We will be scheduling another Paint & Plant Night soon so be on the lookout! What better way to spend a \$5 evening out being artistic and making new friends?

On June 6th at 6:00pm we will be hosting **Mr. Walker's Travel Talk**! Join us as we get to experience the incredible island country of New Zealand through the eyes of Mike Walker. June 10th is when the **Adult Summer Reading Program** registration begins! This is a great way to experience a genre or author you otherwise wouldn't choose to read.

The annual Town Budget Meeting, one of the most important nights for the library, is June 10th at 7:00pm. We urge our faithful Skowhegan residents to please come out and vote to approve our budget. We can't do it without your help. Our budget covers everything from our heat and electricity to new books and DVDs. We want to continue to serve and support our community by providing all of our patrons with books, interlibrary loans, both children and adult programming, story time, access to the internet, copying and faxing and to simply be a safe place to be, but we cannot continue to do so without a wellfunded budget. We need your voice and your vote!

June 28th at 11:00am we will be hosting Maine Wildlife Rehabilitation with Josh Sparks from Spark's Ark! He is a wildlife rehabilitator who removes and relocates nuisance wildlife, and takes in unwanted and illegally kept exotic pets. He will be bringing some of those exotic animals with him and talk about their care and special adaptations as well as share some interesting stories about wildlife encounters! This is a wonderful program for those who want to learn about Maine wildlife and experience some of the animals Maine has to offer first hand!

Also, on June 28th we are hosting a little **Birthday Party** 10:00am to 3:00pm for our wonderful Interlibrary Loan Librarian, Francoise! Please stop by, grab a cupcake and wish her a happy birthday! She makes the library a fun place to be so let's celebrate her on this special day.

The "A Universe of Stories!" summer reading program is gearing up and I have been spending lots of time at schools getting kids excited to read their way through the summer. If you are not familiar with the summer reading at the library, it is an eight-week long program where any children between the ages of 2-12 are invited to track their time spent reading and earn prizes. Each child fills out a "contract" where families personalize their weekly reading goal according to what best suits them. When the weekly goal is met, they get a prize. It's that easy! Sign-ups will begin on June 10th and the first 100 kids to register get a free bag with goodies. The goal of this whole program is to keep kids engaged in reading, learning, and exploring the world around them. Our hope is that by enrolling, you will encourage and help your child beat summer slide and maintain their literacy skills in schoolfree months.

In addition to reading for prizes, we also offer weekly storytimes and weekly family programs. Our summer storytimes will be all about space in celebration of the 50th anniversary of the first lunar landing. These storytimes will take place every Wednesday at 10:15 and a free lunch will be offered directly following for any interested children. Our Tuesday family programs are also a lot of fun and are free and open to all. Some of the programs are here at the library and others are out and about in the community. Schedules of programs will be going out to all MSAD 54 kids in grades K-5 within the next week or so, or you can pick one up at the library when you register your child/children.

I would like to say a special thank you to the Friends of the Skowhegan Library who funded all of our Tuesday programs for the summer reading program, and to all the local business and people who have donated incentives to hand out to our young readers when they meet their weekly goals! We will continue to collect prizes from anyone willing to donate throughout the summer.
