 $\underline{\text{Form}} - \underline{\text{NT:5296}}$ ὑποτύπωσις **hupotuposis** (hoop-ot-oop'-o-sis); from a compound of $\underline{\text{NT:5259}}$ and a derivative of $\underline{\text{NT:5179}}$; typification under (after), i.e. (concretely) **a sketch** (figuratively) for imitation: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - form, pattern.

Typification – to have all or most of the characteristics of a particular type of person or thing and therefore be a suitable example of it *What picture are you drawing from...?*.

...and then, what picture are you drawing others to?

We should draw with pictures of...words...

Last Days

2 Timothy 3

¹This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come.

<u>Last</u> – <u>NT:2078</u> ἔσχατος **eschatos** (es'-khat-os); a superlative probably from <u>NT:2192</u> (in the sense of contiguity); farthest, final (of place or time):

KJV - ends of, last, latter end, lowest, uttermost.

Hebrews 1

² Hath in these **last days spoken unto us by his Son**, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds;

1 John 2

¹⁸ Little children, it is the **last time**: and as ye have heard that **antichrist shall come**, **even now** are there many antichrists; whereby we know that it is the last time.

1 Peter 1

¹⁹ But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:

²⁰ Who verily was **foreordained before the foundation of the world**, but was manifest in these last times for you,

²¹ Who by him do believe in God, that raised him up from the dead, and gave him glory; that your faith and hope might be in God.

Perilous – NT:5467 χαλεπός **chalepos** (khal-ep-os'); perhaps from NT:5465 through the idea of reducing the strength; difficult, i.e. dangerous, or (by implication) furious: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - fierce, perilous.

Come – NT:1764 ἐνίστημι **enistemi** (en-is'-tay-mee); from NT:1722 and NT:2476; to place on hand, i.e. (reflexively) impend, (participle) be instant: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - come, be at hand, present.

2 Peter 3

¹This second epistle, beloved, I now write unto you; in both which I **stir up your pure minds** by way of remembrance:

²That ye may be mindful of the words which were spoken before by the holy prophets, and of the commandment of us the apostles of the Lord and Saviour:

³ Knowing this first, that there shall come in the **last days** scoffers, walking after their own lusts,

⁴ And saying, Where is the promise of his coming? for since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of the creation.

⁵ For this they willingly are ignorant of, that by the word of God the heavens were of old, and the earth standing out of the water and in the water:

⁶ Whereby the world that then was, being overflowed with water, perished:

⁷But the heavens and the earth, which are now, by the same word are kept in store, reserved unto fire against the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men.

⁸But, beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day.

⁹ The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance.

Wickedness

Selfish and unthankful

2 Timothy 3

² For men shall be <u>lovers of their own selves</u>, <u>covetous</u>, <u>boasters</u>, <u>proud</u>, <u>blasphemers</u>, <u>disobedient</u> to <u>parents</u>, <u>unthankful</u>, <u>unholy</u>,

<u>Lovers of their own selves</u> – <u>NT:5367</u> ϕ ίλαυτος **philautos** (fil'-ow-tos); from <u>NT:5384</u> and <u>NT:846</u>; fond of self, i.e. selfish: **KJV** - lover of ownself.

Titus 1

⁸ But a lover of hospitality, a **lover of good men**, **sober**, **just**, **holy**, **temperate**;

<u>Covetous</u> – <u>NT:5366</u> φιλάργυρος **philarguros** (fil-ar'-goo-ros); from <u>NT:5384</u> and <u>NT:696</u>; fond of silver (money), i.e. avaricious: **KJV** - covetous. [Lover of money]

Boasters – NT:213 ἀλαζών **alazon** (al-ad-zone'); from **ale** (vagrancy); braggart: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - boaster.

Psalm 10

3 For **the wicked boasteth of his heart's desire**, and **blesseth the covetous**, whom the LORD abhorreth.

James 4

¹⁶ But now **ye rejoice in your boastings**: all **such rejoicing is evil**.

Proud – NT:5244 ὑπερήφανος **huperephanos** (hoop-er-ay'-fan-os); from NT:5228 and NT:5316; appearing above others (conspicuous), i.e. (figuratively) haughty: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - proud.

