November Silent Auction Guidelines

- A. Scour your sewing room and closets for unloved fabrics, notions, tools, sewing and cutting machines, tables, storage bins, racks, sample projects, UFO's, and anything else quilty or crafty related.
- B. Print out the last page of the newsletter as many times as you need to have one half sheet for each item you are donating. Fill in the top section. (we will have them available if you don't have a printer.)
- C. Bring everything to the church, doors open at 6pm. Find a spot on one of the empty tables and arrange your things.
- D. Then shop all the other great things, trying to leave with more than you came with!

How to Bid:

1. To place a silent auction bid, legibly print your name and phone number in the starting bid space or on the line following the highest current bid.
2. Indicate your bid in the appropriate space on your bidding row. All new bids must be higher than the previous bid by at least \$1 which is indicated at the top of the bid sheet, in order to be valid.
3. A bid is construed as an agreement to purchase the listed item(s) at the amount indicated. All bidders must be 18 years of age or above.
4. All winning bids must be settled before the end of the event by cash or check.
5. In order to protect the integrity of all bidders, please do not scratch out bids. Bids may only be voided by an ACQ Officer or Committee Chairperson. Please seek assistance if you find an invalid bid or make a mistake during bidding.
6. The auction will close at approximately 8:00 p.m. depending on how the evening progresses. Ample time will be given after the speaker and show and tell for those last bids. At the time announced by the President, the highest bid on each bid sheet will be declared the winner. If a conflict arises over identifying the last valid bid for an item (s), an ACQ Officer has the sole discretion to determine the winner or to impose an alternate method of closing the item for interested parties, including, but not limited to, a sealed final bid.

While we love friendly competition, please do not let it get out of hand by not permitting someone from making a last minute bid. No hip checking!

Most of all have fun and enjoy the evening!

First Teacher Profile for 2014 Andie Johnson Class in March—Sign up now!



Hey there. Born and raised in southwest Ohio, I'm married to my college sweetheart and we have 3 teens {2 guys, 1 gal} I love to garden and volunteer. I'm a terrible housekeeper but I'm a dang good cook and baker.

I learned to sew in high school in a home eq. class and fell in love with it. I then took 2 semesters of an advanced sewing class and really learned clothing construction and technique. I fell in love with quilts at an early age—it was a double wedding ring quilt that did it for me. It was done in yummy feedsack fabrics against a white muslin background. I love the creative process and I can't get enough of fabric and notions - they make me a little giddy.

But as the kids got busier and busier, I stopped sewing. In 2007, I started sewing again after making a quilt for a friend who adopted a little girl from China. My love for sewing came back stronger than ever! I truly believe God helped me find quilting and sewing again as a way to help me focus positive and useful energy into something that brings me joy. I can't tell you how much I love creating something! I love the construction process of quilting and sewing and I find great joy in creating and sharing with other women who create.

One of my very good friends, Kelly, and I thought it would be a great idea if we wrote a book, so we proposed it in April of 2011. In October 2012, Modern Designs For Classic Quilts was released by F+W Media.



Class project: the Effie's Web spider web quilt from our book, was such fun to make and was a great scrap buster. I love the technique of string quilts because they can be improvisational or very precise. They can be scrappy or have a very structured look. This would be a great opportunity for workshop attendees to share their scraps!

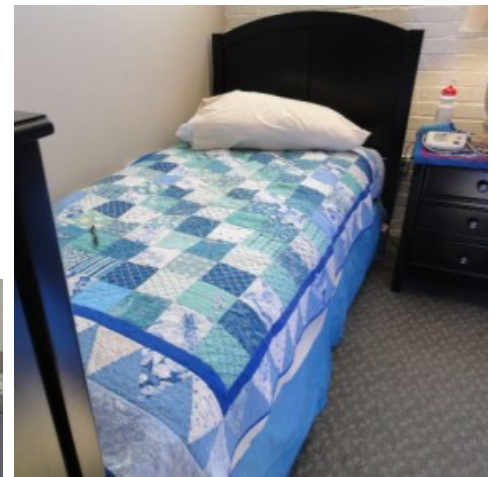




Charitable Quilts

We have distributed 212 quilts this year. We will be collecting finished quilts as well as quilt tops at the November And December meeting. Keep them coming ladies!

