CLARK NEIL

Clark Neily is the current Vice President for Criminal Justice at The Cato Institute. Neily, a well-known and accomplished litigator and public speaker, has specialized in challenging government entities for unconstitutional incursions on the rights of individuals. He leads Cato's efforts on criminal justice issues and related topics, a key element of Cato's long-time work in defense of civil liberties.

A Texas native, Neily spent four years in the trial department of the Dallas law firm Thompson and Knight before joining the Institute for Justice. He also clerked for Judge Royce Lamberth on the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia. Neily is a graduate of the University of Texas Law School.



DANIEL LEMISCH

Acting U.S. Attorney Eastern District of Michigan

Daniel L. Lemisch is the Acting United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Michigan. Mr. Lemisch previously served as the First Assistant, Chief of the Criminal Division and was a Deputy Chief of the Controlled Substance Unit, where he prosecuted cases involving narcotics conspiracies, money laundering and homicide. During his career as a federal prosecutor, Mr. Lemisch has also handled cases involving public corruption, health care fraud and violent crimes. Mr. Lemisch also provides international assistance on behalf of the Department of Justice on trial advocacy, public corruption and criminal procedure code reform.

Oakland County Circuit Court

Judge Warren was appointed to the Oakland Circuit Court in December 2002 by Governor John Engler, and elected to office in 2004, 2006 and 2012. He is a graduate of the University of Michigan Law School and Wayne State University. He was previously a Michigan Supreme Court Judicial Clerk; practicing attorney with experience in appellate work and litigation;