Blasphemers – NT:989 βλάσφημος **blasphemos** (blas'-fay-mos); from a derivative of NT:984 and NT:5345; scurrilious, i.e. calumnious (against men), or (specially) impious (against God): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - blasphemer (-mous), railing.

<u>Disobedient</u> – <u>NT:545</u> ἀπειθής **apeithes** (ap-i-thace'); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and NT:3982; unpersuadable, i.e. contumacious: **KJV** - disobedient.

Parents – NT:1118 γονεύς **goneus** (gon-yooce'); from the base of NT:1096; a parent: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - parent.

<u>Unthankful</u> – <u>NT:884</u> ἀχάριστος **acharistos** (ach-ar'-is-tos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of <u>NT:5483</u>; thankless, i.e. ungrateful: **KJV** - unthankful.

<u>Unholy</u> – <u>NT:462</u> ἀνόσιος **anosios** (an-os'-ee-os); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and NT:3741: *KJV* - unholy.

Wickedness (cont) Unnaturally Bad

2 Timothy 3

³Without natural affection, trucebreakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good,

<u>Without natural affection</u> – <u>NT:794</u> ἄστοργος **astorgos** (as'-tor-gos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of stergo (to cherish affectionately); hard-hearted towards kindred: **KJV** - without natural affection.

<u>Trucebreakers</u> – <u>NT:786</u> ἄσπονδος **aspondos** (as'-pon-dos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a derivative of <u>NT:4689</u>; literally, without libation (which usually accompanied a treaty), i.e. (by implication) truceless:

KJV - implacable, truce-breaker.

False accusers – NT:1228 διάβολος **diabolos** (dee-ab'-ol-os); from NT:1225; a traducer; specially, Satan [compare OT:7854]: **KJV** - false accuser, devil, slanderer.

Incontinent – NT:193 ἀκράτης **akrates** (ak-rat'-ace); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and NT:2904; powerless, i.e. without self-control: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - incontinent.

<u>Fierce</u> – <u>NT:434</u> ἀνήμερος **anemeros** (an-ay'-mer-os); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and hemeros (lame); savage: **KJV** - fierce.

Despisers of those that are good – NT:865 ἀφιλάγαθος **aphilagathos** (af-il-ag'-ath-os); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and NT:5358; hostile to virtue: **KJV** - despiser of those that are good.

Wickedness (cont) Pleasure seekers

2 Timothy 3

⁴ <u>Traitors, heady, highminded, lovers of pleasures</u> more [rather] than <u>lovers of God</u>;

<u>Traitors</u> – <u>NT:4273</u> προδότης **prodotes** (prod-ot'-ace); from <u>NT:4272</u> (in the sense of giving forward into another's [the enemy's] hands); a surrender: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - betrayer, traitor.

Heady – NT:4312 προπετής **propetes** (prop-et-ace'); from a compound of NT:4253 and NT:4098; falling forward, i.e. headlong (figuratively, precipitate): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - heady, rash [-ly].

<u>Highminded</u> – <u>NT:5187</u> Tυφόω **tuphoo** (toof-o'-o); from a derivative of <u>NT:5188</u>; to envelop with smoke, i.e. (figuratively) to inflate with self-conceit: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - high-minded, be lifted up with pride, be proud.

<u>Lovers of pleasures</u> – <u>NT:5369</u> ϕ ιλήδονος **philedonos** (fil-ay'-don-os); from <u>NT:5384</u> and <u>NT:2237</u>; fond of pleasure, i.e. voluptuous: *KJV* - lover of pleasure.

Lovers of God – NT:5377 Φιλόθεος **philotheos** (fil-oth'-eh-os); from NT:5384 and NT:2316; fond of God, i.e. pious: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - lover of God.

Wickedness (cont) Powerless

2 Timothy 3

⁵ Having [possessing] a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away. Form – NT:3446 μόρφωσις **morphosis** (mor'-fo-sis); from NT:3445; formation, i.e. (by implication) appearance (semblance or [concretely] formula): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - form. Godliness – NT:2150 εὐσέβεια **eusebeia** (yoo-seb'-i-ah); from NT:2152; piety; specially, the gospel scheme: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - godliness, holiness.

