<u>Faith</u> – <u>NT:4102</u> πίστις **pistis** (pis'-tis); from <u>NT:3982</u>; persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (of religious truth, or the truthfulness of God or a religious teacher), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation; abstractly, constancy in such profession; by extension, the system of religious (Gospel) truth itself:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - assurance, belief, believe, faith, fidelity.

Peace – NT:1515 εἰρήνη **eirene** (i-ray'-nay); probably from a primary verb eiro (to join); peace (literally or figuratively); by implication, prosperity: **KJV** - one, peace, quietness, rest, + set at one again.

God – NT:2316 θεός **theos** (theh'-os); of uncertain affinity; a deity, especially (with NT:3588) the supreme Divinity; figuratively, a magistrate; by Hebraism, very:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - X exceeding, God, god [-ly, -ward].

<u>Through</u> – <u>NT:1223</u>  $\delta\iota\acute{\alpha}$  **dia** (dee-ah'); a primary preposition denoting the channel of an act; through (in very wide applications, local, causal, or occasional): **KJV** - after, always, among, at, to avoid, because of (that), briefly, by, for (cause). fore, from, in, by occasion of, of, by reason of, for sake, that, thereby, therefore, <sup>X</sup> though, through (-out), to, wherefore, with (-in). In composition it retains the same general import.

Lord – NT:2962 κύριος **kurios** (koo'-ree-os); from kuros (supremacy); supreme in authority, i.e. (as noun) controller; by implication, Mr. (as a respectful title):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - God, Lord, master, Sir.

<u>Christ</u> – <u>NT:5547</u> Χριστός **Christos** (khris-tos'); from <u>NT:5548</u>; anointed, i.e. the Messiah, an epithet of Jesus: **KJV** - Christ.

...from – NT:4317 προσάγω **prosago** (pros-ag'-o); from NT:4314 and NT:71; to lead towards, i.e. (transitively) to conduct near (summon, present), or (intransitively) to approach:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - bring, draw near.

<u>Faith</u> – <u>NT:4102</u> πίστις **pistis** (pis'-tis); from <u>NT:3982</u>; persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (of religious truth, or the truthfulness of God or a religious teacher), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation; abstractly, constancy in such profession; by extension, the system of religious (Gospel) truth itself:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - assurance, belief, believe, faith, fidelity.

<u>Grace</u> – <u>NT:5485</u> χάρις **charis** (khar'-ece); from <u>NT:5463</u>; graciousness (as gratifying), of manner or act (abstract or concrete; literal, figurative or spiritual; especially the divine influence upon the heart, and its reflection in the life; including gratitude): **KJV** - acceptable, benefit, favour, gift, grace (-ious), joy, liberality, pleasure, thank (-s, -worthy).

<u>Stand</u> – <u>NT:2476</u> ίστημι **histemi** (his'-tay-mee); a prolonged form of a primary stao (stah'-o) (of the same meaning, and used for it in certain tenses); to stand (transitively or intransitively), used in various applications (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - abide, appoint, bring, continue, covenant, establish, hold up, lay, present, set (up), stanch, stand (by, forth, still, up). Compare <u>NT:5087</u>.

Rejoice – NT:2744 καυχάομαι **kauchaomai** (kow-khah'-om-ahee); from some (obsolete) base akin to that of aucheo (to boast) and NT:2172; to vaunt (in a good or a bad sense):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - (make) boast, glory, joy, rejoice.

...from – NT:2172 εὔχομαι **euchomai** (yoo'-khom-ahee); middle voice of a primary verb; to wish; by implication, to pray to God:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - pray, will, wish.

Hope – NT:1680 ἐλπίς **elpis** (el-pece'); from a primary **elpo** (to anticipate, usually with pleasure); expectation (abstractly or concretely) or confidence: KJV - faith, hope.

<u>Knowing</u> – <u>NT:1492</u> εἴδω **eido** (i'-do); a primary verb; used only in certain past tenses, the others being borrowed from the equivalent <u>NT:3700</u> and <u>NT:3708</u>; properly, to see (literally or figuratively); by implication (in the perf. only) to know: **KJV** - be aware, behold, <sup>X</sup> can (+not tell), consider, (have) know (-ledge), look (on), perceive, see, be sure, tell, understand, wish, wot. Compare NT:3700.

<u>Worketh</u> – <u>NT:2716</u> κατεργάζομαι **katergazomai** (kat-er-gad'-zom-ahee); from <u>NT:2596</u> and <u>NT:2038</u>; do work fully, i.e. accomplish; by implication, to finish, fashion: **KJV** - cause, to (deed), perform, work (out).

