Faith Exercised

1 Thessalonians 2

²But even after that we had <u>suffered</u> before, and were <u>shamefully entreated</u>, as **ye know**, at Philippi, we were <u>bold</u> in our God to <u>speak</u> unto you the <u>gospel</u> of God with much <u>contention</u>.

<u>Suffered</u> – <u>NT:4310</u> προπάσχω **propascho** (prop-as'-kho); from <u>NT:4253</u> and <u>NT:3958</u>; to undergo hardship previously: **KJV** - suffer before.

Shamefully entreated – NT:5195 $\dot{\delta}$ βρίζω **hubrizo** (hoo-brid'-zo); from NT:5196; to exercise violence, i.e. abuse:

KJV - use despitefully, reproach [reproved and rebuked, scolded, criticized, censured] entreated [verbally]shamefully (spitefully).

Bold – NT:3955 παρρησιάζομαι **parrhesiazomai** (par-hray-see-ad'-zom-ahee); middle voice from NT:3954; to be frank in utterance, or confident in spirit and demeanor: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - be (wax) bold, (preach, speak) boldly.

<u>Speak</u> – <u>NT:2980</u> λαλέω **laleo** (lal-eh'-o); a prolonged form of an otherwise obsolete verb; to talk, i.e. utter words:

KJV - preach, say, speak (after), talk, tell, utter. Compare NT:3004.

Gospel – NT:2098 εὖαγγέλιον **euaggelion** (yoo-ang-ghel'-ee-on); from the same as NT:2097; a good message, i.e. the gospel: KJV - gospel.

<u>Contention</u> – <u>NT:73</u> $\dot{\alpha}\gamma\dot{\omega}\nu$ **agon** (ag-one'); from <u>NT:71</u>; properly, a <u>place of assembly</u> (as if led), i.e. (by implication) a contest (held there); figuratively, an <u>effort</u> or <u>anxiety</u>: **KJV** - conflict, contention, fight, race.

Faith Entering

1 Thessalonians 2

¹For yourselves, brethren, know our entrance in unto you, that it was not in vain

Entrance – NT:1529 εἴσοδος **eisodos** (ice'-od-os); from NT:1519 and NT:3598; an entrance (literally or figuratively): KJV - coming, enter (-ing) in (to).

...from – NT:3598 ὁδός **hodos** (hod-os'); apparently a primary word; a road; by implication a progress (the route, act or distance); figuratively, a mode or means: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - journey, (high-) way.

<u>Vain</u> – <u>NT:2756</u> κενός **kenos** (ken-os'); apparently a primary word; empty (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - empty, (in) vain.

Faith Exhorts

1 Thessalonians 2

³ For our <u>exhortation</u> was not of <u>deceit</u>, nor of <u>uncleanness</u>, nor in <u>guile</u>:

<u>Exhortation</u> – <u>NT:3874</u> παράκλησις **paraklesis** (par-ak'-lay-sis); from <u>NT:3870</u>; imploration, hortation, solace:

KJV - comfort, consolation, exhortation, intreaty.

...from – NT:3870 παρακαλέω **parakaleo** (par-ak-al-eh'-o); from NT:3844 and NT:2564; to call near, i.e. invite, invoke (by imploration, hortation or consolation):

KJV - beseech, call for, (be of good) comfort, desire, (give) exhort (-ation), intreat, pray.

Faith is Passionate

1 Thessalonians 2

¹⁷ But we, brethren, being taken from you for a short time in presence, not in <u>heart</u>, <u>endeavoured</u> the more <u>abundantly</u> to see your face with great <u>desire</u>.

Heart – NT:2588 καρδία **kardia** (kar-dee'-ah); prolonged from a primary kar (Latin, cor, "heart"); the heart, i.e. (figuratively) the thoughts or feelings (mind); also (by analogy) the middle: KJV - (+broken-) heart (-ed).

Endeavoured – NT:4704 σπουδάζω **spoudazo** (spoo-dad'-zo); from NT:4710; to use speed, i.e. to make effort, be prompt or earnest:

KJV - do (give) diligence, be diligent (forward), endeavour, labour, study.

<u>Abundantly</u> – <u>NT:4056</u> περισσοτέρως **perissoteros** (per-is-sot-er'-oce); adverb from <u>NT:4055</u>; more superabundantly:

 \pmb{KJV} - more abundant (-ly), X the more earnest, (more) exceedingly, more frequent, much more, the rather.

