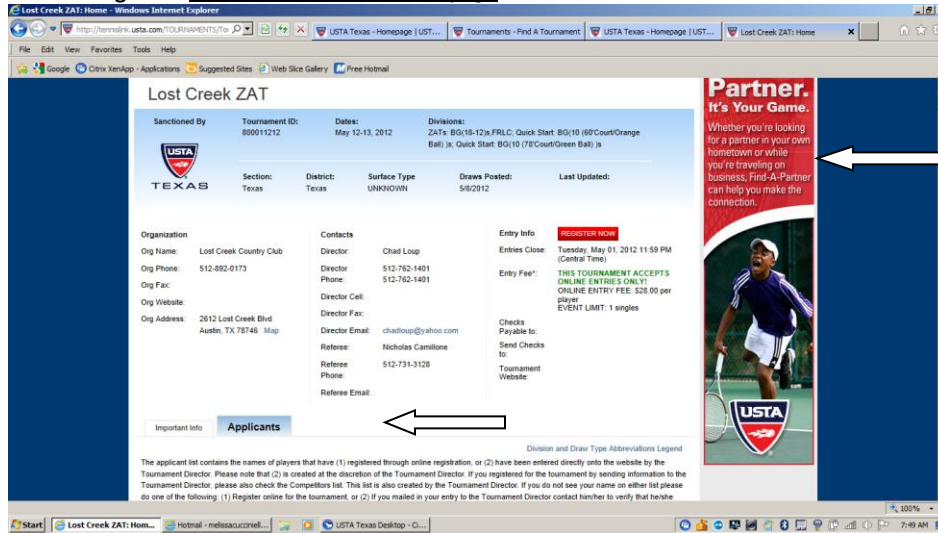


Information you need to know!

Please read on to learn the basics for getting started with junior tournament play.

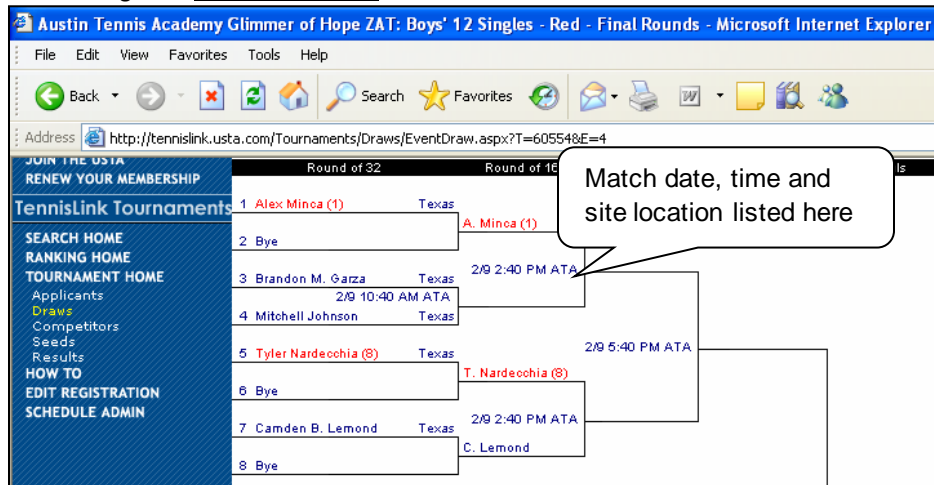
- 1) Once you have registered for your tournament, go back to the tournament homepage and click on "Applicants" (see a row) to ensure you are correctly registered for this tournament (may take up to one minute).

- 2) All draws are posted to the tournament homepage four days prior to the tournament starting. For Challengers, draws will be posted to the tournament homepage on Tuesday.

- 3) Review the draw to see your match date, time and site location. Site location names will be abbreviated – view the tournament homepage to see the full site location name and its address and/or directions and map. Regularly check the tournament homepage before and during the tournament for any updates from the tournament director.
- 4) Arrive to your matches early. There are penalties for lateness. If a player is less than 15 minutes late, there is a combination of loss of games and toss. If a player is more than 15 minutes late, the referee may default the player. Check in for every match and stay within close proximity to the tournament desk once checked in. Players cannot use cell phones or other electronic devices during matches, and players cannot communicate with parents or coaches during matches. If a player needs assistance (line call disputes, etc.), then the player needs to summon an official, not parents.
- 5) At the tournament, all players are guaranteed two matches played (a match where your opponent withdraws or defaults does not count as a match played). Match format varies based on the tournament. Both winner and loser should report to the tournament desk to provide match score and to receive next match time and location if applicable.
- 6) After the tournament, check your draw to confirm that your results are properly recorded.