<u>Denying</u> – <u>NT:720</u> ἀρνέομαι **arneomai** (ar-neh'-om-ahee); perhaps from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and the middle voice of <u>NT:4483</u>; to contradict, i.e. disavow, reject, abnegate: **KJV** - deny, refuse.

Power – NT:1411 δύναμις **dunamis** (doo'-nam-is); from NT:1410; force (literally or figuratively); specially, miraculous power (usually by implication, a miracle itself): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - ability, abundance, meaning, might (-ily, -y, -y deed), (worker of) miracle (-s), power, strength, violence, mighty (wonderful) work.

<u>Turn away</u> – <u>NT:665</u> ἀποτρέπω **apotrepo** (ap-ot-rep'-o); from <u>NT:575</u> and the base of <u>NT:5157</u>; to deflect, i.e. (reflexively) avoid: **KJV** - turn away.

Wickedness (cont)

Creeps

2 Timothy 3

⁶ For of this sort are they which <u>creep</u> into houses, and <u>lead captive silly women laden</u> with sins, <u>led away</u> with divers <u>lusts</u>,

<u>Creep</u> – <u>NT:1744</u> ἐνδύνω **enduno** (en-doo'-no); from <u>NT:1772</u> and <u>NT:1416</u>; to sink (by implication, wrap [compare <u>NT:1746]</u>) on, i.e. (figuratively) sneak: **KJV** - creep. <u>Lead captive</u> – <u>NT:163</u> αἰχμαλωτίζω **aichmalotizo** (aheekh-mal-o-tid'-zo); from <u>NT:164</u>; to make captive: **KJV** - lead away captive, bring into captivity.

Silly women – NT:1133 γυναικάριον **gunaikarion** (goo-nahee-kar'-ee-on); a diminutive from NT:1135; a little (i.e. foolish) woman:

<u>Laden</u> – <u>NT:4987</u> σωρεύω **soreuo** (sore-yoo'-o); from another form of <u>NT:4673</u>; to pile up (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - heap, load.

<u>led away</u> – <u>NT:71</u> $\alpha'\gamma\omega$ **ago** (ag'-o); a primary verb; properly, to lead; by implication, to bring, drive, (reflexively) go, (specially) pass (time), or (figuratively) induce: **KJV** - be, bring (forth), carry, (let) go, keep, lead away, be open.

<u>Lusts</u> – NT:1939 ἐπιθυμία **epithumia** (ep-ee-thoo-mee'-ah); from NT:1937; a longing (especially for what is forbidden): **KJV** - concupiscence, desire, lust (after).

Wickedness (cont)

Learning ignorance

2 Timothy 3

⁷Ever [at all times, always] <u>learning</u>, and never [not even ever] able to come to the <u>knowledge</u> of the truth.

<u>Learning</u> – <u>NT:3129</u> μανθάνω **manthano** (man-than'-o); prolongation from a primary verb, another form of which, matheo, is used as an alternate in certain tenses; to learn (in any way): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - learn, understand.

<u>Knowledge</u> – <u>NT:1922</u> ἐπίγνωσις **epignosis** (ep-ig'-no-sis); from <u>NT:1921</u>; recognition, i.e. (by implication) full discernment, acknowledgement: **KJV** - (ac-) knowledge (-ing, -ment).

Reprobate

2 Timothy 3

⁸ Now as <u>Jannes and Jambres withstood</u> Moses, so do these also <u>resist</u> the truth: men of <u>corrupt minds</u>, reprobate concerning the faith.

Jannes and Jambres - both of Egyptian origin... Moses is of Hebrew origin...

Withstood – NT:436 ἀνθίστημι **anthistemi** (anth-is'-tay-mee); from NT:473 and NT:2476; to stand against, i.e. oppose: **KJV** - resist, withstand.

Resist – NT:436 ἀνθίστημι **anthistemi** (anth-is'-tay-mee); from NT:473 and NT:2476; to stand against, i.e. oppose: **KJV** - resist, withstand.

<u>Corrupt</u> – <u>NT:2704</u> καταφθείρω **katphtheiro** (kat-af-thi'-ro); from <u>NT:2596</u> and <u>NT:5351</u>; to spoil entirely, i.e. (literally) to destroy; or (figuratively) to deprave: **KJV** - corrupt, utterly perish.