Desire – NT:1939 ἐπιθυμία **epithumia** (ep-ee-thoo-mee'-ah); from NT:1937; a longing (especially for what is forbidden): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - concupiscence, desire, lust (after).

Deceit – NT:4106 πλάνη **plane** (plan'-ay); feminine of NT:4108 (as abstractly); objectively, fraudulence; subjectively, a straying from orthodoxy or piety: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - deceit, to deceive, delusion, error.

...from – NT:4108 πλάνος **planos** (plan'-os); of uncertain affinity; roving (as a tramp), i.e. (by implication) an impostor or misleader; KJV - deceiver, seducing.

Faith is Unpretentious

1 Thessalonians 2

⁵ For neither at any time used we <u>flattering</u> words, as ye know, nor a <u>cloke</u> of <u>covetousness</u>; God is witness:

Flattering – NT:2850 κολακεία **kolakeia** (kol-ak-i'-ah); from a derivative of kolax (a fawner); flattery: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - X flattering.

Faith Pleasing

1 Thessalonians 2

⁴ But as we were <u>allowed</u> of God to be put in <u>trust</u> with the <u>gospel</u>, even so we speak; not as pleasing men, but God, which trieth our hearts.

<u>Allowed</u> – <u>NT:1381</u>δοκιμάζω **dokimazo** (dok-im-ad'-zo); from <u>NT:1384</u>; to test (literally or figuratively); by implication, to approve: **KJV** - allow, discern, examine, ^Xlike, (ap-) prove, try.

Trust – NT:4100 πιστεύω **pisteuo** (pist-yoo'-o); from NT:4102; to have faith (in, upon, or with respect to, a person or thing), i.e. credit; by implication, to entrust (especially one's spiritual well-being to Christ): **KJV** - believe (-r), commit (to trust), put in trust with.

Gospel – NT:2098 εὐαγγέλιον **euaggelion** (yoo-ang-ghel'-ee-on); from the same as NT:2097; a good message, i.e. the gospel: KJV - gospel.

Pleasing – NT:700 ἀρέσκω **aresko** (ar-es'-ko); probably from NT:142 (through the idea of exciting emotion); to be agreeable (or by implication, to seek to be so): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - please.

<u>Trieth</u> – <u>NT:1381</u>δοκιμάζω **dokimazo** (dok-im-ad'-zo); from <u>NT:1384</u>; to test (literally or figuratively); by implication, to approve: **KJV** - allow, discern, examine, ^X like, (ap-) prove, try.

Hearts – NT:2588 καρδία **kardia** (kar-dee'-ah); prolonged from a primary kar (Latin, cor, "heart"); the heart, i.e. (figuratively) the thoughts or feelings (mind); also (by analogy) the middle: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - (+broken-) heart (-ed).

<u>Cloke</u> – <u>NT:4392</u> πρόφασις **prophasis** (prof-as-is); from a compound of <u>NT:4253</u> and <u>NT:5316</u>; an outward showing, i.e. pretext: **KJV** - cloke, colour, pretence, show.

<u>Covetousness</u> – <u>NT:4124</u> πλενοεξία **pleonexia** (pleh-on-ex-ee'-ah); from <u>NT:4123</u>; avarice, i.e. (by implication) fraudulency, extortion: **KJV** - covetous (-ness) practices, greediness.

...from – <u>NT:4123</u> πλεονέκτης **pleonektes** (pleh-on-ek'-tace); from <u>NT:4119</u> and <u>NT:2192</u>; holding (desiring) more, i.e. eager for gain (avaricious, hence a defrauder):

Faith Exhorts (Cont)

1 Thessalonians 2

³ For our <u>exhortation</u> was not of <u>deceit</u>, nor of <u>uncleanness</u>, nor in <u>guile</u>:

<u>Uncleanness</u> – <u>NT:167</u> ἀκαθαρσία **akatharsia** (ak-ath-ar-see'-ah); from <u>NT:169</u>; impurity (the quality), physically or morally: **KJV** - uncleanness.

Guile – NT:1388 δόλος **dolos** (dol'-os); from an obsolete primary verb, **dello** (probably meant to decoy; compare NT:1185); a trick (bait), i.e. (figuratively) wile: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - craft, deceit, guile, subtilty.

