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Overview

"Building lasting relationships between people and the natural world" is the mission of the Lee and Rose Warner Nature Center. A large part of that is fulfilled by the school programs. To obtain feedback from teachers who bring their students to Warner to experience nature first hand, a group of volunteers created and sent a survey.

The survey included the guidelines pertinent to Warner's school programs. Sixty-seven teachers from 33 schools of the 45 that received the surveys responded.

For a summary of the Likert Scale responses to the 20 questions, please refer to the first page of the survey results with the heading beginning, "The following statements are adapted from guidelines taken from "Guidelines for Excellence: Early Childhood Environmental Education Programs (NAAEE). The North American Association for Environmental Education is taking the lead in establishing guidelines for the development of balanced, scientifically accurate, and comprehensive environmental education programs and materials. The section following asks for responses to two questions.

How satisfied have you been with Warner Nature Center? Please explain. Responses include:

- Warner Nature Center far and above exceeded any expectations. It is a field trip like no other. It was by far, the best field trip destination. The staff and volunteers are AMAZING.
- Warner is a beloved tradition that is part of our school culture.
- Their staff have an incredible wealth of knowledge.
- For some (students) it's their only opportunity to be out in nature and learning about the natural ecosystem around us.
- It was always an educational and fun outing for our students that aligned with our science standard!
- This has been one of the most rewarding experiences my students have experienced every year.
- Warner Nature Center has provided an excellent supplement to our science curriculum.

What impacts or challenges will the closing of Warner Nature Center have on your students and/or your school? Responses include:

- We are scrambling to decide how we will cover the state science standards that Warner covered for us.
- We will no longer get to bring a real world experience to our kids with respect to our natural ecosystem.
- Our school population is diverse and has a lot of low-income families which means our students don't get opportunities to experience something like this.
- The students won't get the real life experiences they have gotten in the past.
- Environmental Literacy is essential for our future generations.

Teachers were asked for Additional Comments. Here are sample responses.

- It is a huge part of our school culture.
- The experience that is provided by Warner Nature Center is one that cannot be replicated.

The teachers' comments are reflective of five themes:

- Warner is irreplaceable
- Warner is a part of the schools' culture and curriculum.
- The programs meet state educational standards.
- Staff and volunteers are highly professional, knowledgeable, and enthusiastic.
- The closing is a loss to the teachers and their students, to the Warner staff and volunteers, and to the community at large.

Demographics

The survey request was sent to private schools and public school districts totaling 44 elementary, intermediate, and middle schools that brought students to Warner Nature Center for programs during the 2018/2019 school year. Sixty-eight teachers completed the survey. The teachers were from 32 different schools plus one independent teacher. The responding teachers taught the following grades

The teachers were asked to estimate how many years they had been bringing students to Warner Nature Center. The responses ranged from 1 to 28 years with an average of 11 years.

Questions Answered By Teachers

Question 1: How satisfied have you been with Warner Nature Center? Please explain.

- Very satisfying experience. Very engaging and fun.
- Very. The program is very kid friendly and the kids have a great time

- Extremely satisfied. The programming is engaging and the employees and volunteers care about kids and their learning.
- Extremely satisfied! Very organized programs! Several hands on activities that kept students interested and engaged. Most of our students had never been snow shoeing or tried a kick sled. Having this first time opportunity was great for our students!
- Extremely satisfied. The trips have been very informative for the students and a great opportunity for them to learn about nature and different ecosystems.
- Extremely. The programs are so well organized and the students walk away with such an appreciation for nature. It is always a highlight of the year and a place where we know we can take our kids to learn and be one with their surroundings. The leaders always did an amazing job providing age appropriate, hands on, exploration type activities for our kids.
- Extremely satisfied! We (teachers) weren't sure what to expect on our first visit there. Warner Nature Center far and above exceeded any expectations! It is a field trip like no other. It was by far, the best field trip destination. The staff and the volunteers are AMAZING. Every little detail has been thought through. Our kindergarteners were given the opportunities they would probably not had otherwise. Like snowshoeing through the peaceful forest, looking and listening for signs of wildlife and exposing students to nature. And the kick sleds? The students couldn't stop talking about how fun they were. The teachers had just as much fun as the students!

Our students remember what they learn year to year. They are excited for trips to Warner and to see the staff they love. Fourth grade is when our students make their final trip to Warner and it is not uncommon for them to be truly saddened to learn that their field trips are coming to an end.

Question 2: What impacts or challenges will the closing of Warner Nature Center have on your students and/or your school?

