MYS AUDITION AND REGISTRATION FEES 2018-2019 SEASON

Audition and registration fees are non-refundable.

SCHOOL ORCHESTRA/BAND REQUIREMENTS

MYS members are required to participate in their school music organization, provided there is one, on the same instrument they play in MYS. This also applies to programs that may be held before or after school. MYS is not a substitute for local school instrumental programs. Verification of school orchestra/band membership status may be requested throughout the season. Withdrawal from the school music program will result in dismissal from MYS.

PARENT PARTICIPATION

Parents are our most important partners in providing an exciting and educational music program for our MYS members. Parents are expected to participate monetarily and as volunteers in special programs throughout the season. Your involvement helps keep the program accessible to all children.

You are welcome to attend our normal weekly rehearsals so that you may witness your child's progress and the activities of his/her ensemble. However, we do ask that you bring a good book or have other quiet activities on hand so that you do not disrupt the rehearsal. Please note that all dress rehearsals at the Mesa Arts Center are **closed** rehearsals. Only Rehearsal Aides and assigned parent volunteers are allowed backstage or in the audience.

Along with encouraging your young musician's musical ability, we depend on your help. Please let us know how you can help by completing the parent volunteer portion on the member contract and by being aware of volunteer opportunities throughout the year. Thank you for your commitment in strengthening the Metropolitan Youth Symphony for all its members.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

In order to maintain our high standard of performance, it is the policy of the MYS Board of Directors that each member of each ensemble is expected to attend every MYS rehearsal, dress rehearsal, and performance. Absences due to a school concert, personal illness, or a family emergency are considered excused absences (as long as procedures are followed properly). We do realize our members occasionally have a conflict with a scheduled rehearsal. Each of these occurrences will be reviewed on an individual basis. However, you must understand that recurring absences, even though excused, may result in a written warning, a request to play your music for your conductor, loss of chair placement, or possible dismissal from MYS.

The responsibility for taking care of these matters is yours!! Each Ensemble has a Rehearsal Aide who functions as an individual orchestra manager. S/he is your <u>primary point of contact</u> for all questions and absences.

The MYS office is **NOT** your contact for absences.

Please remember to put your Rehearsal Aide's phone number in your cell phone.

You will get his/her cell # by the second rehearsal.

FOR AN ILLNESS OR FAMILY EMERGENCY:

Notify the Rehearsal Aide for your Division **BEFORE** the scheduled rehearsal time as to avoid an unexcused absence.

FOR SCHOOL CONCERTS:

Ask your Rehearsal Aide for an Absence Form. Fill it out completely and return it to the Rehearsal Aide <u>two weeks</u> before your anticipated absence. This form will be given to your Conductor to review. The form will be returned to the Rehearsal Aide and it will be indicated whether the absence is considered "excused" or "unexcused".

If you do not have the absence "excused" 2 weeks before the rehearsal in question, it may be marked as an unexcused absence. When you are absent from a rehearsal for any reason, you should contact the Rehearsal Aide for your Ensemble before the next rehearsal to see if music or notes have been passed out.

Three tardies in a concert cycle (late to rehearsal more than 10 minutes) shall constitute 1 unexcused absence.

MYS CODE OF CONDUCT

MYS ensembles rehearse at Mesa Community College and at the Mesa Arts Center for most dress rehearsals. In as much as we are guests at our designated rehearsal and performance sites, it is imperative that we adhere to a few basic rules and regulations concerning personal behavior.

Rules & Regulations:

- 1. Students abusing school or personal property will immediately be removed from the MYS ensemble.
- 2. Food and drinks (other than water) are not allowed in rehearsal or performance facilities NO GUM!
- 3. Do not play the piano or any other music equipment without permission from the conductor.
- 4. Be courteous to the person on the podium, whether student, conductor, or visitor.
- 5. Treat all equipment with care. Do not lean on the music stands or back in chairs. Do not write on the boards. Handle only your own instrument.
- 6. If a sibling is a member of MYS and needs to wait before/after their own rehearsal, they should bring homework or a good book and sit quietly in the back of the rehearsal room. Playing in the halls or inappropriate behavior will not be tolerated.
- 7. Each MYS member and parent is responsible for making sure the room is left in good condition. MYS members and parents will be asked to assist the staff with the setting up and breaking down of chairs and stands after the rehearsals. This is an easy task when everyone helps.
- 8. Cell phones and other electronic devices of our members are to be used only during breaks and before and after rehearsal time.