Faith is nourishment

1 Thessalonians 2

⁷But we were gentle among you, even as a nurse cherisheth her children:

<u>Gentle</u> – <u>NT:3516</u> νήπιος **nepios** (nay'-pee-os); from an obsolete particle ne-(implying negation) and <u>NT:2031</u>; not speaking, i.e. an infant (minor); figuratively, a simple-minded person, an immature Christian: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - babe, child (+-ish).

<u>Nurse</u> – <u>NT:5162</u> τροφός **trophos** (trof-os'); from <u>NT:5142</u>; a nourisher, i.e. nurse: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - nurse.

<u>Cherisheth</u> – <u>NT:2282</u> θάλπω **thalpo** (thal'-po); probably akin to thallo (to warm); to brood, i.e. (figuratively) to foster [look after]: **KJV** - cherish.

Faithfully Comforting

1 Thessalonians 2

¹¹ As ye know [you are fully aware] how we <u>exhorted</u> and <u>comforted</u> and <u>charged</u> every one of you, as a father doth his children,

Exhorted – NT:3870 παρακαλέω **parakaleo** (par-ak-al-eh'-o); from NT:3844 and NT:2564; to call near, i.e. invite, invoke (by imploration, hortation or consolation):

KJV - beseech, call for, (be of good) comfort, desire, (give) exhort (-ation), intreat, pray.

Comforted – NT:3888 παραμυθέομαι **paramutheomai** (par-am-oo-theh'-om-ahee); from NT:3844 and the middle voice of a derivative of NT:3454; to relate near, i.e. (by implication) encourage, console: KJV - comfort.

<u>Charged</u> – <u>NT:3143</u> μαρτύρομαι **marturomai** (mar-too'-rom-ahee); middle voice from <u>NT:3144</u>; to be adduced as a witness, i.e. (figuratively) to obtest (in affirmation or exhortation): **KJV** - take to record, testify.

Faithfully Embracing

1 Thessalonians 2

⁸ So being <u>affectionately desirous</u> of you, we were <u>willing</u> to have <u>imparted</u> unto you, not the gospel of God only, but also our own souls, because ye were <u>dear</u> unto us.

<u>Affectionately desirous</u> – <u>NT:3655a</u> $\dot{\delta}$ μείρομαι **homeiromai** (hom-ir'-o-mahee); found only in <u>1 Thess 2:8</u>: to have a kindly feeling, to long for (someone), to yearn for.

 $\underline{\text{Willing}} - \underline{\text{NT:2106}}$ εὐδοκέω **eudokeo** (yoo-dok-eh'-o); from $\underline{\text{NT:2095}}$ and $\underline{\text{NT:1380}}$; to think well of, i.e. approve (an act); specially, to approbate (a person or thing):

KJV - think good, (be well) please (-d), be the good (have, take) pleasure, be willing.

Imparted – NT:3330 μεταδίδωμι **metadidomi** (met-ad-id'-o-mee); from NT:3326 and NT:1325; to give over, i.e. share: **KJV** - give, imparticiple

<u>Dear</u> – <u>NT:27</u> ἀγαπητός **agapetos** (ag-ap-ay-tos'); from <u>NT:25</u>; beloved: **KJV** - (dearly, well) beloved, dear.

Faith is Witnessed

1 Thessalonians 2

¹⁰ Ye are witnesses, and God also, how <u>holily</u> and <u>justly</u> and <u>unblameably</u> we <u>behaved</u> ourselves among you that <u>believe</u>:

Holily – NT:3743 δσίως **hosios** (hos-ee-oce'); adverb from NT:3741; piously: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - holily.

...from – NT:3741 Ő σ 10 ς **hosios** (hos'-ee-os); of uncertain affinity; properly, right (by intrinsic or divine character; thus distinguished from NT:1342, which refers rather to human statutes and relations; from NT:2413, which denotes formal consecration; and from NT:40, which relates to purity from defilement), i.e. hallowed (pious, sacred, sure):

KJV - holy, mercy, shalt be.

<u>Justly</u> – <u>NT:1346</u> δικαίως **dikaios** (dik-ah'-yoce); adverb from <u>NT:1342</u>; equitably:

KJV - justly, (to) righteously (-ness).