<u>Minds</u> – <u>NT:3563</u> voûς **nous** (nooce); probably from the base of <u>NT:1097</u>; the intellect, i.e. mind (divine or human; in thought, feeling, or will); by implication meaning: **KJV** - mind, understanding. Compare NT:5590.

Reprobate – NT:96 ἀδόκιμος **adokimos** (ad-ok'-ee-mos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and NT:1384; unapproved, i.e. rejected; by implication, worthless (literally or morally): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - castaway, rejected, reprobate.

Romans 1

²⁸ And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, **God gave them over to a reprobate mind**, to do those things which are not <u>convenient</u>;

<u>Convenient</u> – <u>NT:2520</u> καθήκω **katheko** (kath-ay'-ko); from <u>NT:2596</u> and <u>NT:2240</u>); to reach to, i.e. (neuter of present active participle, figuratively as adjective) <u>becoming</u>: **KJV** - convenient, fit.

²⁹ Being filled with all unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, debate, deceit, malignity; whisperers,

³⁰ Backbiters, haters of God, despiteful, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents,

Without understanding, covenantbreakers, without natural affection, implacable, unmerciful:

³² Who knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them.

Wickedness (cont) Reprobate

2 Timothy 3

⁸ Now as <u>Jannes and Jambres withstood</u> Moses, so do these also <u>resist</u> the truth: men of <u>corrupt minds</u>, <u>reprobate</u> concerning the faith.

Jude 1

¹⁷ But, beloved, remember ye the words which were spoken before of the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ;

¹⁸ How that they told you there should be mockers in the last time, who should walk after their own ungodly lusts.

¹⁹ These be they who separate themselves, sensual, having not the Spirit.

2 Peter 2

¹² But these, as **natural brute beasts**, **<u>made</u> to be taken and destroyed**, **speak evil** of the things that **they understand not**; and **shall utterly perish** in **their own corruption**; $\underline{\text{Made}} - \underline{\text{NT:}1080}$ γεννάω **gennao** (ghen-nah'-o); from a variation of $\underline{\text{NT:}1085}$; to procreate (properly, of the father, but by extension of the mother); figuratively, to regenerate:

KJV - bear, beget, be born, bring forth, conceive, be delivered of, gender, make, spring.

Jude 1

¹⁰ But these speak evil of those things which they know not: but what they know naturally, as brute beasts, in those things they corrupt themselves.

Manifest

2 Timothy 3

⁹But they shall proceed no further: for their folly shall be manifest unto all men, as their's also was. Proceed – NT:4298 προκόπτω **prokopto** (prok-op'-to); from NT:4253 and NT:2875; to drive forward (as if by beating), i.e. (figuratively and intransitively) to advance (in amount, to grow; in time, to be well along): **KJV** - increase, proceed, profit, be far spent, wax. Folly – NT:454 ἄνοια **anoia** (an'-oy-ah); from a compound of NT:1 (as a negative particle) and NT:3563; stupidity; by implication, rage: **KJV** - folly, madness. Manifest – NT:1552 ἔκδηλος **ekdelos** (ek'-day-los); from NT:1537 and NT:1212; wholly evident: **KJV** - manifest.

1 John 2

¹⁹ They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would no doubt have continued with us: but they went out, that they might be made manifest that they were not all of us.

Deceived Deceiving

2 Timothy 3

¹³ But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived.

Evil – NT:4190 πονηρός **poneros** (pon-ay-ros'); from a derivative of NT:4192; hurtful, i.e. evil (properly, in effect or influence, and thus differing from NT:2556, which refers rather to essential character, as well as from NT:4550, which indicates degeneracy from original virtue); figuratively, calamitous; also (passively) ill, i.e. diseased; but especially (morally) culpable, i.e. derelict, vicious, facinorous; neuter (singular) mischief, malice, or (plural) guilt; masculine (singular) the devil, or (plural) sinners: KJV - bad, evil, grievous, harm, lewd, malicious, wicked (-ness). See also NT:4191. Seducers – NT:1114 yonc goes (go'-ace); from goao (to wail); properly, a wizard (as muttering spells), i.e. (by implication) an imposter: KJV - seducer. Wax – NT:4298 προκόπτω **prokopto** (prok-op'-to); from NT:4253 and NT:2875; to drive forward (as if by beating), i.e. (figuratively and intransitively) to advance (in amount, to grow; in time, to be well along): KJV - increase, proceed, profit, be far spent, wax. Deceiving – NT:4105 πλανάω **planao** (plan-ah'-o); from NT:4106; to (properly, cause to) roam (from safety, truth, or virtue): **KJV** - go astray, deceive, err, seduce, wander, be out of the way.

