Only **ONE** in **THREE** crime survivors said they received any help following the incident.





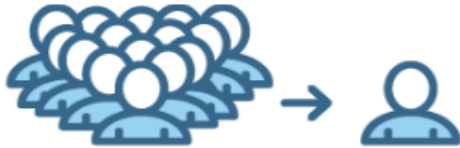

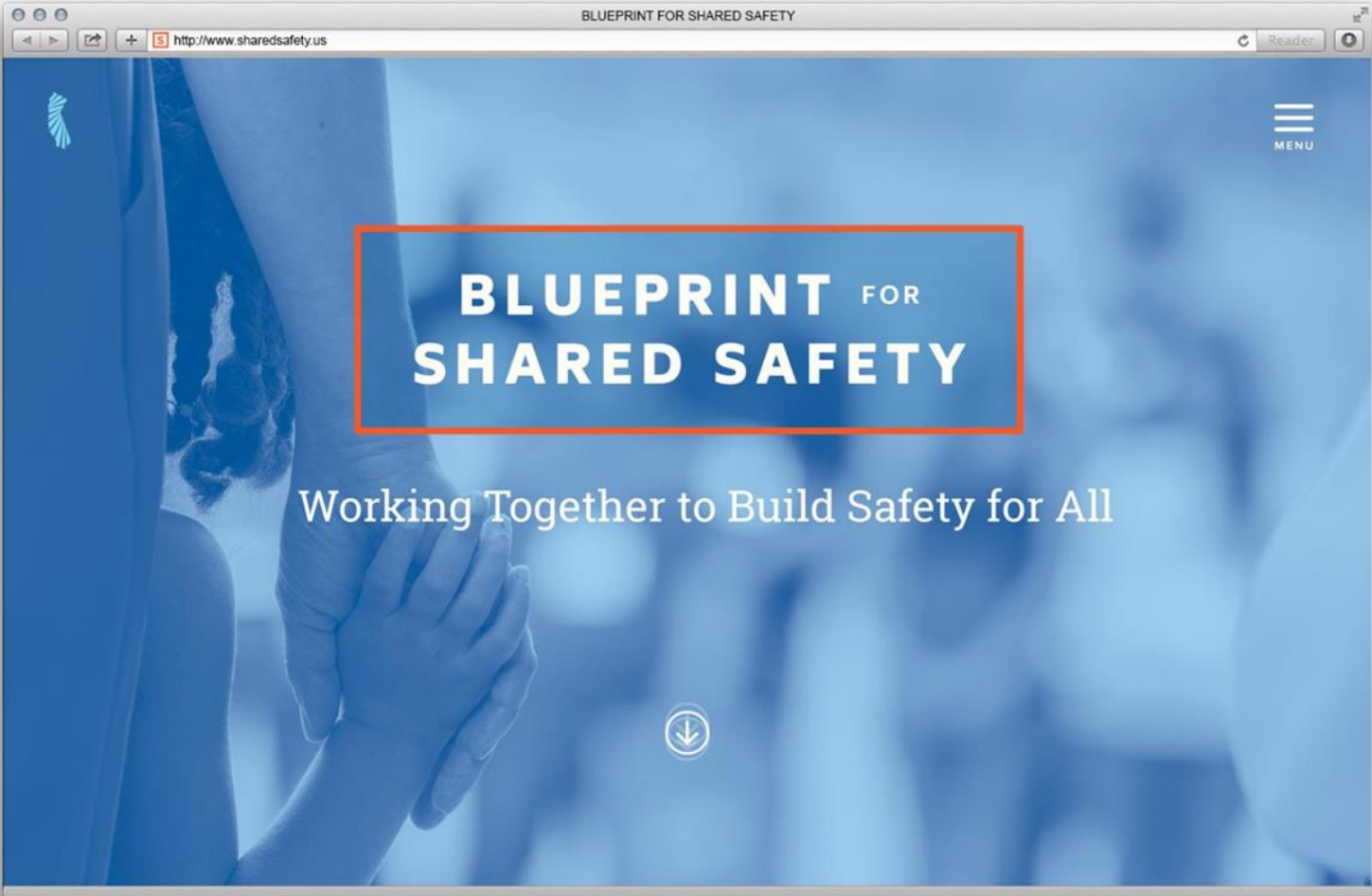