...from – NT:1342 δ íκαιος **dikaios** (dik'-ah-yos); from NT:1349; equitable (in character or act); by implication, innocent, holy (absolutely or relatively):

KJV - just, meet, right (-eous).

<u>Unblameably</u> – <u>NT:274</u> ἀμέμπτως **amemptos** (am-emp'-toce); adverb from <u>NT:273</u>; faultlessly: **KJV** - blameless, unblamably.

...from – NT:273 ἄμεμπτος **amemptos** (am'-emp-tos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a derivative of NT:3201; irreproachable:

KJV - blameless, faultless, unblamable.

Behaved – NT:1096 γίνομαι **ginomai** (ghin'-om-ahee); a prolongation and middle voice form of a primary verb; **to cause to be** ("gen"-erate), i.e. (reflexively) **to become** (come into being), used with great latitude (literal, figurative, intensive, etc.):

KJV - arise, be assembled, be (-come, -fall, -haveself), be brought (to pass), (be) come (to pass), continue, be divided, draw, be ended, fall, be finished, follow, be found, be fulfilled, +God forbid, grow, happen, have, be kept, be made, be married, be ordained to be, partake, pass, be performed, be published, require, seem, be showed, X soon as it was, sound, be taken, be turned, use, wax, will, would, be wrought.

Believe – NT:4100 πιστεύω **pisteuo** (pist-yoo'-o); from NT:4102; to have faith (in, upon, or with respect to, a person or thing), i.e. credit; by implication, to entrust (especially one's spiritual wellbeing to Christ):

KJV - believe (-r), commit (to trust), put in trust with.

Faithful Provision

1 Thessalonians 2

⁶ Nor of men sought we glory, neither of you, nor yet of others, when we might have been <u>burdensome</u>, as the apostles of Christ.

Burdensome – NT:922 βάρος **baros** (bar'-os); probably from the same as NT:939 (through the notion of going down; compare NT:899); weight; in the N. T. only figuratively, a load, abundance, authority: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - burden (-some), weight.

<u>Apostles</u> – <u>NT:652</u> ἀπόστολος **apostolos** (ap-os'-tol-os); from <u>NT:649</u>; a delegate; specially, an ambassador of the Gospel; officially a commissioner of Christ ["apostle"] (with miraculous powers): *KJV* - apostle, messenger, he that is sent.

1 Thessalonians 2

⁹ For ye <u>remember</u>, brethren, our <u>labour</u> and <u>travail</u>: for <u>labouring</u> night and day, because we would not be <u>chargeable</u> unto any of you, we preached unto you the gospel of God.

<u>Remember</u> – <u>NT:3421</u> μνημονεύω **mnemoneuo** (mnay-mon-yoo'-o); from a

Remember – NT:3421 μνημονεύω **mnemoneuo** (mnay-mon-yoo'-o); from a derivative of NT:3420; to exercise memory, i.e. recollect; by implication to punish; also to rehearse: **KJV** - make mention; be mindful, remember.

<u>Labour</u> – <u>NT:2873</u> κόπος **kopos** (kop'-os); from <u>NT:2875</u>; a cut, i.e. (by analogy) toil (as reducing the strength), literally or figuratively; by implication, pains: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - labour, + trouble, weariness.

<u>Travail</u> – <u>NT:3449</u> μόχθος **mochthos** (mokh'-thos); from the base of <u>NT:3425</u>; toil, i.e. (by implication) sadness: **KJV** - painfulness, travail.

<u>Labouring</u> – <u>NT:2038</u> ἐργάζομαι **ergazomai** (er-gad'-zom-ahee); middle voice from <u>NT:2041</u>; to toil (as a task, occupation, etc.), (by implication) effect, be engaged in or with, etc.: **KJV** - commit, do, labor for, minister about, trade (by), work.

<u>Chargeable</u> – <u>NT:1912</u> ἐπιβαρέω **epibareo** (ep-ee-bar-eh'-o); from <u>NT:1909</u> and <u>NT:916</u>; to be heavy upon, i.e. (pecuniarily) to be expensive to; figuratively, to be severe towards: **KJV** - be chargeable to, overcharge.

...from – NT:916 βαρέω **bareo** (bar-eh'-o); from NT:926; to weigh down (figuratively): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - burden, charge, heavy, press.