2 John 1

⁷ For many deceivers are entered into the world, who confess not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist.

Saints

Full knowledge

2 Timothy 3

10 But thou hast <u>fully known</u> my <u>doctrine</u>, <u>manner of life</u>, <u>purpose</u>, <u>faith</u>, <u>longsuffering</u>, <u>charity</u>, <u>patience</u>, <u>Fully known</u> – <u>NT:3877</u> παρακολουθέω **parakoloutheo** (par-ak-ol-oo-theh'-o); from <u>NT:3844</u> and <u>NT:190</u>; to follow near, i.e. (figuratively) attend (as a result), trace out, conform to: **KJV** - attain, follow, fully know, have understanding.

Doctrine – NT:1319 διδασκαλία **didaskalia** (did-as-kal-ee'-ah); from NT:1320; instruction (the function or the information): **KJV** - doctrine, learning, teaching.

Manner of life – NT:72 ἀγωγή **agoge** (ag-o-gay'); reduplicated from NT:71; a bringing up, i.e. mode of living: KJV - manner of life.

Purpose – NT:4286 πρόθεσις **prothesis** (proth'-es-is); from NT:4388; a setting forth, i.e. (figuratively) proposal (intention); specifically, the show-bread (in the Temple) as exposed before God: KJV - purpose, shew [-bread].

Faith – NT:4102 πίστις **pistis** (pis'-tis); from NT:3982; persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (of religious truth, or the truthfulness of God or a religious teacher), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation; abstractly, constancy in such profession; by extension, the system of religious (Gospel) truth itself: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - assurance, belief, believe, faith, fidelity.

<u>Longsuffering</u> – <u>NT:3115</u> μακροθυμία **makrothumia** (mak-roth-oo-mee'-ah); from the same as <u>NT:3116</u>; longanimity, i.e. (objectively) forbearance or (subjectively) fortitude: *KJV* - longsuffering, patience.

<u>Charity</u> – <u>NT:26</u> $\dot{\alpha}$ y $\dot{\alpha}$ $\pi\eta$ **agape** (ag-ah'-pay); from <u>NT:25</u>; love, i.e. affection or benevolence; specially (plural) a love-feast: **KJV** - (feast of) charity ([-ably]), dear, love.

Romans 12

¹⁰ Be kindly **affection**ed one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another; **Romans 1**

³¹ Without understanding, covenantbreakers, without natural **affection**, implacable, unmerciful:

Colossians 3

Patience – NT:5281 ὑπομονή **hupomone** (hoop-om-on-ay'); from NT:5278; cheerful (or hopeful) endurance, constancy:

KJV - enduring, patience, patient continuance (waiting).

² Set your **affection** on things above, not on things on the earth.

Saints (cont) Enduring

2 Timothy 3

¹¹ <u>Persecutions</u>, <u>afflictions</u>, which came unto me at Antioch, at Iconium, at Lystra; what persecutions I <u>endured</u>: but out of them all the Lord <u>delivered</u> me.

Persecutions – to be persued...pressed

Afflictions – NT:3804 πάθημα **pathema** (path'-ay-mah); from a presumed derivative of NT:3806; something undergone, i.e. hardship or pain; subjectively, an emotion or influence: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - affection, affliction, motion, suffering.

Endured – NT:5297 ὑποφέρω **hupophero** (hoop-of-er'-o); from NT:5259 and NT:5342; to bear from underneath, i.e. (figuratively) to undergo hardship: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - bear, endure.

<u>Delivered</u> – NT:4506 ρύομαι **rhoumai** (hroo'-om-ahee); middle voice of an obsolete verb, akin to NT:4482 (through the idea of a current; compare NT:4511); to rush or draw (for oneself), i.e. rescue: **KJV** - deliver (-er).

Matthew 10

²² And ye shall be hated of all men for my name's sake: but he that **endur**eth to the end shall be saved.