We are very fortunate to have these rehearsal and concert facilities available for our use and hope we will be able to continue to use them for many years to come.

MUSIC

The purchase of music is a large part of the operating budget of MYS. Proper care of music is the responsibility of every ensemble member. Every student will be held financially responsible for their folder of music. Any student who loses or damages music will be charged a \$6 fee for the replacement of each item. Division 1 members are issued a black leather music folder. Woodwind, Brass, and Percussion members are also issued tuners/clips. These are the property of MYS and all members will be charged \$40 for folders, \$15 for tuners, and \$10 for clips that are lost, damaged, or not returned.

Please read and understand the following music guidelines:

- 1. Bring all of your MYS music to every rehearsal. Do not count on your stand partner! What if s/he is absent?
- 2. If you need to mark your music, do so very lightly with a No.2 pencil. Bring a pencil to every rehearsal. Use NOTHING ELSE to mark music or you will be charged!
- 3. New music will be checked out to you in a manila envelope with your name on it. Missing or damaged music will be invoiced.

INSTRUMENTS

Please remember that while colored instruments, bow hair, shoulder rests, mouthpieces, etc may be fine for rehearsals, they are NOT appropriate for performances.

CHAIR AUDITIONS

Chair auditions are held to determine seating order for string-section members. They are held once during each regular concert cycle. This audition is only on music in your folder as specified by your Conductor.

Any orchestra member who misses chair auditions will be placed at the end of the section. In the case of anticipated absences (school concerts), you must tape your audition at rehearsal the week PRIOR to the chair auditions. First notification of the absence must be given to your Rehearsal Aide two weeks prior to chair auditions. In the case of unanticipated, excused absences (severe illness, etc) you must make arrangements to schedule an alternative audition time prior to the chair audition rehearsal because:

under NO circumstances will you be allowed to audition at a later date.

Results of the auditions may not be available until the Wednesday following chair auditions. Do <u>not</u> call the MYS office or your Rehearsal Aide for results. At the Conductor's discretion, musicians who are unable to fulfill the attendance requirements, unable to play their part, inattentive, or show evidence of inadequate home practice are subject to reseating. Additional chair tests will be announced the week prior to the actual testing and could result in re-seating. Always be prepared.

To be eligible to participate in the September chair auditions, you must meet the following requirements:

- 1. The MYS online Member Contract/Volunteer Form must be submitted by the 2nd rehearsal
- 2. Your Signature Sheets (both pages) must be returned to your Rehearsal Aide by the 2nd rehearsal
- 3. Your MYS registration fees must be paid in full or deferred payment arrangements made with the MYS office by the 2nd rehearsal.
- 4. Div 1: retreat forms signed, notarized, and turned in ON TIME by the 2nd rehearsal.

DIVISION I RETREAT

On September 29th & 30th, members of Division 1 attend our annual Division 1 Weekend Retreat at the Sky-Y Camp in Prescott. This is considered part of Division 1's normal rehearsal schedule. It provides members with required rehearsal time, sectionals, and other musical activities. It also gives them an opportunity to become better acquainted with their fellow orchestra members and greatly enhances their ability to work together as a successful full orchestra. Each member is responsible for transportation to the retreat. Retreat permission forms and details will be available online and at the first rehearsal. Forms are due back to the Division 1 Rehearsal Aide by the second rehearsal on Sept 13, 2018

DIVISION 1 WOODWIND/BRASS/PERCUSSION CHAIR PLACEMENT/TESTS

Initial chair placement for woodwind, brass, and percussion players will be determined by Fall Audition scores. Instrument groups with more than one player on a part (i.e. two people playing 1st flute, etc) will have seating tests at the scheduled seating rehearsals. Periodic music checks will also be done by the Winds/Percussion Coach, Division 1 Conductor, and Wind Ensemble Conductor to ensure that the material is being prepared and performed at the appropriate level. Percussion parts will be assigned by the Winds/Percussion Coach and Wind Ensemble Conductor based on the member's ability to cover the part.

