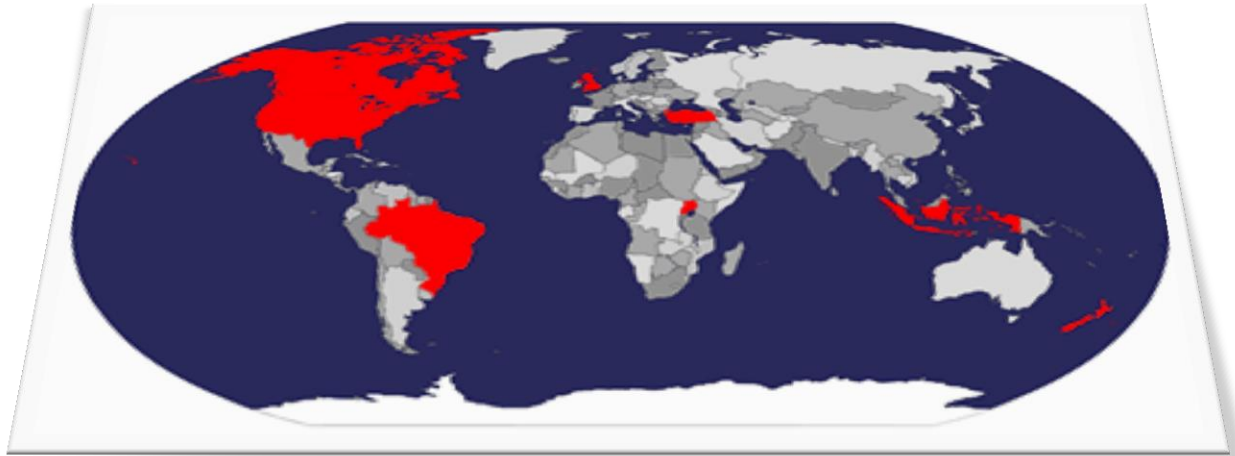




MEECH WORKING GROUP

The Meech Working Group (MWG) is a collection of academics and sustainability professionals, working collaboratively on responsible mining, reclamation and sustainable development in developing countries. Working in partnership with non-governmental organizations and civil society organizations, the interdisciplinary group is uniquely positioned to focus its diverse skill set to support the building of healthy, resilient, resource-sector communities.

The group is named to commemorate the late Dr. John Meech, a professor of mining engineering at the University of British Columbia, and director of the Centre for Environmental Research in Minerals, Metals, and Materials, work for which he was awarded the Fray International Sustainability Award in 2014.
