 $\underline{\text{Mind}} - \underline{\text{NT:1771}} \check{\epsilon} \nu \nu o \iota \alpha$ ennoia (en'-noy-ah); from a compound of $\underline{\text{NT:1722}}$ and $\underline{\text{NT:3563}}$; thoughtfulness, i.e. moral understanding: $\pmb{\textit{KJV}}$ - intent, mind.

<u>Ceased</u> – <u>NT:3973</u> παῦω **pauo** (pow'-o); a primary verb ("pause"); to stop (transitively or intransitively), i.e. restrain, quit, desist, come to an end: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - cease, leave, refrain.

<u>Ceased</u> – <u>NT:3973</u> π α $\hat{\mathbf{0}}\omega$ **pauo** (pow'-o); a primary verb ("pause"); to stop (transitively or intransitively), i.e. restrain, quit, desist, come to an end: **KJV** - cease, leave, refrain.

KJV - concupiscence, desire, lust (after).

Soberly – NT:4996 σωφρόνως **sophronos** (so-fron'-oce); adverb from NT:4998; with sound mind, i.e. moderately: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - soberly.

Philippians 1

²⁹ For unto you it is given in the behalf of Christ, not only to <u>believe</u> on Him, but also to suffer for His sake;

Believe – NT:4100 πιστεύω **pisteuo** (pist-yoo'-o); from NT:4102; to have faith (in, upon, or with respect to, a person or thing), i.e. credit; by implication, to entrust (especially one's spiritual well-being to Christ): **KJV** - believe (-r), commit (to trust), put in trust with.

<u>Suffer</u> – <u>NT:3958</u> πάσχω **pascho** (pas'-kho); including the forms (patho (path'-o) and pentho (pen'-tho)), used only in certain tenses for it; apparently a primary verb; to **experience a sensation or impression (usually painful**): **KJV** - feel, passion, suffer, vex.

Acts 9 Ananias shown that Paul must suffer

¹⁵ But the Lord said unto him, Go thy way: for he is a chosen vessel unto me, to bear my name before the Gentiles, and kings, and the children of Israel:

¹⁶ For I will shew him how great things he [Paul] must suffer for my name's sake.

¹⁷ And Ananias went his way, and entered into the house; and putting his hands on him said, Brother Saul, the Lord, even Jesus, that appeared unto thee in the way as thou camest, hath sent me, that thou mightest **receive thy sight**, and be **filled with the Holy Ghost**.

2 Timothy 2

¹² If we suffer, we shall also reign with him: if we deny him, he also will deny us:

2 Timothy 3

12 Yea, and **all that will live godly** in Christ Jesus **shall <u>suffer persecution</u>**. Suffer persecution – NT:1377 διώκω **dioko** (dee-o'-ko); a prolonged (and causative) form of a primary verb dio (to flee; compare the base of NT:1169 and NT:1249); to pursue (literally or figuratively); by implication, to persecute: **KJV** - ensue, follow (after), given to, (suffer) persecute (-ion), press forward.

Reasons for Suffering (cont)

The Will of God (cont)

Not the will of Gentiles

1 Peter 4

³ For the **time past** of our life may <u>suffice</u> us to have <u>wrought</u> the <u>will</u> of the Gentiles, when we walked in <u>lasciviousness</u>, <u>lusts</u>, <u>excess of wine</u>, <u>revellings</u>, <u>banquetings</u>, and <u>abominable idolatries</u>: <u>Suffice</u> – <u>NT:713</u> ἀρκετός **arketos** (ar-ket-os'); from <u>NT:714</u>; satisfactory: *KJV* - enough, suffice (-ient).

<u>Wrought</u> – <u>NT:2716</u> κατεργάζομαι **katergazomai** (kat-er-gad'-zom-ahee); from <u>NT:2596</u> and <u>NT:2038</u>; do <u>work fully</u>, i.e. accomplish; by implication, to finish, fashion: **KJV** - cause, to (deed), perform, work (out).

<u>Will</u> – <u>NT:1013</u> βούλημα **boulema** (boo'-lay-mah); from <u>NT:1014</u>; <u>a resolve [decisions, doggedness]</u>: **KJV** - purpose, will.