DIVISION 1 WOODWIND/BRASS/PERCUSSION SECTIONALS

Division 1 woodwind/brass/percussion members participate in sectional rehearsals throughout the season. Sectionals will be held on the 2nd week of each concert series from 4:45pm-6:00pm at our regular rehearsal venue, as well at the Music Marathon. Additional sectionals will be added if necessary. Sectional coaches are members of local symphonies and/or public school instrumental music teachers. The following dates have been set aside for sectional rehearsals:

September 13th - January 17th - (February 9th/at marathon) - March 21st

** Dates above subject to change, watch your email and check the MYS website OFTEN **

MYS CONCERT TICKETS

You can purchase your MYS concert tickets ONLY from the Mesa Arts Center (MAC). All tickets are \$8.50 (or \$10 for mezzanine). The MAC is located at 1 East Main St. in downtown Mesa. The box office is open from 10am-7pm Mon-Fri, 10am-5pm on Sat, and 12pm-4pm on Sun. if you wish to purchase your tickets in person. You may purchase tickets online from the MAC website (www.MesaArtsCenter.com) or by phone at 480-644-6500. Tickets may be purchased for each individual concert or for the entire season at your convenience.

DRESS REHEARSAL

For an orchestra, "dress rehearsal" means rehearsing on stage in the concert facility. You do NOT need to wear your "concert dress" outfit to the dress rehearsal unless we tell you to do so.

Dress rehearsal and concert night instructions will be emailed prior to each concert to confirm the times and locations of the performances. Dress rehearsals at the Mesa Arts Center (MAC) are <u>CLOSED</u>. Only Rehearsal Aides and assigned volunteers will be allowed backstage or in the audience.

DEBUT & DIVISION 4 - will perform at all concerts. They will have their MAC dress rehearsals on the SAME DAY as the concert. All other groups will have their dress rehearsals the DAY BEFORE the concert.

HILTON HOLIDAY CONCERT - there is no formal/on-site dress rehearsal for this December 5th concert. There will be a "dress" rehearsal at our regular rehearsal venue (MCC) earlier in the week. More information will be posted on our website & sent via email in November.

CONCERT ETIQUETTE

Our MAC concerts will start at 6:30pm and have a short intermission. In the spirit of mutual support and musical development, MYS members, with the exception of Debut Orchestra & Division 4, are <u>required</u> to remain in attendance throughout the performances of all ensembles. Leaving performances early may constitute an unexcused absence and may result in loss of chair seating or dismissal from MYS. If you have questions or concerns, please call the MYS office at 480-456-9501 **two weeks prior** to the concert date.

DEBUT - will have their MAC dress rehearsals on the <u>same day</u> as the concerts. MYS will provide a snack prior to their performance. Debut members will be required to stay after their performance and sit with their group in the mezzanine. They may leave <u>at intermission</u> ONLY (after Division 4 performance). A parent must pick up child from the security/back door, being sure to check out with the Rehearsal Aide. If not picked up at intermission, they must remain seated in the mezzanine until the end of the concert (after Division 1).

DIVISION 4 - will have their MAC dress rehearsals on the <u>same day</u> as the concerts. MYS will provide a snack prior to their performance. Div 4 members may leave after their performance (during intermission). A parent must pick up child from security/back door, being sure to check out with the Rehearsal Aide. If not picked up at intermission, they must remain seated in the mezzanine until the end of the concert (after Division 1).

HILTON HOLIDAY CONCERT - all groups will perform at this concert on December 5th (no ticket required to attend). Concert starts at 6:30pm. Because of the limited seating, all members will be allowed to leave after their performance - this concert only.

