



Book Talk 2



Reading at home

Ideas and prompts to help you when talking to your child about the books they bring home

For fiction (stories/picture books):

Before Reading

- Would you choose this book from the library? Why? Why not?
- Can you point to the title? or What is this? (pointing to the title)
- What do you think this story will be about? What might happen in the story?
- What do we call the writing on the back of the book? (Blurb) or What does the blurb tell us?

During Reading

- What does this word mean (point to an unfamiliar word) How could we check the meaning? What could we use?
- What is happening in the pictures?
- What has happened so far? Is it what you expected to happen?
- What might happen next? How do you think the story might end?
- What sort of character is....? Is he/she friendly/ mean/ nice...?

After Reading

- Did you like this book? Why? (Encourage children to develop their opinion about books by encouraging them to explain their reasons)
- What was the most interesting/ exciting part of the book? Can you find it?
- What happened in the story? Use the pictures to help you.



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For Non-Fiction (fact/information books):

Before Reading

- ⇒ Why did you choose this book?
- ⇒ What is the title of this book? Who is the author?
- ⇒ What do you think you will learn from reading this book?
- ⇒ Do you already know anything about this topic? What do you know?
- ⇒ What would you like to find out about this topic?

During Reading

- ⇒ What does the contents page tell you? Where would you look to find out about....?
- ⇒ Can you find any photographs or picture? What do they show?
- ⇒ Why are some of the words written in bold? Do you know what these words mean? How could you find out?
- ⇒ What is the most interesting thing you have found out from reading this page?

After Reading

- ⇒ Tell me 3 things you have learned from reading this book?
- ⇒ What else would you like to know about this topic now? How could we find out?