Ephesians 2

Wherein in **time past** ye **walked** according to the **course of this world**, according to the **prince of the power of the air**, the spirit that now worketh in the **children of disobedience**:

Among whom also **we all had our conversation** in **times past** in the **lusts of our flesh**, **fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind**; and were **by nature the children of wrath**, even **as others**.

Lasciviousness – NT:766 ἀσέλγεια **aselgeia** (as-elg'-i-a); from a compound of NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a presumed **selges** (of uncertain derivation, but apparently meaning continent); licentiousness [wastefulness, recklessness, decadence] (sometimes including other vices): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - filthy, lasciviousness, wantonness [immoral]. Lusts – NT:1939 ἐπιθυμία **epithumia** (ep-ee-thoo-mee'-ah); from NT:1937; a longing (especially for what is forbidden): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - concupiscence, desire, lust (after). Excess of wine – NT:3632 οἰνοφλυγία **oinophlugia** (oy-nof-loog-ee'-ah); from NT:3631 and a form of the base of NT:5397; an overflow (or surplus) of wine, i.e. vinolency - (drunkenness): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - excess of wine. Revellings – NT:2970 κῶμος **komos** (ko'-mos); from NT:2749; a carousal (as if letting loose): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - revelling, rioting.

Banquetings – NT:4224 πότος **potos** (pot'-os); from the alternate of NT:4095; a drinking-bout or carou'sal [noisy drunken feast]: **KJV** - banqueting.

Abominable – NT:111 ἀθέμιτος **athemitos** (ath-em'-ee-tos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a derivative of themis (statute; from the base of NT:5087); illegal; by implication, flagitious: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - abominable, unlawful thing.

<u>Idolatries</u> – <u>NT:1495</u> εἰδωλολατρεία **eidololatreia** (i-do-lol-at-ri'-ah); from <u>NT:1497</u> and <u>NT:2999</u>; <u>image-worship</u> (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - idolatry.

Reasons for Suffering (cont)

The Will of God (cont)

Not by pleasure of Gentiles

1 Peter 4

⁴ Wherein **they think it <u>strange</u> that ye run not with them** to the same **excess of riot**, speaking evil of you:

Strange – NT:3579 $\xi \epsilon \nu i \zeta \omega$ **xenizo** (xen-id'-zo); from NT:3581; to be a host (passively, a guest); by implication be (make, appear) strange: **KJV** - entertain, lodge, (think it) strange.

Ephesians 5

And be not drunk with wine, wherein is <u>excess</u>; but be filled with the Spirit; <u>Excess</u> – <u>NT:810</u> ἀσωτία **asotia** (as-o-tee'-ah); from a compound of <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of <u>NT:4982</u>; properly, unsavedness, i.e. (by implication) profligacy: **KJV** - excess, riot.

Not without controversy

1 Peter 4

⁵ Who shall **give account** to Him that is **ready to judge** the **quick and the dead**.

Acts 10

- ⁴⁰ Him God raised up the third day, and shewed him openly;
- ⁴¹ Not to all the people, but unto **witnesses chosen** before God, even to us, who did eat and drink with him after he rose from the dead.
- ⁴² And he **commanded us to preach** unto the people, and to **testify** that **it is He which was ordained of God to be the Judge of quick and dead**.
- ⁴³ To him give all the prophets witness, that through his name whosoever believeth in him shall receive remission of sins.

2 Timothy 4

- ¹ I **charge** thee therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, **who** shall judge the quick and the dead at his appearing and his kingdom;

1 Peter 4

⁶ For for this cause was the **gospel preached also to them that are dead**, that they might be **judged according to men in the flesh**, but **live according to God in the spirit**.

Ephesians 2

¹ And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins;

Colossians 2

¹³ And you, being **dead in your sins** and the **uncircumcision of your flesh**, hath **he quickened together with him**, having **forgiven you all trespasses**;

Not without our own vigilance

1 Peter 4

⁷ But the **end of all things is at hand**: be ye therefore **sober**, and **watch** unto prayer.

