What is Demonstrated Interest?

Demonstrated Interest (DI) is the degree to which you show a college you are interested in attending. When schools assess applicants, they consider whether a student will convert – in other words, if that student would **accept** an offer to attend. If you showcase DI, you can make the school more confident in their decision to admit you.

<u>Is Demonstrated Interest Important?</u>

For schools that take DI into account, it's very important. If a school has two "equal" candidates side-by-side, DI can be the difference between acceptance and rejection.

All else equal, a school would rather offer admission to a student whom they are certain will accept and attend.

You can find out whether a school takes demonstrated interest into account by viewing the school's admissions information.
