Jane Carville Chauvin has received the Milton Ferguson Faculty Award for Excellence in Teaching in **UNO's** College of Education and Human Development.

Catherine Howard, who is working on a Ph.D. and a medical degree at **Tulane**, will be one of 80 U.S. students who will spend a week, starting Sunday, with 26 Nobel Prize winners and 570 other researchers at the annual Nobel Laureate Meeting in Lindau, Germany.

Ameca Reali and Adrienne Wheeler, who received **Loyola** law degrees last month, are two of 22 Echoing Green fellows, who are chosen for their commitment to social change. Reali and Wheeler founded Cooperative Advocacy for the People, a criminal justice advocacy organization.

Six **LSU** Health Sciences Center faculty members have received Allen A. Copping Excellence in Teaching Awards. The recipients, each of whom received \$5,000, are: Drs. Meher Bannajee, allied health professions; Billie Gail Jeansonne, dentistry; Stephen Deputy, medicine; Sally Ruel, nursing; Richard Scribner, public health; and Jeffrey Green, basic sciences.

Three UNO faculty members have been named distinguished professors. The honorees are Olunaniyi Osundare, English and Africana studies; Paul Frick, psychology; and Mark Trudell, chemistry.
