

# WALKING IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF MARTIN LUTHER ~ OCTOBER 4-12, 2017

Did you ever open a picture book and imagine yourself planted in the middle of the scene on the pages before you? Walking through the cobblestone streets and edifices of Wittenberg, Eisleben, Erfurt, and Eisenach, the 16<sup>th</sup> century life of Martin Luther reaches thru time to touch the present.

From the precisely penned notes by Martin Luther in the margins of his Bible, to the gathering room where Martin Luther invited students to discourse, to the gate Martin Luther knocked on for admittance to the Augustinian monastery... all these and more somehow brought the scholar, the theologian, the reformer, and the man to life.

The 14 Good Shepherd members and friends on this tour of Luther's Germany were joined by 27 other Christian pilgrims from across the U.S. Our knowledgeable guides shared Martin Luther's story within the context of the Reformation period, taking us ~

- † to the monastery where Martin Luther came to understand that we are justified by faith alone;
- † to Wittenberg University where Luther helped shape the education system we know today;
- † to see how teams of people worked with a printing press to reproduce the Bible, making it more accessible to all;

⊕ to Eisleben where he was born, baptized and the room where Martin Luther reportedly gazed upon St Andreas Church, site of his last four sermons, before he took his earthly life's last breath.

These sites and more brought our Lutheran heritage to life. Asking fellow travelers about their favorite trip moments yields a variety of responses.

- Pastor Chelsea stood in a pulpit from which Martin Luther preached, one of her life goals.
- Others enjoyed artifacts curated in Coburg Fortress where Martin Luther once took refuge.
- ▼ Singing Martin Luther's hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is Our God," in the small Corpus Christi Chapel overflowing to standing room only, voices reverberating the song's strength against the stone walls, brought joyful tears to the eyes of many.
- For others, a highlight was standing in the church where he took his vows as a monk.
- The sharing of the Eucharist together at week's end was a spiritual capstone to the journey.
- Standing before Martin Luther's tomb in Castle Church, Wittenberg, was a powerful reminder of the courage required to speak out against the wrongs of this world, and what a humble honor it is to serve God as His Hands, His Feet, His Voice, and His Stewards on earth,

And I do think the pretzels, goulash, and beer were favorites among the group.
