Air Force Airman Patrick F. Brathwaite graduated from basic military training at Lackland Air Force Base, San Antonio, Texas.

The airman completed an intensive, eight-week program that included training in military discipline and studies, Air Force core values, physical fitness, and basic warfare principles and skills.

Airmen who complete basic training earn four credits toward an associate in applied science degree through the Community College of the Air Force.

He is the son of Bernard Brathwaite of Holly Springs Circle, Port Wentworth. Brathwaite graduated in 2010 from South Effingham High School.

Two Loyola University New Orleans College of Law graduates, **Ameca Reali**, J.D. '11, and **Adrienne Wheeler**, J.D. Jennifer Gleitsmann and **Jessica Jacobson**, Armstrong Atlantic State University students in the Radiologic Sciences Department, each received a 2011-2012 Varian Radiation Therapy Student Scholarship of \$5,000, awarded by the American Society of Radiologic Technologists.
