Joe Maloney as Old man, Bowling lady customer, Thief and Detective

Deb's first stage appearance was in the chorus of STAG Inc's "Oliver". Since then she has appeared in other STAG Inc productions, including the roles of Sandra in "Brassed Off!" and Julia in "Inheritance". Deb has also directed some one act plays and most recently directed a Green Room performance of "Not the Full Monty Python". She also enjoys behind the scene designing and coordinating make-up.



Anne Bowen as Hazel

Local theatre has been part of Anne's life since coming to Shepparton in 1969, and before that, in Mildura. She loves to act, loves to sing and has enjoyed participating in many musicals and plays as a lead or chorus - not to mention backstage work. She said, "It's all part of being involved in amateur theatre companies."



Karen Kuehnapfel as Rose

Karen's first show with Turaton was "Showboat", way back in 1985. She has performed on and off with Turaton and STAG Inc over the years, whether it be chorus, small lead, costumes, make-up or backstage. She directed the play, "The Biscuit", with STAG Inc's "Ten in 10" two years ago and was assistant director in "Minefields and Miniskirts". She has been an active member with the female choir, Heart 'n' Soul, since their beginnings back in 2005.



Priscilla Collins as Madge

Priscilla was first involved in two musical productions at high school. Thirteen years later, her love of singing took her to Warragul Theatre Company's productions of "Jesus Christ Superstar" and "Les

Miserables". She then moved to the Goulburn Valley and joined the chorus of STAG Inc's "Fiddler on the Roof" in 2001. In 2004, she joined Turaton in their theatre restaurant, "A Knight to Remember". "Opportunity Knocks" is Priscilla's tenth Turaton production.





Keith Bryant as Wally

Keith has been with Turaton since 1981 in nearly all of its productions since that time. This role of Wally suits him perfectly, as he doesn't have to act, just be himself. Wally says similar lines to those Keith utters in his normal life. You might say the role of Wally is based on Keith's life. He enjoys acting and singing and being a part of the people who make up Turaton. He regards this part of his life as being a great stress reliever.



Mario Calandro as Hippy 2

Since 2003, Mario has enjoyed singing and acting with Turaton. His favorites include, Oldman River and Nessun Dorma. His most memorable was singing Edelweiss as a duet with his son Eugene in "Lettuce Entertain You", for which they received Georgy nominations.