Patience – NT:5281 ὑπομονή **hupomone** (hoop-om-on-ay'); from NT:5278; cheerful (or hopeful) endurance, constancy:

KJV - enduring, patience, patient continuance (waiting).

Given – NT:1325 δίδωμι **didomi** (did'-o-mee); a prolonged form of a primary verb (which is used as an altern. in most of the tenses); to give (used in a very wide application, properly, or by implication, literally or figuratively; greatly modified by the connection):

**KJV** - adventure, bestow, bring forth, commit, deliver (up), give, grant, hinder, make, minister, number, offer, have power, put, receive, set, shew, smite (+with the hand), strike (+with the palm of the hand), suffer, take, utter, yield.

<u>Due time</u> – <u>NT:2540</u> καιρός **kairos** (kahee-ros'); of uncertain affinity; an occasion, i.e. set or proper time:

KJV -  $^{\chi}$  always, opportunity, (convenient, due) season, (due, short, while) time, a while. Compare NT:5550.

<u>Died</u> – <u>NT:599</u> ἀποθνήσκω **apothnesko** (ap-oth-nace'-ko); from <u>NT:575</u> and <u>NT:2348</u>; to die off (literally or figuratively):

KJV - be dead, death, die, lie a-dying, be slain (X with).

<u>Ungodly</u> – <u>NT:765</u> ἀσεβής **asebes** (as-eb-ace'); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of <u>NT:4576</u>; irreverant, i.e. (by extension) impious or wicked: **KJV** - ungodly (man).

<u>Scarcely</u> – <u>NT:3433</u> μόλις **molis** (mol'-is); probably by var. for <u>NT:3425</u>; with difficulty: **KJV** - hardly, scarce (-ly), \* with much work.

Righteous man – NT:1342 δίκαιος **dikaios** (dik'-ah-yos); from NT:1349; equitable (in character or act); by implication, innocent, holy (absolutely or relatively):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - just, meet, right (-eous).

Peradventure – NT:5029 Tάχα **tacha** (takh'-ah); as if neuter plural of NT:5036 (adverbially); shortly, i.e. (figuratively) possibly:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - peradventure (-haps).

Dare – NT:5111 Τολμάω **tolmao** (tol-mah'-o); from tolma (boldness; probably itself from the base of NT:5056 through the idea of extreme conduct); to venture (objectively or in act; while NT:2292 is rather subjective or in feeling); by implication, to be courageous: KJV - be bold, boldly, dare, durst.

<sup>8</sup> But God <u>commendeth</u> his love toward us, in that, while we were yet [still] <u>sinners</u>, <u>Christ died</u> for us. <u>Commendeth</u> – <u>NT:4921</u> συνιστάω **sunistao** (soon-is-tah'-o); or (strengthened) sunistano (soon-is-tan'- o); or **sunistemi** (soon-is'-tay-mee); from <u>NT:4862</u> and <u>NT:2476</u> (including its collat. forms); to set together, i.e. (by implication) to introduce (favorably), or (figuratively) to exhibit; intransitively, to stand near, or (figuratively) to constitute:

*KJV* - approve, commend, consist, make, stand (with).

<u>Sinners</u> – <u>NT:268</u> ἀμαρτωλός **hamartolos** (ham-ar-to-los'); from <u>NT:264</u>; sinful, i.e. a sinner: **KJV** - sinful, sinner.

...from – NT:264 άμαρτάνω **hamartano** (ham-ar-tan'-o); perhaps from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and the base of NT:3313; properly, to miss the mark (and so not share in the prize), i.e. (figuratively) to err, especially (morally) to sin:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - for your faults, offend, sin, trespass.

<u>Christ</u> – <u>NT:5547</u> Χριστός **Christos** (khris-tos'); from <u>NT:5548</u>; anointed, i.e. the Messiah, an epithet of Jesus: *KJV* - Christ.

<u>Died</u> – <u>NT:599</u> ἀποθνήσκω **apothnesko** (ap-oth-nace'-ko); from <u>NT:575</u> and <u>NT:2348</u>; to die off (literally or figuratively):

**KJV** - be dead, death, die, lie a-dying, be slain (X with).

# **Saved from Wrath**

# Romans 5

<sup>9</sup> Much more then [therefore], being now <u>justified</u> by his <u>blood</u>, we shall be <u>saved</u> from <u>wrath</u> through him.

