The Toyohari Association was founded in 1959, and began as an association devoted to Japanese Meridian Therapy for blind students and practitioners. Today it includes both sighted and blind practitioners. In Japan, a post-graduate training is given through the highly organized, academic and hands-on clinical training of the senior members of the Association, utilizing the "Kozato-study method". The North American Branch (TANA) has developed a training program that follows the Tokyo based program.

Toyohari is a style of acupuncture that focuses on direct perception and treatment of the Qi.

The training:

- is theoretically simple yet technically sophisticated.
- is designed to increase the acupuncturist's ability to feel the flow of Qi and disruptions in the flow directly from sensitive palpation.
- assists the student in feeling the effect of the needle technique immediately as one is needling and to be able to decide the dose and the effectiveness.
- is quite unique. Our teaching methods accelerate the training process. You can advance quickly by learning skills that usually take many years of practice to develop.
- is a direct method of diagnosis and treatment of Qi that complements the rather more abstract ways of working with the patient's Qi.
- has great emphasis on pulse diagnosis, palpation skills and needle technique which requires individual feedback and coaching. Classes are kept rather small to be able to deliver this training most effectively.

Graduation from this entire program entitles the graduate to join the Toyohari Association through one of its North American branches and become a registered Toyohari practitioner. The principle purpose of the branches is to foster and improve clinical skills. They provide ongoing study opportunities through Branch study groups as well as study sessions with senior instructors in Japan, North America, Europe and Australasia.

Toyohari Japanese Meridian Therapy Training Program

Principle amongst the techniques used in the Toyohari system are:

Diagnosis:

Using the classical 4 Diagnoses yet focusing especially on pulse diagnosis and touch diagnosis.

Treatment:

- Very delicate supplementation technique
- Various draining techniques
- Harmonizing technique (Waho)
- "contact" needling techniques (Sanshin)
- Warming moxa (chinetsukyu), direct moxa (Okyu)
- Cupping (Kyukaku)
- Microbleeding (Shiraku)
- Specialized treatment of the neck and inguinal regions to relieve symptoms (Naso & Muno)
- Specialized use of the extraordinary vessels (Kikei)
- Specialized use of midday-midnight method (Shigo).



Training in skills:

Toyohari has a unique method of skill assessment and training called the Kozato method. In this method, the practitioner receives immediate feedback on the effects of their treatment. It is part of the principle of Toyohari that we learn in conjunction with each other.

Supplies (worth approx \$150):

Each attendee is given a box of silver needle, a gold plated teishin developed by Yanagishita sensei in Toyohari Association, Zn/Cu disks for Kikei, #30 gold needle for Shigo treatment. You will provide the rest of supplies on your own.

Graduates will :

- Considerably improve their pulse and tactile diagnostic and assessment skills.
- Develop a greater sense of qi sensitivity through applying the needling techniques of Toyohari.
- Learn a range of methods specifically aimed at relieving symptoms.
- Be able to join ongoing study groups through joining the Toyohari Association. There are local monthly study groups, National Seminars with teachers from Japan and opportunities to study in Japan.



Faculty:

The instructors for this program are all approved teachers by the Toyohari Association and have studied this system for many years in the US, Japan and Europe with teachers from Japan.

Branch study: During the course of program, the attendees can attend the local Branch meeting/study group to keep reviewing the course materials, and the annual Branch workshop held by TANA. A partial membership fee of \$75 included in the tuition qualifies attending those meetings that is good until February 2019 (\$150 a full year membership fee). Upon successfully completion of the Basic Program, the attendees will receive a full benefits of Toyohari membership such as attending the International Toyohari workshops in Europe, Australasia and Japan, and much more.
