Program Overview March 2016

Georgia Families 360°_{SM} is the state of Georgia's Medicaid managed care program for children, youth, and young adults in foster care, children and youth receiving Adoption Assistance, and select youth involved in the juvenile justice system. The program began in March 2014. Amerigroup Community Care is the Care Management Organization that is managing this population to meet the healthcare needs of each member, including behavioral health, medical, dental and pharmacy benefits. The goals of the program include:

- **Improve** health outcomes through intensive care coordination
- **Integrate** coordination of all healthcare services
- **Engagement** of a primary care physician and primary dental provider
- **Comply** with and support state and federal policies

Members of the Georgia Families 360° program receive the following services to improve care coordination, access to care, and improved health outcomes:

- A primary care provider and primary dental provider for each child
- Access to preventive care and screenings, including EPSDT screenings and dental screenings
- Trauma assessments for each child entering foster care over the age of five. Developmental screenings are required by DFCS for children under the age of five
- Regional Care Coordination Teams to help coordinate care and schedule appointments
- Assigned Care Coordinators to identify and refer for needed services, collaboration with other child serving agency partners, provide health risk screenings and develop care plans for each child
- 24/7 Intake Line
- Psychotropic Medication Review Program where every child with one or more psychotropic medications, children under the age of five who are prescribed psychotropic medications and youth on four or more psychotropic medications has their medications reviewed by the Georgia Families 360° Medical Director or pharmacy review team