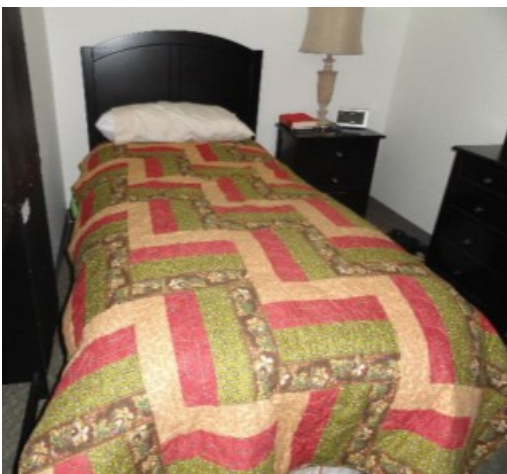

Dear ACQ, Thank you to everyone who helped make the beautiful quilts for the Salvation Army Harbor Light Facility. About 20 of us were treated to a lovely lunch at the facility, prepared and served by some of the men going through their program. Each man we met gave us a big smile and thanked us profusely for the beautiful quilts. They truly were appreciated. We toured the beautiful new facility, most of which had been paid for by the owners of Furniture Row. Furniture Row also provided brand new furniture for each room and their community rooms. Each bed had a quilt covering it or draped across the foot.

The men who go through the program are treated for their addictions, taught life skills, how to dress, be on time, write job interviews, and generally how to cope back out in the real world. Their families are also given counseling to help them cope. The men live in the facility anywhere from three months to up to two years, and once they have a job they can continue living there for a period, paying a percentage of their income as rent, plus they must prove that they are saving money. They also have 40-45 Veterans who go through their program who are either homeless or addicted. It really is quite a program. Since its inception about 17,000 men have completed the program and they have about 250 men go through each year. There are only about 6 or 7 Harbor Light facilities in the United States and the one in San Francisco has a floor for female veterans.



This was a moving experience for me and it was wonderful to actually see how our quilts were being used and appreciated. I think you all would have been impressed, as well.

Again, thanks to everyone in Columbine Quilt Guild and Arapahoe County Quilters who helped out on this project.

They meet the 1st Wednesday of the month from 9:30 am to noon at rotating houses in the East Denver to Aurora areas. They have a monthly topic, last month's being circles and embroidery. They describe themselves as having broad, diverse interests with being flexible, informal and "speaking their minds". Their name -Millennium- came from the year they established their bee- 2000. They do charity work for ACQ and Gateway Women's Shelter. Show and Tell was done with such items as a "wolf" quilt, Bonnie Hunter pattern quilt, Sunbonnet Sue quilt, a clothesline basket with knots, a modern quilt using a pattern by Terry Hancock Mangot. Diane offered the group a list of quilting tips. A copy of it will be included in the next ACQ newsletter. They would entertain a additional 2 new members to their bee.

"What a great group of women". That was my thought when I visited on Oct. 9th with the Highlands Ranch quilt bee at the Highlands Ranch library. There are a total of 23 members for this 18 year old bee. There are usually about 10-12 attendants at their bimonthly meetings. We discussed several things which included thread--types, weight, ply, colors, quality, resources, etc. One lady brought 2 new tools--a finger shaped rotary cutter and a small LED light to wrap around your finger. There was a great Show and Tell including completed charity quilts. There is a variety of expertise as well as variation from traditional to art quilt work. "A good time was had by all".

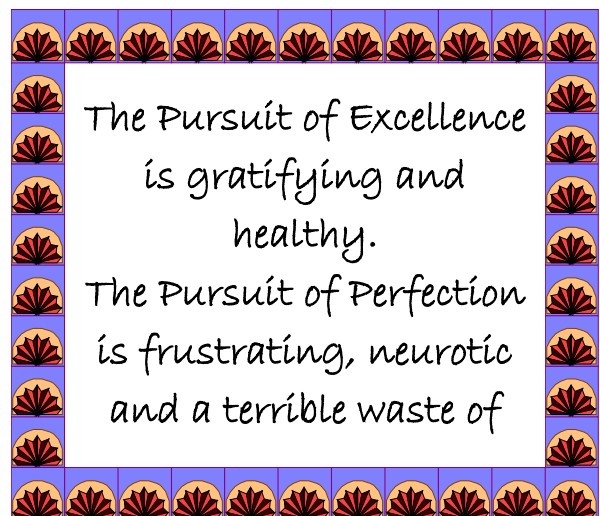
2013 Quilt Challenge Final Details

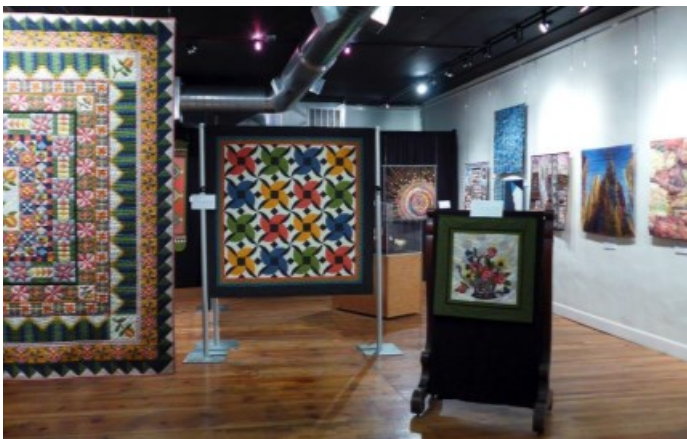