Sober – NT:4993 σωφρονέω **sophroneo** (so-fron-eh'-o); from NT:4998; to be of sound mind, i.e. sane, (figuratively) moderate:

KJV - be in right mind, be sober (minded), soberly.

<u>Watch</u> – <u>NT:3525</u> $\nu \dot{\eta} \phi \omega$ **nepho** (nay'-fo); of uncertain affinity: to abstain from wine (keep sober), i.e. (figuratively) be discreet [tactful, full of care, circumspect, cautious]: **KJV** - be sober, watch.

1 Thessalonians 5

⁵ Ye are all the **children of light**, and the **children of the day**: we are **not of the night**, nor of **darkness**.

⁶ Therefore **let us not sleep**, as do others; but let us **watch and be sober**.

<u>Watch</u> – <u>NT:1127</u> γρηγορεύω **gregoreuo** (gray-gor-yoo'-o); from <u>NT:1453</u>; to keep awake, i.e. watch (literally or figuratively): **KJV** -be vigilant, wake, (be) watchful ⁷ For **they that sleep sleep in the night**; and they that be **drunken** are **drunken in the night**.

⁸ But let us, who are of the day, **be sober**, putting on the breastplate of faith and love; and for an helmet, the hope of salvation.

<u>Watch</u> – <u>NT:3525</u> $\nu \dot{\eta} \dot{\varphi} \omega$ **nepho** (nay'-fo); of uncertain affinity: to abstain from wine (keep sober), i.e. (figuratively) be discreet [tactful, full of care, circumspect, cautious]:

KJV - be sober, watch.

⁹ For God hath not appointed us to wrath, but to obtain salvation by our Lord Jesus Christ,

Not without charity

1 Peter 4

⁸ And **above all things have fervent [intent]** <u>charity</u> among yourselves: for **charity** shall cover the multitude of sins.

Fervent Spirit
Fervent in Mind
Fervent in Labours
Fervent in Prayer (ἐκτενής - ektenes - with intent – without ceasing)

....and above all things have Fervent Charity

<u>Charity</u> – <u>NT:26</u> ἀγάπη **agape** (ag-ah'-pay); from <u>NT:25</u>; love, i.e. affection or benevolence; specially (plural) a love-feast: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - (feast of) charity ([-ably]), dear, love.

Not without hospitality

1 Peter 4

⁹ Use <u>hospitality</u> one to another without <u>grudging</u>.

Hospitality – NT:5382 φιλόξενος **philoxenos** (fil-ox'-en-os); from NT:5384 and NT:3581; fond of guests, i.e. hospitable: **KJV** - given to (lover of, use) hospitality.

Grudging – NT:1112 γογγυσμός **goggusmos** (gong-goos-mos'); from NT:1111; a grumbling: **KJV** - grudging, murmuring.

Romans 12

- ¹⁰ Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another;
- ¹¹ Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord;
- ¹²Rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer;
- ¹³Distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality.
- ¹⁴ Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not.

Response of Suffering

Your Calling Not without grace

1 Peter 4

¹⁰ As every man hath <u>received</u> the gift, even so <u>minister</u> the same one to another, as good <u>stewards</u> of the manifold grace of God.

Received – NT:2983 λαμβάνω **lambano** (lam-ban'-o); a prolonged form of a primary verb, which is use only as an alternate in certain tenses; to take (in very many applications, literally and figuratively [properly objective or active, to get hold of; whereas NT:1209 is rather subjective or passive, to have **offered to one**; while NT:138 is more violent, to seize or remove]):

KJV - accept, + be amazed, assay, attain, bring, *when I call, catch, come on (X unto), + forget, have, hold, obtain, receive (X after), take (away, up).

Minister – NT:1247 διακονέω **diakoneo** (dee-ak-on-eh'-o); from NT:1249; to be an attendant, i.e. wait upon (menially or as a host, friend, or [figuratively] teacher); techn. to act as a Christian deacon:

KJV - (ad-) minister (unto), serve, use the office of a deacon.

<u>Stewards</u> – <u>NT:3623</u> οἶκονόμος **oikonomos** (oy-kon-om'-os); from <u>NT:3624</u> and the base of <u>NT:3551</u>; a house-distributor (i.e. manager), or overseer, i.e. an employee in that capacity; by extension, a fiscal agent (treasurer); figuratively, a preacher (of the Gospel): KJV - chamberlain, governor, steward.