Faithful Followers

1 Thessalonians 2

¹⁴ For ye, brethren, became <u>followers</u> of the <u>churches</u> of God which in Judaea are in Christ Jesus: for ye also have suffered like things of your own countrymen, even as they have of the Jews:

<u>Followers</u> – <u>NT:3402</u> μιμητής **mimetes** (mim-ay-tace'); from <u>NT:3401</u>; an imitator: **KJV** - follower.

<u>Churches</u> – <u>NT:1577</u> ἐκκλησία **ekklesia** (ek-klay-see'-ah); from a compound of <u>NT:1537</u> and a derivative of <u>NT:2564</u>; a calling out, i.e. (concretely) a popular meeting, especially a religious congregation (Jewish synagogue, or Christian community of members on earth or saints in heaven or both): **KJV** - assembly, church.

<u>Suffered</u> – NT:3958 πάσχω **pascho** (pas'-kho); including the forms (patho (path'-o) and pentho (pen'-tho)), used only in certain tenses for it; apparently a primary verb; to experience a sensation or impression (usually painful):

KJV - feel, passion, suffer, vex.

<u>Countrymen</u> – <u>NT:4853</u> συμφυλέτης **sumphuletes** (soom-foo-let'-ace); from <u>NT:4862</u> and a derivative of <u>NT:5443</u>; a co-tribesman, i.e. native of the same country: **KJV** - countryman.

Faithful Persecuted

1 Thessalonians 2

¹⁵ Who both <u>killed</u> the Lord Jesus, and their own <u>prophets</u>, and have <u>persecuted</u> us; and they <u>please</u> not God, and are contrary to all men:

 $\underline{\text{Killed}} = \underline{\text{NT:615}}$ ἀποκτείνω **apokteino** (ap-ok-ti'-no); from $\underline{\text{NT:575}}$ and kteino (to slay); to kill outright; figuratively, to destroy: **KJV** - put to death, kill, slay.

Prophets – NT:4396 προφήτης **prophetes** (prof-ay'-tace); from a compound of NT:4253 and NT:5346; a foreteller ("prophet"); by analogy, an inspired speaker; by extension, a poet: **KJV** - prophet.

Persecuted – NT:1559 ἐκδιώκω **ekdioko** (ek-dee-o'-ko); from NT:1537 and NT:1377; to pursue out, i.e. expel or persecute implacably: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - persecute.

<u>Please</u> – <u>NT:700</u> ἀρέσκω **aresko** (ar-es'-ko); probably from <u>NT:142</u> (through the idea of exciting emotion); to be agreeable (or by impl, to seek to be so): **KJV** - please.

Contrary – NT:1727 ἐναντίος **enantios** (en-an-tee'-os); from NT:1725; opposite; figuratively, antagonistic: KJV - (over) against, contrary.

Faithfulness is not Forbidden

1 Thessalonians 2

Forbidding us to speak to the <u>Gentiles</u> that they might be <u>saved</u>, to <u>fill up</u> their sins always [at all times]: for the <u>wrath</u> is come upon them to the <u>uttermost</u>.

Forbidding – NT:2967 κωλύω **koluo** (ko-loo'-o); from the base of NT:2849; to estop, i.e. prevent (by word or act): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - forbid, hinder, keep from, let, not suffer, withstand.

<u>Gentiles</u> – <u>NT:1484</u> $\xi\theta\nu\sigma\zeta$ **ethnos** (eth'-nos); probably from <u>NT:1486</u>; a race (as of the same habit), i.e. a tribe; specially, a foreign (non-Jewish) one (usually by implication, pagan): **KJV** - Gentile, heathen, nation, people.

<u>Saved</u> – <u>NT:4982</u> $\sigma\omega\zeta\omega$ **sozo** (sode'-zo); from a primary sos (contraction for obsolete saoz, "safe"); to save, i.e. deliver or protect (literally or figuratively):

KJV - heal, preserve, save (self), do well, be (make) whole.

Fill up – NT:378 ἀναπληρόω **anapleroo** (an-ap-lay-ro'-o); from NT:303 and NT:4137; to complete; by implication, to occupy, supply; figuratively, to accomplish (by coincidence ot obedience): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - fill up, fulfill, occupy, supply.

