the departure of tens of thousands of professionals to better fortunes abroad. It is not the first time this happens in Greece but, in the current situation, it may endanger the continued stay of the country among industrialized nations. Dr. Ioannidis, an eminent academician who has written extensively on the subject, will address the problem of Brain Drain as part of modern Greek heritage and analyze some of the causes and dangers associated with it.



John P.A. Ioannidis, MD, DSc holds the C.F. Rehnborg Chair in Disease Prevention at Stanford University, and he is Professor of Medicine, and of Health Research and Policy, and Director of the Stanford Prevention Research Center at the School of Medicine; Professor of Statistics at the School of Humanities and Sciences; one of the two Directors of the Meta-Research Innovation Center at Stanford; and Director of the PhD program in Epidemiology and Clinical Research. He has previously been a professor at the University of Ioannina, Harvard University, Imperial College London, and Tufts University. He has received many awards and accolades and the current citation rate to his work (~2,000 new citations per month per Google Scholar) places him in the 100 most-cited among all 20+ million authors publishing across science.
