












AFRICA WG

ANTI-HUMAN TRAFFICKING WG





It is clearly inconsistent to combat trafficking in endangered species while remaining completely indifferent to human trafficking, unconcerned about the poor, or undertaking to destroy another human being deemed unwanted (91).

ICR AT FAO





People's quality of life actually diminishes – by the deterioration of the environment, the low quality of food or the depletion of resources – in the midst of economic growth (194).

Only when "the economic and social costs of using up shared environmental resources are recognized with transparency and fully born by those who incur them, not by other peoples or future generations," can those actions be considered ethical (195).

Disregard for the duty to cultivate and maintain a proper relationship with my neighbor, for whose care and custody I am responsible, ruins my relationship with my own self, with others, with God and with the earth. When all these relationships are neglected, when justice no longer dwells in the land, the Bible tells us that life itself is endangered. We see this in the story of Noah, where God threatens to do away with humanity because of its constant failure to fulfill the requirements of justice and peace... (70).

POVERTY HANDBOOK AT STAMPA



We fail to see that some are mired in desperate and degrading poverty, with no way out, while others have not the faintest idea of what to do with their possessions, vainly showing off their supposed superiority and leaving behind them so much waste which, if it were the case everywhere, would destroy the planet. In practice, we continue to tolerate that some consider themselves more human than others, as if they had been born with greater rights (90).

CONCERNS FOR BRAZIL





Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience (217).

CONFLICT AND PEACE BUILDING



Love for society and commitment to the common good are outstanding expressions of a charity which affect not only relationships between individuals but also "macrorelationships, social economic and political ones." [...] Social love is the key to authentic development (231).





HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO CRISIS RESPONDERS





Theological and philosophical reflections on the situation of humanity and the world can sound tiresome and abstract, unless they are grounded in a fresh analysis of our present situation, which is in many ways unprecedented in the history of humanity (17).

NONVIOLENCE AND JUST PEACE CONFERENCE





We are called to be instruments of God our Father, so that our planet might be what he desired when he created it and correspond with his plans for peace, beauty and fullness (53).

VIOLENCE IN DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO





When nature is viewed solely as a source of profit and gain, this has serious consequences for society. This version of "might is right" has engendered immense inequality, injustice and acts of violence against the majority of humanity, since resources end up in the hands of the first comer or the most powerful: the winner takes all. Completely at odds with this model are the ideals of harmony, justice, fraternity and peace as proposed by Jesus (82).

PREVENTION OF SEXUAL ABUSE IN CONFLICT







A fragile world, entrusted by God to human care, challenges us to devise intelligent ways of directing, developing, and limiting our power (78).

INVOLVEMENT IN SEDOS





If we want to bring about deep change, we need to realize that certain mindsets really do influence our behavior. Our efforts at education will be inadequate and ineffectual unless we strive to promote a new way of thinking about human beings, life, society and our relationship with nature (215).

JPIC DISPLAY AND CONVERSATION AT UISG PLENARY



An open and respectful dialogue is also needed between the various ecological movements, among which ideological conflicts are not infrequently encountered. The gravity of the ecological crisis demands that we all to the common good, embarking on a path of dialogue which requires patience, self-discipline and generosity, always keeping in mind that "realities are greater than ideas" (201).

DISCUSSIONS AND REFLECTIONS



Believers themselves must constantly feel challenged to live in a way consonant with their faith and not to contradict it by their actions. They need to be encouraged to be ever open to God's grace and to draw constantly from their deepest convictions about love, justice and peace (200).

SHARING BEST PRACTICES



As the bishops of Southern Africa have stated: "Everyone's talents and involvement are needed to redress the damage caused by human abuse of God's creation." All of us can cooperate as instruments of God for the care of creation, each according to his or her own culture, experience, involvements and talents (14).