<u>Wrath</u> – <u>NT:3709</u> ὀργή **orge** (or-gay'); from <u>NT:3713</u>; properly, desire (as a reaching forth or excitement of the mind), i.e. (by analogy,) violent passion (ire, or [justifiable] abhorrence); by implication punishment: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - anger, indignation, vengeance, wrath.

<u>Uttermost</u> – <u>NT:5056</u> τέλος **telos** (tel'-os); from a primary tello (to set out for a definite point or goal); properly, the point aimed at as a limit, i.e. (by implication) the conclusion of an act or state (termination [literally, figuratively or indefinitely], result [immediate, ultimate or prophetic], purpose); specifically, an impost or levy (as paid): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - + continual, custom, end (-ing), finally, uttermost.

Faithful hindered

1 Thessalonians 2

¹⁸ Wherefore we would have come unto you, even I Paul, once and again; but <u>Satan hindered</u> us. <u>Satan – NT:4567</u> Σατανᾶς **Satanas** (sat-an-as'); of Aramaic origin corresponding to <u>NT:4566</u> (with the definite affix); the accuser, i.e. the devil: **KJV** - Satan. <u>Hindered – NT:1465</u> ἐγκόπτω **egkopto** (eng-kop'-to); from <u>NT:1722</u> and <u>NT:2875</u>; to cut into, i.e. (figuratively) impede, detain: **KJV** - hinder, be tedious

Faithful Presence in the Congregation of the Faithful

1 Thessalonians 2

¹⁹ For what is our <u>hope</u>, or <u>joy</u>, or <u>crown</u> of <u>rejoicing</u>? Are not even ye in the <u>presence</u> of our Lord Jesus Christ at his coming?

Hope – NT:1680 ἐλπίς **elpis** (el-pece'); from a primary **elpo** (to anticipate, usually with pleasure); expectation (abstractly or concretely) or confidence: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - faith, hope. Joy – NT:5479 χαρά **chara** (khar-ah'); from NT:5463; cheerfulness, i.e. calm delight: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - gladness, X greatly, (X be exceeding) joy (-ful, -fully, -fulness, -ous).

<u>Crown</u> – <u>NT:4735</u> στέφανος **stephanos** (stef-an-os); from an apparently primary stepho (to twine or wreathe); a chaplet (as a badge of royalty, a prize in the public games or a symbol of honor generally; but more conspicuous and elaborate than the simple fillet, <u>NT:1238</u>), literally or figuratively: **KJV** - crown.

Rejoicing – NT:2746 καύχησις **kauchesis** (kow'-khay-sis); from NT:2744; boasting (properly, the act; by implication, the object), in a good or a bad sense: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - boasting, whereof I may glory, glorying, rejoicing.

Presence – NT:1715 ἔμπροσθεν **emprosthen** (em'-pros-then); from NT:1722 and NT:4314; in front of (in place [literally or figuratively] or time): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - against, at, before, (in presence, sight) of.

Faith Works

1 Thessalonians 2

¹³ For this cause also thank we God <u>without ceasing</u>, because, when ye <u>received</u> the Word of God which ye heard of us, ye received it not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which <u>effectually worketh</u> also in you that believe.

Without ceasing – NT:89 ἀδιαλείπτως **adialeiptos** (ad-ee-al-ipe'-toce); adverb from NT:88; uninteruptedly, i.e. without omission (on an appropriate occasion): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - without ceasing.

Received – NT:1209 δέχομαι **dechomai** (dekh'-om-ahee); middle voice of a primary verb; to receive (in various applications, literally or figuratively): **KJV** - accept, receive, take. Compare NT:2983.

Effectually worketh – NT:1754 ἐνεργέω **energeo** (en-erg-eh'-o); from NT:1756; to be active, efficient:

KJV - do, (be) effectual (fervent), be mighty in, shew forthself, work (effectually in).

Worthy – NT:516 ἀξίως **axios** (ax-ee'-oce); adverb from NT:514; appropriately: **KJV** - as becometh, after a godly sort, worthily (-thy).

<u>Called</u> – <u>NT:2564</u> καλέω **kaleo** (kal-eh'-o); akin to the base of <u>NT:2753</u>; to "call" (properly, aloud, but used in a variety of applications, dir. or otherwise): **KJV** - bid, call (forth), (whose, whose sur-) name (was [called]).

KJV - gladness, X greatly, (X be exceeding) joy (-ful, -fully, -fulness, -ous).