<u>Justified</u> – NT:1344 δικαιόω **dikaioo** (dik-ah-yo'-o); from NT:1342; to render (i.e. show or regard as) just or innocent: **KJV** - free, justify (-ier), be righteous.

...from – NT:1342  $\delta$ íκαιος **dikaios** (dik'-ah-yos); from NT:1349; equitable (in character or act); by implication, innocent, holy (absolutely or relatively): **KJV** - just, meet, right (-eous).

Blood NT:129  $\alpha$ iµ $\alpha$  haima (hah'-ee-mah); of uncertain derivation; blood, literally (of men or animals), figuratively (the juice of grapes) or specially (the atoning blood of Christ); by implication bloodshed, also kindred:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - blood.

<u>Saved</u> – <u>NT:4982</u>  $\sigma\omega\zeta\omega$  (sode'-zo); from a primary sos (contraction for obsolete saoz, "safe"); to save, i.e. deliver or protect (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - heal, preserve, save (self), do well, be (make) whole.

<u>Wrath</u> – <u>NT:3709</u>  $\dot{o}\rho\gamma\dot{\eta}$  **orge** (or-gay'); from <u>NT:3713</u>; properly, desire (as a reaching forth or excitement of the mind), i.e. (by analogy,) violent passion (ire, or [justifiable] abhorrence); by implication punishment:

KJV - anger, indignation, vengeance, wrath.

...from – NT:3713 ὀρέγομαι **oregomai** (or-eg'-om-ahee); middle voice of apparently a prolonged form of an obsolete primary [compare NT:3735]; to stretch oneself, i.e. reach out after (long for): **KJV** - covet after, desire.

Enemies – NT:2190 ἐχθρός **echthros** (ech-thros'); from a primary echtho (to hate); hateful (passively, odious, or actively, hostile); usually as a noun, an adversary (especially Satan):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - enemy, foe.

Reconciled – NT:2644 Καταλλάσσω **katallasso** (kat-al-las'-so); from NT:2596 and NT:236; to change mutually, i.e. (figuratively) to compound a difference: **KJV** - reconcile.

...from – NT:236 ἀλλάσσω **allasso** (al-las'-so); from NT:243; to make different:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - change.

# **Hebrews 2**

<sup>17</sup> Wherefore in all things it **behoved him to be made like unto his brethren**, that he might be a **merciful and faithful high priest** in things pertaining to God, **to make reconciliation for the sins of the people.**

#### **Sanctification**

### Romans 5

<sup>11</sup> And not only so, but we also <u>joy</u> in God **through our Lord Jesus Christ**, by whom we have now <u>received</u> the <u>atonement</u>.

<u>Joy</u> – <u>NT:2744</u> καυχάομαι **kauchaomai** (kow-khah'-om-ahee); from some (obsolete) base akin to that of aucheo (to boast) and <u>NT:2172</u>; to vaunt (in a good or a bad sense): **KJV** - (make) boast, glory, joy, rejoice.

Received – NT:2983 λαμβάνω **lambano** (lam-ban'-o); a prolonged form of a primary verb, which is use only as an alternate in certain tenses; to take (in very many applications, literally and figuratively [properly objective or active, to get hold of; whereas NT:1209 is rather subjective or passive, to have offered to one; while NT:138 is more violent, to seize or remove]):

**KJV** - accept, + be amazed, assay, attain, bring, X when I call, catch, come on (X unto), + forget, have, hold, obtain, receive (X after), take (away, up).

<u>Atonement</u> – <u>NT:2643</u> καταλλαγή **katallage** (kat-al-lag-ay'); from <u>NT:2644</u>; exchange (figuratively, adjustment), i.e. restoration to (the divine) favor: **KJV** - atonement, reconciliation (-ing).

...from – NT:2644 καταλλάσσω **katallasso** (kat-al-las'-so); from NT:2596 and NT:236; to change mutually, i.e. (figuratively) to compound a difference: **KJV** - reconcile.

...from – NT:236 ἀλλάσσω **allasso** (al-las'-so); from NT:243; to make different: **KJV** - change.

70 times the word "atonement" is in the Holy Bible. 69 times in the Old Testament.

This is only Scripture where we find the word "atonement" in the New Testament.

#### 2 Thessalonians 2

<sup>13</sup> But we are bound to give thanks alway to God for you, brethren beloved of the Lord, because God hath from the beginning **chosen you to salvation through sanctification of the**Spirit and belief of the truth:

# 1 Corinthians 6

And such were some of you: but **ye are washed**, but **ye are sanctified**, but ye are **justified** in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God.

#### 1 Peter 1