Your MAC call (arrival) times will be announced prior to each concert. Check our website and your emails OFTEN!

Parents ONLY: you may record all concerts and recitals as long as it is not disruptive to those around you. Tri-pods, mono-pods, etc. are NOT allowed at the Mesa Arts Center per Fire Marshall regulations. There is no flash photography allowed at concerts or recitals.

MYS Members: absolutely NO electronic devices are to be used while sitting in the mezzanine - including phones.

CONCERT DRESS

In order to avoid any confusion, here are the requirements for MYS concert dress. MYS has a very strict dress code for concerts. All members must wear proper "concert dress" in order to perform on the concert. There will be a concert dress check at your rehearsal on October 24th/25th. Everyone (including returning members) are REQUIRED to wear their entire concert outfit (this does include socks, bow ties, and belts). Plan to wear the outfit for the entire rehearsal as there will not be time to change clothes.

BOYS *must* have:

- *Black dress pants/slacks must touch top of foot, no "floods" and no jeans
- *White (not off-white), long sleeved, collared, button-down dress shirt, must tuck into pants, and be pressed
- *Black bow tie
- *Black belt
- *Black socks calf length or higher (no ankle socks)
- *Black dress shoes no tennis shoes

GIRLS must have:

- *Black skirt must touch top of foot, no slits OR
- *Black dress pants must touch foot, NO: jeans, skinny pants, capris/ankle pants, leggings, or jeggings
- *White (not off-white), long sleeved (to wrist), collared, button-down blouse, not sheer, must tuck into pants, and be pressed
- *Black socks (calf length or higher) **OR** tights (opaque, not sheer)
- *Black dress shoes must completely enclose foot no open toe, back, or side

*** ALL CONCERT CLOTHING, INCLUDING SHOES AND HAIR ACCESSORIES, SHOULD BE <u>PLAIN</u> ***

Jewelry and other accessories should be neutral (not showy). Sequins, sparkles, shiny buckles, bright colors, or anything that might otherwise be a distraction while on stage is not allowed.

MYS SOLO RECITAL SERIES

The MYS Solo Recital Series provides our members, with the exception of Debut, the opportunity to perform as a soloist in a formal recital setting. Participation is optional. Admission is free. Family and friends are encouraged to attend the recitals and the receptions which follow.

The dates and times for the 2018-2019 recitals are:

Sunday, February 17, 2019 Saturday, March 9, 2018 Saturday, April 20, 2018

If you plan to participate in the May Scholarship Competition, members of Divisions 1 & 2 are required to PERFORM at one of the recitals. Members of Wind Ensemble and Divisions 3 & 4 may PERFORM or ATTEND one of the recitals.

Information about recitals will be given out at the 2nd rehearsal of the season. At that time your child will be able to sign up for a recital.

You will receive a recital application about a month before your requested recital date. The application form and the accompanying letter will give you more detailed information about the recital. The form must be filled out <u>completely</u> and turned in by the stated deadline. Your private teacher <u>must sign</u> the form to assure us that you and your accompanist are properly prepared. If you do not have a private teacher, you must make arrangements to play your piece (with your accompanist) for your conductor before the application deadline.

If your solo was written with piano accompaniment (keeping in mind that most solos ARE written with accompaniment), it is your responsibility to find a QUALIFIED accompanist. You may use your own accompanist but you will <u>not</u> be allowed to perform at a recital or in the scholarship competition if you and your accompanist are not properly prepared. A list of accompanists that you can call will be attached to your application if you do not have your own.

MYS SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS

Metropolitan Youth Symphony awarded many scholarship awards to MYS musicians at the close of our past season.

The number of scholarships awarded and the amount of each scholarship awarded to each Ensemble for the 2018-2019 season will be determined by the Board of Directors based on available funds.

We will again be presenting a DIRECTOR'S AWARD to one outstanding member of each Ensemble. The recipient of this award is chosen by the Conductor of each group.

