

FAQ - MODELS

The Model Experience is the ultimate program for unsigned models Some of the perks include professional model training, runway coaching, a professional photo shoot, insider tips, and more. You'll get to connect with tons of industry professionals especially fashion designers, photographers, and makeup artists.

How do I sell tickets to the Fashion Show and how do we keep track of my sales? The tickets are sold online. We'll email you a custom link for you to share with your buyers. When your buyers go to check it out our system will ask them what model they are buying the tickets from, they need to type in your name (first and last). Once you sell a ticket online you'll get a ticket count notification.

How many tickets am I required to sell? Each model is required to sell 10 tickets (online) to the Fashion Show. The ticket sales help us cover our production costs. Technically this whole opportunity is FREE as long as you're able to get the 10 tickets sold in full. Usually between few friends and family member it can be done :)

Do I get to keep the pictures from the our Photo Shoot and Fashion Show? Yes you do! The photos will be delivered digitally. We typically take 5-8 business days to edit and deliver the images. The photos we provide to you will be unstamped in and in high resolution.

What should I wear to the Photo Shoot? Be sure to arrive Camera Ready will share some styling tips with you in a separate email (but ultimately you can wear whatever you want to the Photo Shoot).

What do I bring to the Photo Shoot / What do I bring to the Fashion Show? See Day 1 & Day 2 Checklist.

Who do I sell tickets to? Start with the people you know. Reach out to people you interact with on a daily basis (co-workers, teachers, friends, etc). Anyone who owns a small business can (tax) right-off their purchase. Target people that would benefit from attending a Fashion Show (makeup artist, photographers, hairstylists, clothing designers, etc).

What if I can't sell all 10 tickets? You'll be required to cover what you don't sell.

If I have an existing portfolio should I bring it? Absolutely you never know who's going to be on set.
