We will also want to make sure those who are closest to us know how much they have meant to us. One way we do this is by leaving gifts in our Wills.

Making sure that our loved ones are provided for will usually be at the top of most of our lists when making Wills, but if Beaumont House is a cause that you have cared about during your lifetime – I ask that you might consider leaving us a gift in your Will too.

Gifts in Wills of all sizes have enabled Beaumont House to grow more than anyone could ever have imagined back in 1986 when Newark Hospice Aid was first established. These wonderful gifts have meant that we have been able to support thousands of patients and families over the 30 years and we want to continue to do so for the next 30 years and onwards. It is because we passionately believe that everyone matters right up until the point they die that we support patients'

families and loved ones at what is arguably one of the most difficult times of their lives. We believe this is a privilege offered to us by those who decide to ask for our help and who put their complete trust in us.

Patients are at the centre of all that we do and are at the heart of every decision we make at Beaumont House. IN MEMORY OF...

George Herbert Hindson passed away on 29th January 2013, but on his 88th birthday Beaumont House offered a huge hand of support and strength when the family and friends of George were in their darkest hour and, frankly, at their wits end. As a result of the compassion and kindness shown to him he immediately altered his Will to make Beaumont House a sole beneficiary of his estate.

Towards the end of his life George had clearly expressed his wish to die at home in Newark. Sadly the care plan put in place for him failed, leaving him and his closest family members distressed and highly concerned.

The words opposite come from Paul Meadows, a close family member.

“Having made all of the appropriate calls, but to no avail, in desperation, we got in the car and drove to Beaumont House. I only had to mention my name and the name of the patient and we were welcomed with open arms. Within minutes of arriving we were ushered into a private room and listened to intently about the day’s events. Having heard our story, the staff volunteered to try and sort matters out for us, the offer of which was hugely appreciated. We were not known to Beaumont House and without their intervention in our hour of need we would not have had the benefit of being with George for the extra 10 days after his birthday, a truly exemplary service to which the family and I owe a tremendous amount of gratitude. Nothing was too much trouble.”



HOW CAN I LEAVE A GIFT IN MY WILL?

We receive all kinds of gifts in people's wills, and we're grateful for all types of support. It is important that you speak to your solicitor if you're interested in changing or making a Will.

What type of gift can I leave?

You can leave a specific gift such as personal possessions (a piece of jewellery for example), land, buildings or specified items such as shares or the contents of a bank account. You can leave a pecuniary gift, which is a cash lump sum. You might like to ask your solicitor to index-link any cash gift to ensure its relative value stays the same over time.

You can leave a residuary gift which is the remainder of your estate after all other gifts and debts have been paid. This ensures that your family and loved ones are looked after first and what is left over can then be donated.

What if I need to change my Will?

Changes can be made to your Will at any time. Many solicitors recommend that you look to update your Will every 2 – 3 years. Marriage also automatically revokes a Will. Small changes can be made to your Will through a codicil form, again you will need to seek advice from your solicitor.