- Miss out on one of the few fieldtrips we are permitted per year. Hands-on learning and applied exposure to what is learned within the classroom.
- We are sad and disappointed. This is a trip we look forward to.
- Not learning the beautiful and exciting things in nature/experience
- Especially at my new school I have students who have very limited experience with nature. We will look for an alternate nature center experience, but it won't be like Warner!
- Our students will not receive the Winter Animals program. We were fortunate to receive some bus scholarships in the past to attend which helped our close to 70% free and reduced school.
- Future students will miss out on the opportunity to see the amazing things offered through the field trip to Warner Nature Center
- It's a definite loss to our curriculum. This field trip ties in well with our academic standards and was so nice because it was close to our school. With the rising cost of busses it is nice to have a wonderful option close to home and doesn't cost us a small fortune to travel to.
- Our choices for field trips, especially outdoor ones, are extremely limited. Nothing compares to the experiences we had at Warner Nature Center.
- All of our students will feel the impact of Warner closing. They have already asked when
 we will be going this year. They will miss out on learning and the unique hands-on
 opportunities Warner has to offer. As for the teachers, we are scrambling to decide how
 we will cover the state Science standards that Warner covered for us.
- This is very important to our 3rd grade experience and wonderful enhancement to our curriculum.
- Our kids are being bombarded with technology. They are not being exposed to the
 wonderful world around them as much as in past generations. Warner Nature Center,
 year after year providing a wonderful learning environment, full of adventure,
 knowledge and even more important, helped kids to see the world around them in a
 different light.
- The classes Warner offers fit perfectly with our Minnesota State Science Standards.
 WNC gives our students the nature experience to go along with what we have taught
 them. It is close to our district, so the cost of getting to Warner is within our very tight
 budget. The cost of attending a different nature center could make this kind of field trip
 unattainable for our students.
- Students will not get the experience of interacting up close with nature. I cannot put into words the spark of interest Warner has provided for so many of our students. Not only that, but the no/low cost experience is unheard of.
- Our scheduled filed trip this year has been canceled. It will impact over 200 of our 4th grade students. Our staff is deeply disappointed to hear of the closing. It's been our favorite field trip.

- This will take away students opportunities to take their learning outside of the classroom. We will lose the opportunity to help give students an outdoor experience and the chance to learn about the animals and nature in their community.
- We will no longer get to bring a real world experience to our kids with respect to our natural ecosystem. They will now have to learn it in an abstract way in the classroom instead of getting out there and really experiencing it hands on and in real life.
- There just isn't anything else like it and it will be hard to find a similar experience for our kids. This is the one trip that is unique for all the kids. Many have been to museums, concerts, plays, etc. In this age of technology, what a refreshing opportunity for kids to get outside and get unplugged.
- We will lose the chance to have students explore what they are learning about in the classroom. In Kindergarten, my students learn about animals in winter. During our outreach programs and our field trips, Warner Nature Center has given my students a chance to explore what we are learning. Many of my students don't have any other opportunity to do this. The closing of Warner Nature Center means that my students are missing out on this educational opportunity. On our field trips to Warner, my students have had the opportunity to snow shoe and kick-sled, how to follow animal tracks, observe animals, and explore plants. They have the chance to see some of the habitats, plants and animals in the real world. They also get to learn more about these things in a way that is appropriate to them. I am devastated that this won't be available to future classes.
- Our school population is diverse and has a lot of low-income families which means our students don't get opportunities to experience something like this.
- The tradition of going to Warner Nature Center has always been a favorite and I am so sad that my students will not have the unique experience. I also loved when Krista would come to our class and instruct students. It was a wonderful hands-on lesson.
- There are no other experiences like this around for our age/grade level. The centers close to our close are for upper grades.
- Our students will miss out in an opportunity that isn't available with costing and bussing. There are no other nature centers within driving limits.
- They will not have the opportunity to learn about the outdoors and see first hand the connectivity within an ecosystem.
- We are extremely disappointed to hear that the students of Somerset Elementary are
 not going to be able to have the experience at Warner Nature Center. The kids loved the
 bird banding and release a life bird. Some of our students have never had the
 opportunity to explore water creatures like they do when they scoop the bottom of the
 lake.
- Not every student has the opportunity to experience the great outdoors the way they
 can at the WNC. The bog, the lake, the nature walks, the bird banding and the list goes
 on. Where can they learn about and experience these things? My grown sons still talk
 about this field trip! It is a tremendous loss for our Mn students.
- We are only allowed 2 field trips each year. I don't know if is possible to replace our trip
 to Warner Nature Center with anything that will give us anything CLOSE to the impact of

