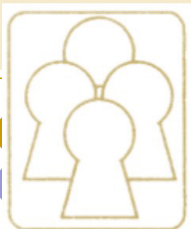

Robin Deutsch is the Director of the Center of Excellence for Children, Families and the Law at William James College and core faculty in the Clinical Psychology doctoral program. Board certified in Couples and Family Psychology, she practices as a mediator, parenting coordinator, reunification specialist, and consultant. Continuing to pursue her interest in interdisciplinary approaches to difficult family situations, she has consulted to the family courts of Massachusetts, Connecticut and Indiana and has published extensively on issues related to attachment, co-parenting after divorce, high conflict divorce, parent-child contact problems, parenting plans, and parenting coordination.
