The Family Jazz Discovery Zone Stage features performances by Louis Prima Jr. and the Witnesses, the Jazz House Adult Ensemble and Jazz House Alumni Ensemble. MONTCLAIR JAZZ FESTIVAL & JAZZ HOUSE KIDS

The Montclair Jazz Festival is the brainchild of jazz vocalist and recording artist **Melissa Walker**, with creative direction from her husband, Christian McBride. Walker is the president and founder of JAZZ HOUSE **KiDS**, a Montclair-based arts education and performance nonprofit that has gained a national reputation. Every year, JAZZ HOUSE **KiDS** performances reach 25,000 people through 80 community concerts and the Montclair Jazz Festival, the organization's flagship musical and community engagement program held each August.



JAZZ HOUSE **KiDS** works with closely with 1,500 students each year at its Jazz House facility in Montclair, in underserved schools, and at its Jazz House Summer Workshop. According to Walker, the organization is committed to providing access, inclusion and innovative programming for young people from all walks of

life. In fact, Jazz House Kids provides nearly 40% of its student body with tuition assistance to see its mission flourish.

"We are proud that the Montclair Jazz Fest has metamorphosed into one of the largest and greatest free summer events in New Jersey," said Walker. "Along with the Montclair Film Festival in the spring, the Montclair Jazz Fest has become part of the fabric of our community and a world-class event, solidifying this town's standing as a thriving arts and cultural destination all year round. An ambitious undertaking, the 'no tickets required' Montclair Jazz Festival, which attracts thousands of music lovers and families from across the region, would not be possible without the tremendous support of our sponsors, community and government partners, and generous individuals who believe in Jazz House Kids' mission."

MEET THE TALENT:



This year, the Montclair Jazz Festival welcomes back NEA Jazz Master and internationally renowned vocalist **Dee Dee Bridgewater.** Few entertainers have ever commanded the depth of artistry that Bridgewater has shown in multiple mediums. Over the course of her stellar career, Bridgewater has won a Tony Award for Best

Featured Actress in a Musical for "The Wiz"; received three GRAMMY Awards; and earned France's top honor Victoire de la Musique for Best Jazz Vocal Album. The artist's latest release, *Dee Dee's Feathers* (OKeh/Sony Masterworks, 2015), is a collaboration with Irvin Mayfield & the New Orleans Jazz Orchestra that combines fresh interpretations of Crescent City classics like "Big Chief" and "St. James Infirmary" with new, original compositions ("Congo Square," "C'est Ici Que Je T'aime").

Bridgewater returns to her Memphis soul roots and brings her brand new 10-piece band, Dee Dee Bridgewater and & Memphis Soulphony to the Montclair Jazz Festival stage, including Barry Campbell on bass, Curtis Pulliam on trumpet, Bryant Lockhart on saxophone, Charlton Johnson on guitar, Sharisse Norman and Shontelle Norman-Beatty on background vocals, Carlos Sargent on drums and Farindell "Dell" Smith on piano/organ.



Jazz House Kids' Artistic Chair and Montclair Jazz Festival Artistic Director **Christian McBride** is a five-time GRAMMY Award-winning bassist, composer and arranger. He has been one of the most important and omnipresent figures in the jazz world for more than 25 years. McBride is the new Artistic Director of the Newport Jazz Festival, and he hosts and produces "The

Lowdown: Conversations With Christian" on SiriusXM satellite radio. McBride also hosts

National Public Radio's "Jazz Night in America," a weekly radio show and multimedia collaboration between WBGO, NPR and Jazz at Lincoln Center that showcases outstanding live jazz from across the country.

Tapping into the discovery and spirit of jazz improvisation, A Christian McBride Situation is McBride's ongoing electro-funk project with a potpourri of talented musicians including DJ Logic on turntables, Rachel Z on keyboards, Antoinette Henry on vocals, Adam Rogers on guitar and Bernard Purdie on drums. McBride plays both acoustic and electric bass. The Situation was born 12 years ago at the Monterey Jazz Festival, when a couple of McBride's band members couldn't make the gig. His manager quipped, "It looks like we have a Christian McBride situation." McBride thought that sounded cool, so he began using the name for any eclectic group of musicians he brings together, and it always results in a wildly avant-garde sound of street beats and improv.



Keyboardist **Cyrus Chestnut** has earned a reputation for his skillful versatility, his ability for blending sounds, and for unabashedly bringing gospel into the club performances he gives. And despite his sense of playful showmanship, he takes jazz very seriously and believes that jazz has great staying power. First call pianist for the Dizzy

Gillespie Big Band and both The Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall Jazz Orchestras, Cyrus Chestnut absorbed years of experience as a sideman with Betty Carter, Wynton Marsalis, and scores of other great players before stepping into the spotlight as a charismatic and thought-provoking composer/bandleader. Blending contemporary and traditional jazz with gospel and hints of Latin and samba, Time Magazine raves that, "what makes Chestnut the best jazz pianist of his generation is a willingness to abandon

notes and play space." The Montclair Jazz Festival will be bringing the virtuoso pianist

together with his swinging, soulful trio featuring **Michael Hawkins** on bass and **Neal Smith** on drums.



Trumpeter **Ted Chubb** delivers a fresh approach to modern jazz, drawing the listener in with an individual voice, striking originals, and reimagined classics. "Gratified Never Satisfied," Chubb's new release, establishes him as a singular creative force in contemporary jazz, an artist steeped in the music's legacy

who is pointing squarely toward its future. Chubb's diverse career has brought him to clubs and jazz festivals around the globe. Splitting time between NYC and Lucerne, Switzerland, Chubb continues to serve as Director of the Jazz House Summer Workshop and Special Projects. Joining him on the Montclair Jazz Festival stage will be **Bruce Williams** on alto, **Seth Johnson** on guitar and **Tom DiCarlo** on bass.



The Jazz House Collective, directed by Nathan Eklund, includes nationally and internationally recognized jazz artists who serve as faculty members for the JAZZ HOUSE KiDS Summer Workshop. One hundred years ago this year, many iconic jazz artists were born, influencing the musical landscape forever.

The Collective presents the **Centennial Project**, celebrating the music of jazz luminaries including Ella Fitzgerald, Thelonious Monk, Buddy Rich and Lena Horne.



Louis Prima, Jr. takes a page from his father's playbook, bringing new energy and a 21th century attitude to the famed Prima Swing! His father, Louis Prima, was born in 1910, and became a legendary songwriter, bandleader and musician known as one of the greatest contributors toward modern music

of all time. His son, the iconic singer, songwriter and

entertainer, will be featured in the Family Jazz Discovery Zone with the Witnesses. For the second year, the **Gia Maione Prima Foundation** has generously awarded the **Louis Prima Jazz Scholars Fund for Jazz House Kids** to help students and families in need at the Jazz House and in struggling schools.



The future of jazz will be showcased as more than 160 students from the JAZZ HOUSE **KiDS Summer Workshop** perform throughout the day. Tomorrow's rising stars come from all across New Jersey and seven other states, and internationally from London and the Dominican Republic.



Mistress of Ceremonies. She has won a Golden Globe, Emmy, SAG Award, an Obie, Gracie Allen Award, and four NAACP Image Awards. She has also received two Tony Award nominations and an IFP Spirit Award nomination. Currently starring as Sharon Goodwin, Hospital Chief of Services, on NBC's "Chicago Med," she is best known for her