- this field trip. We have always felt so lucky to have such a treasure right in our own backyard!
- The students won't get the real life experiences they have gotten in the past.
- Warner Nature Center was often the first experience our student population had to experience immersion into "the woods". It will be almost impossible to find an affordable experience to replace our visit to Warner Nature Center.
- I believe so many kids (these days) do not get an experience outside with natural surroundings. From birds, to bats, tapping trees, catching water inhabitants, the list goes on... Warner provided an educational experience in nature priceless!
- For many of our students this is their first exposure to this type of environment. I worry for many of them, this will be a missed opportunity to be introduce the to the beauty and awe of nature. Environmental Literacy is essential for our future generations.
- Loss of access to nature for my fourth graders.
- We will need to try to find a new outdoor experience for our students but we don't know where. Warner is located in our own district and meets our needs so beautifully!
- The closing of Warner would create a void in our repertoire of experiences that we provide for children. Kids would be missing out on the basic understanding of ecosystems, animals and nature. Without this foundation of knowledge and content, kids have a weaker and more limited view of science.
- We won't have a place to go to where we can be out in nature. We won't see wildlife and nature in real life. It takes away what is usually the children's favorite field trip of the year.
- Our students will not have the opportunity to explore a bog, collect and analyze water samples from a fresh water pond, and take part in bird banding while releasing birds into the wild. These are only a few of the opportunities that will not be available to our students if Warner Nature Center closes.
- We are devastated. Warner offered the chance for all of our kids, but especially our intown, low-income, no transit, no natural experience kids to be able to experience the wonder of nature. Many of these kids live in apartments (or are homeless) and talk about how they can't go outside and play, so they stay inside and play video games instead. Our trips to Warner opened their eyes to a whole different world for them. A world filled with nature and animals, with fun and with stewardship. It's a lesson I truly feel they won't get unless visiting Warner Nature Center. How are we to raise environmentally conscious kids if they don't have the opportunity to see and experience this in action, if they aren't given the opportunity to spark their curiosity and passion for the outdoors? How many opportunities will be lost as generations of kids no longer have this incredibly rich resource to draw on? Warner simply can't close...the kids and the environment needs you!
- Very sad and disappointing for our students and families. We are very sad.
- Our students (and prior students) and very disappointed that Warner is closing and that
 we will no longer be able to take groups of students to Warner. The closing has also put
 strain on the teachers as we now have to find an alternative field trip. Unfortunately,
 there is really nothing comparable to Warner.

- Our students will miss an incredible experience of hands on learning like no other. There is nowhere else that can provide what Warner staff & volunteers provided.
- Our city kids will not get the chance to experience the great outdoors that Warner offers. Many of our students just do not get exposed to the things WNC offers.
- There is simply no other alternative site to visit or staff to teach our kids what the Warner staff and volunteers have been able to do. It will be a tremendous loss for the students we work with.
- The closing of Warner Nature Center is going to present a large challenge for the entire school district of New Richmond, Wisconsin. It has been the most impactful field trip for our 5th graders that aligns to our state standards about Life Science. The knowledge they gain about ecosystems, habitats, and the ways organisms interact is irreplaceable despite what our best efforts will be to try mimic these activities in our classrooms. The closing of Warner Nature Center will have a dire and extremely negative impact on our school district, our school, and our 5th grade classrooms. Our hearts are broken!
- The programs offered at Warner are not available in our area. It will be a great loss to our students to not benefit from the knowledge and hands-on experiences that Warner offered.
- We will miss out on an outstanding educational experience.
- We have had to cancel our spring field trip to Warner Nature and will obviously not be going on any field trips there in future years. The fact that Warner was free for our students was amazing and gave us the budget to have two or two and a half field trips. Our students this year will entirely miss out on the outdoor natural learning that Warner provided. We looked at going to Dodge but simply couldn't afford it this year. For future years, we might look at other nature centers like Dodge, but that will hamper our budget for additional field trip options due to costing much more money than Warner. Beyond the cost, Warner was a truly unique experience. Warner Nature Center field trip day was a full day outside, observing, running, playing, and joyfully learning about the natural world in a beautiful and unique setting. Warner Nature center field trip day was the best day of third grade for most of our students.
- It will be a loss as our students will not be able to learn about ecosystems in a setting common to Minnesota. Warner Nature Center has friendly and knowledgeable staff that explain the different needs of birds and plants.
- Sadly, we will have to search out another spot that we can try to experience the same quality activities/learning in similar environments, but it will be hard to do.
- There are kids even here in Stillwater who do not get any time in the woods. With all of the current research on the positive impact that nature has on children, we need to find any avenue we can to get them out into the woods.
- It will be a huge loss for us. The school talks about it to one another and gets excited for the 3rd and 4th graders when they hear that we have a trip scheduled. There is not another place that could teach what and how that the teachers and staff at Warner can...I am amazed what the students retain after one day at the center. The lessons are not only part of my state standards, but they hit all learning styles and cultures and are taught with such respect, patience, and passion. Our children learn about the care and