1 Corinthians 13

⁷ Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, **endureth all things**.

1 Peter 2

¹⁹ For this is thankworthy, if a man for conscience toward God **endur**e grief, suffering wrongfully.

Suffering

2 Timothy 3

¹² Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall <u>suffer persecution</u>.

Suffer persecution – NT:1377 διώκω **dioko** (dee-o'-ko); a prolonged (and causative) form of a primary verb dio (to flee; compare the base of NT:1169 and NT:1249); to pursue (literally or figuratively); by implication, to persecute:

KJV - ensue, follow (after), given to, (suffer) persecute (-ion), press forward.

Philippians 3

¹⁴ I **press** toward the **mark** for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.

Continuing

2 Timothy 3

¹⁴ But <u>continue</u> thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been <u>assured</u> of, knowing of whom thou hast learned [understood] them;

<u>Continue</u> – <u>NT:3306</u> μένω **meno** (men'-o); a primary verb; to stay (in a given place, state, relation or expectancy):

KJV - abide, continue, dwell, endure, be present, remain, stand, tarry (for), ^x thine own.

2 Timothy 3

¹⁵ And that from a child thou hast known the holy [sacred] scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation **through faith** which is **in** Christ Jesus.

Salvation – NT:4991 σωτηρία **soteria** (so-tay-ree'-ah); feminine of a derivative of NT:4990 as (properly, abstract) noun; rescue or safety (physically or morally): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - deliver, health, salvation, save, saving.

It is absolutely the faith of God that made salvation possible! ...man is not able to be wise on his own and thus incapable of achieving salvation on his own!

1 Peter 1 ... salvation

¹Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to the strangers scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia,

²Elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, through sanctification of the Spirit, unto obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ: Grace unto you, and peace, be multiplied.

³Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a **lively hope by the resurrection** of Jesus Christ from the dead,

⁴To an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you,

⁵ Who are **kept by the power of God through faith** unto salvation **ready to be revealed** in the **last time.**

Saints (cont) Profitable

2 Timothy 3

¹⁶ All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

Given by inspiration of God – NT:2315 θ εόπνευστος **theopneustos** (theh-op'-nyoo-stos); from NT:2316 and a presumed derivative of NT:4154; divinely breathed in: **KJV** - given by inspiration of God.

Profitable – NT:5624 ωφέλιμος **ophelimos** (o-fel'-ee-mos); from a form of NT:3786; helpful or serviceable, i.e. advantageous: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - profit (-able).

<u>Doctrine</u> – <u>NT:1319</u> διδασκαλία **didaskalia** (did-as-kal-ee'-ah); from <u>NT:1320</u>; instruction (the function or the information): **KJV** - doctrine, learning, teaching.

Reproof – NT:1648a ἐλεγμός **elegmos** (el-eng-mos'); from NT:1651; found only in 2 Tim 3:16: conviction (of a sinner), punishment, refutation of error, reproof.

Correction – NT:1882 ἐπανόρθωσις **epanorthosis** (ep-an-or'-tho-sis); from a compound of NT:1909 and NT:461; a straightening up again, i.e. (figuratively) rectification (reformation): **KJV** - correction.

Instruction – NT:3809 παιδεία **paideia** (pahee-di'-ah); from NT:3811; tutorage, i.e. education or training; by implication, disciplinary correction: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - chastening, chastisement, instruction, nurture.

Righteousness – NT:1343 δικαιοσύνη **dikaiosune** (dik-ah-yos-oo'-nay); from NT:1342; equity (of character or act); specially (Christian) justification: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - righteousness.

Hebrews 4

¹² For the **word** of **God** is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the **heart**.

Perfect

2 Timothy 3

¹⁷ That the man of God may be <u>perfect</u>, <u>thoroughly furnished</u> **unto all good works**.

Perfect – NT:739 ἄρτιος **artios** (ar'-tee-os); from NT:737; fresh, i.e. (by implication) complete: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - perfect.

Thoroughly furnished – NT:1822 ἐξαρτίζω **exartizo** (ex-ar-tid'-zo); from NT:1537 and a derivative of NT:739; to finish out (time); figuratively, to equip fully (a teacher): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - accomplish, thoroughly furnish.

¹⁶ Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your **good works**, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.

¹⁶ For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto **good works**, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.