To qualify for an MYS Scholarship, members must meet the following criteria:

DIVISION 1 (strings & winds/percussion) & DIVISION 2:

- 1. Be an MYS member in good standing with all fees paid (i.e. registration, music replacement, etc.)
- 2. Participate in one MYS recital
- 3. Have no unexcused absences* from rehearsals or concerts (or retreat & wind sectionals for Div 1)
- 4. Apply for scholarship and perform in the Scholarship Competition on May 9th.

DIVISION 3, DIVISION 4, & WIND ENSEMBLE:

- 1. Be an MYS member in good standing with all fees paid (i.e. registration, music replacement, etc.)
- 2. Attend (or participate in) one MYS recital
- 3. Have no unexcused absences* from rehearsals or concerts
- 4. Apply for a scholarship and submit the additional form that you will be given in April to the Scholarship Committee outlining your contribution to your orchestra. The committee will review these forms and determine the scholarship winners.

MYS SUMMER MUSIC CAMP

The MYS staff has put together a week-long program full of work, fun, & learning to challenge and motivate our young musicians. Camp will be held **June 17-21, 2019**. Some of the classes include orchestra/band rehearsals, sectionals, theory, and many electives. There is a concert on the final day of camp to show off what we've learned! More information and the exact times and location of camp will be announced later in the season.

MYS FUNDRAISERS

The MYS Board of Directors and staff are dedicated to doing all they can to help keep registration fees and ticket prices low, while still maintaining a quality instrumental program. MYS holds a variety of special events for fun and for fundraising. Following you will find information on some of these fundraising opportunities. For more information: **www.azmys.org**

MUSIC MARATHON - Saturday, February 9, 2019

The most important fundraiser of the year is our annual MUSIC MARATHON. MYS musicians are given a pledge form in November and they are asked to collect pledges from family, friends, and neighbors. These supporters write checks payable to MYS. While the MYS musicians are collecting checks and pledges, the MYS office (and parents) are collecting prizes to be given away during the marathon. **Each MYS family is expected to collect a minimum of \$100**.

At the Marathon, we give musicians raffle tickets based on the amount of pledges received. Drawings for prizes will be held every half hour during the <u>afternoon rehearsal</u>. The number of prizes given away each hour will depend on the number of prizes donated. You must be present to win. For <u>money turned in</u> on or before February 9th, you will receive a ticket for every \$5. Each MYS member who participates in the afternoon activities will automatically receive 5 tickets for the drawing.

Anyone who collects \$200 or more in pledges will be placed in a special prize drawing. You do NOT have to be present to win <u>this</u> prize!!

A **GRAND PRIZE** is given to the musician who raises the most money. They can be from any Ensemble. The next 3 top money collectors will receive a **FIRST PLACE PRIZE**. These prizes are in addition to the tickets they receive for the raffle drawings.

All Division 1 members are <u>required</u> to attend the morning portion of the Marathon as this is part of their regular rehearsal/sectional schedule.

MYS GIFT SHOP

Our gift shop offers MYS and other musical merchandise to its members and concert goers. We open the gift shop in the lobby at the Mesa Arts Center and Mesa Hilton before & after all concerts and at the Music Marathon. It is staffed by parent volunteers from each ensemble who will help with the set up and sale of merchandise. Please stop by and support MYS.

INSURANCE

Metropolitan Youth Symphony, Inc. does not carry insurance on musical instruments. Members should have their own insurance coverage against damage and/or theft.

PHOTO & AUDIO RELEASE/PUBLICITY

From time to time, photos and audio recordings are made during rehearsals and/or concerts for use in brochures, newspapers, MYS website, Facebook, Instagram, etc. Since photos are recorded live during student activities, we can not single out individuals who may not wish to be photographed. Therefore, participation in any/all MYS activities includes a photo and audio release.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

MYS will be working in conjunction with our local United Food Bank in an effort to help give back to the community. Members, friends, and family are encouraged to bring food donations to our weekly rehearsals starting in October and to our December 5th and May 1st concerts. WHO WOULD YOU CALL...

DO NOT CALL THE MYS OFFICE TO REPORT ABSENCES

(on rehearsal and concert days, no one will be in the office past noon)


