Focus will be on the substance of education and a broad curriculum, more involvement for classroom teachers. Ofsted will consult on the introduction of a new judgement for 'quality of education'. This will replace the current 'outcomes for pupils' and 'teaching, learning and assessment' judgements with a broader, single judgement.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> personal development, behaviour and welfare <p>The 'personal development, welfare and behaviour' judgement in the current framework will be split into 2 distinct areas. This change recognises the difference between behaviour and discipline in schools, and pupils' wider personal development and their opportunities to grow as active, healthy and engaged citizens.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Behaviour and attitudes