- beauty of our world and respond to the lessons taught by the application that occurs in my classroom throughout the entire year.
- For many of our students this is one of the few times they have away from their electronic devices. The Warner Nature Center allows students to see that the outdoors is fun and there is a lot to explore. Many of our challenging students thrive at the Warner Nature Center. The activities and environment of the Warner Nature Center gives those an opportunity to be successful, when the usual school setting is challenging for them.
- It will be a major loss. We have 2 in school field trips and 1 on site field trip each year. Our students learn and gain experience in areas that match what we are teaching in our curriculum. Warner Nature Center even covers a few of the MN State Standards for science--in a much more impactful and profound way than we ever could at school on our own. They start going to Warner at the beginning of their school career and go each year until 5th grade. Their learning builds on previous years. It's such a remarkable format.
- I will have to find other ways to incorporate nature into my classroom. Warner Nature Center was a huge resource for our school. I'm very sad to see it leave.
- Our school has a goal every year of providing a minimum of two out-of-school enrichment activities for the students. We feel they are extremely beneficial. We have been going to the nature center for years and always feel it positively impacts our students which brings us back each year. With the Nature Center closing, we will have to search for other activities that are of educational value (and cost-friendly) to our students.
- First of all it has been the only field trip that we have gone on for over ten years due to our funding. This is one of the students most memorable fourth grade experience and the bonding that occurs between students and staff in this unique experience will be missed.
- This field trip met some of our standards that we are required to teach. Warner has always been very well prepared and so much fun for our students. We will now have to find another location that is close by and as knowledgeable as your staff and volunteers.
- We are devastated by the closing of WNC. First of all, the breadth of programs and seasons gives so many options. The grouping of students with exceptionally qualified leaders/teachers was unbelievable --- my favorite and students' favorite every year was the bird banding and release. Our school now has to find an alternative nature center (or other) field trip, at additional cost, and not as much bang-for-the-buck.
- The Warner Nature Center provides experiences and exposure to the natural world that cannot be easily duplicated. The property with its lake, prairie and woods is an invaluable learning tool that has been developed so well over the years; other facilities don't offer that variety. The learning activities that the students are involved in are hands on, memorable, and presented by staff that have in depth knowledge and are passionate about the natural world. A classroom teacher doesn't have that expertise.

- Students will miss those specific standards that relate to science and the environment. Students will miss out on the bonding time as a class in the beginning of the year on a field trip like Warner's. Students will miss out on being in nature, learning how to love, respect, and appreciate it. There are also unique environmental concepts talked about at Warner that the students won't be able to experience anywhere else.
- This is truly a loss of an awesome experience for our students. With our world being such a technology saturated system, kids don't just get out into nature to spend time listening to birds and looking closely at evidence of nature, turning over logs to find treasures of life, snowshoeing through the woods in the winter and breathing in fresh air. I am not being mellow dramatic when I say that this experience is priceless for our students. Usually, at the end of our trip to Warner, we teachers talk about how this experience is so important for students. It makes them more aware of being in the outdoors enjoying nature rather than cooped up in a classroom just talking about living organisms. Our students always say that Warner is one of their most favorite field trips we plan each year.
- Our students and staff were extremely disappointed to hear of this closing. The students
 that we serve rarely have the opportunity to explore the natural classroom and glean all
 the invaluable lessons it has to offer. I'm saddened that they won't enjoy the wind in
 their face via teamwork on the kick sleds or experience taking perspective while looking
 through the simulation glasses.
- We look forward to this trip year after year. We will have to find other ways to teach many of our state standards--the Nature Center did a great job at teaching them in a way that was fun, educational, and hands-on. They also incorporated real-life experiences and inquiry that we can't provide in a normal school setting.
- We will not be able to find a comparable experience that will give our students such a
 wonderful first exposure to nature, animals, and ecosystem, AS WELL as providing fun
 outdoor experiences, especially in the winter! Our trip there always inspired families
 from our building to take their kids to Warner after, because the activities were so much
 fun and it is so close to home. EVERYONE loved kick sledding!
- They won't have an opportunity to visit a bog or witness bird banding.
- We will no longer have a field trip that is so closely linked to our science standards.
- Students will miss out on the valuable environmental lessons of Warner. Their experiences at WNC always come up in highlight discussions as we reflect on each year. Conservation education is dire to the future of our environment!
