A warm hello from Israel, to our wonderful supporters and friends.

You have all been in our thoughts and we hope and pray that you and your loved ones are keeping safe, healthy and well.

What a time it has been... How could any of us ever have known, as we all wished each other a Happy New Year for 2020 just a short time ago, that this was what would be in store for us...

It has of course been devastating in so many ways, the tragic loss of life, the toll it has taken on healthcare systems and workers around the world, businesses, charities, all of us having no choice but to adapt to a new way of life. Yet, at the same time, I have thought what a marvel it is to see our beloved planet, nature and wildlife finally be given a rare chance to start to heal and flourish.

I pray so much that the world will take this as a lesson and a warning that things must change, things must somehow slow down and other things should just stop. Here in Israel the number of virus cases has been fairly high for such a small

country, but the death toll has stayed comparatively low. There is currently talk, as in other countries, about a slow easing of some restrictions and allowing some small businesses to reopen, but as yet, no schools or shopping malls etc. One of the saddest things has been the complete closure of the Israeli/Palestinian border crossings, meaning it has been impossible for us to enter the West Bank to hold our outreach clinics to help the hard working donkeys, mules and horses. My only hope is that, due to the lockdown in the West Bank, those animals are perhaps at least not having to work so hard. As yet, we do not know when the border closures might be eased but we are listening out for news.

In the meantime our little sanctuary continues, just about. We thank you with all our hearts, for the fact that despite this difficult world situation, you remember our work and continue to support us. Without you, our little sanctuary would no longer be here.

Our finances are such that by a miracle, we are just about managing to scrape through each month, but our running budget is still short by approximately £600/\$744/€686 per month. We actually have very few repeat monthly donations and the only reason that we have been able to continue is of course with thanks to those dear, kind people who do donate monthly or fairly regularly, or who make smaller one off donations. But it is also with profound thanks to those who have so kindly made generous one off donations, as these have actually ensured that our sanctuary has managed to remain open and running so far.

If you are still able to make any donation whatsoever, to help ena-

ble us to continue to run our sanctuary and feed our 52 animals, we would be so deeply thankful to you. Please just know that every little amount will help, no matter how much it is. We appreciate your love and your support to help us continue so very much.

I would like to leave you with a few adorable photos that were taken shortly before the lockdown began, when some little, local children came to the sanctuary to keep our dear old Esther and friends company.

Outreach in Ras Atira—March 2020

Shortly before the Covid-19 pandemic worsened, Lucy was able to hold a mobile clinic in the Palestinian town of Ras Atira, with the help of expert farrier, Hagai Ohana. Hagai had been told about the plight of the poor brown mule with the deformed hoof and kindly said he would trim the mule's hoof. While there, he also trimmed a lot of other working donkeys' hooves and a few horses'. Vet Dr Nour also joined to treat a few ailments and wounds and the owners were very pleased and quite grateful.





The tight restrictions relating to Covid-19 that were introduced shortly thereafter mean that the West Bank and border crossings are now completely closed off. Nobody can go in and nobody can go out, which means that Lucy is now not able to go in to try to give help to those poor hard working animals until those restrictions are lifted.












Outreach Work Support

Lucy recently took in to the sanctuary, dear old Arnold, bringing our rescued donkey family to 49. This poor donkey was terribly abused at a market after being left abandoned in torrential rain – he was found by youngsters who decided to torment him and stone him. It took Lucy a week or so to secure his rescue but he is now safe and content at Lucy's sanctu-

ary. He is so grateful to be there, despite the abuse he's suffered and the discomfort of his wounds and scars. He had also already been gelded so that, at least, has been a saving for us! He is actually a big teddy bear of a donkey and is extremely loving. He fitted in immediately with the herd and just gets along really well with everybody. The Fence

We recently bought 12 posts in an effort to try to somehow re-

inforce some of the existing field posts. The fence we have is what existed when we took the site on and it was already very old, worn, leaning fencing. Of course, over the past few years, with the donkeys leaning on it and using it to scratch themselves on, it has deteriorated. It now presents quite a precarious







situation and the biggest worry is the donkeys breaking out of the field and running amok or worse, disappearing or being stolen. To re-fence our whole field with any type of secure fencing, would be very expensive and totally unaffordable, so we are trying to temporarily fix what we can and enable it to endure the test of time a bit longer.