Manifold grace of God - The character of God's grace manifest in many ways!

Not without ability

1 Peter 4

¹¹ If any man speak, let him **speak as the <u>oracles</u> of God**; if any man minister, let him do it as of the **ability which God giveth**: that **God in all things may be glorified** through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

Oracle – NT:3051 λόγιον **logion** (log'-ee-on); neuter of NT:3052; an utterance (of God): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - oracle.

<u>Ability</u> – <u>NT:2479</u> ἰσχύς **ischus** (is-khoos'); from a derivative of is (force; compare eschon, a form of <u>NT:2192</u>); forcefulness (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - ability, might ([-ily]), power, strength.

Hebrews 5

¹² For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which be the first principles of the **oracles** of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat.

Not without company

1 Peter 4

¹² Beloved, **think it not strange** concerning the **fiery trial** which is to try you, **as though some strange thing happened unto you:**

Not without Glorifying God

1 Peter 4

¹³ But **rejoice**, inasmuch as ye are **partakers of Christ's sufferings**; that, when **his glory shall be revealed**, ye may be **glad also with exceeding joy**.

Coworkers and participants in all that Christ is which includes being a participant in all that Christ suffered.....

Future

Isaiah 40

⁵ And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together: for the mouth of the LORD hath spoken it.

Present

Romans 8

¹⁸ For I reckon that the **sufferings of this present time** are **not worthy to be compared** with the **glory which shall be revealed in us**.

Reinforcement of Suffering

Your Calling

Not without reproach

1 Peter 4

14 If ye be <u>reproached</u> for the name of Christ, <u>happy</u> are ye; for the Spirit of glory and of God resteth upon you: On their part He is evil spoken of, but On your part He is glorified.

Reproached – <u>NT:3679</u> ὀνειδίζω oneidizo (on-i-did'-zo); from <u>NT:3681</u>; to defame, i.e. rail at, chide, taunt: **KJV** - cast in teeth, (suffer) reproach, revile, upbraid.

<u>Happy</u> – <u>NT:3107</u> μακάριος makarios (mak-ar'-ee-os); a prolonged form of the poetical makar (meaning the same); supremely blest; by extension, fortunate, well off:

Psalm 74

KJV - blessed, happy (X -ier).

¹⁰ O God, how long shall the adversary **reproach**? shall the enemy blaspheme thy **name** for ever?

Luke 6

²² <u>Blessed</u> are ye, when men shall hate you, and when they shall separate you from their company, and shall **reproach** you, and cast out your **name** as evil, for the Son of man's sake.

Blessed – NT:3107 μακάριος **makarios** (mak-ar'-ee-os); a prolonged form of the poetical makar (meaning the same); <u>supremely blest</u>; by extension, <u>fortunate</u>, <u>well off:</u> **KJV** - blessed, happy (X -ier).

Not without blamelessness

1 Peter 4

¹⁵ But **let none of you** suffer as a **murderer**, or as a **thief**, or as an **evildoer**, or as a **busybody** in other men's matters [meddler].

1 Peter 4

Yet if any man suffer as a <u>Christian</u>, let him not be <u>ashamed</u>; but let him <u>glorify</u> God on this behalf.
<u>Christian</u> – <u>NT:5546</u> Χριστιανός **Christianos** (khris-tee-an-os'); from <u>NT:5547</u>; a
Christian, i.e. follower of Christ: *KJV* - Christian.
<u>Ashamed</u> – <u>NT:153</u> αἰσχύνομαι **aischunomai** (ahee-skhoo'-nom-ahee); from **aischos**

Ashamed – NT:153 αισχυνομαι **aischunomai** (ahee-skhoo'-nom-ahee); from **aischos** (disfigurement, i.e. disgrace); to feel shame (for oneself): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - be ashamed. Glorify – NT:1392 δοξάζω **doxazo** (dox-ad'-zo); from NT:1391; to render (or esteem) glorious (in a wide application):

KJV - (make) glorify (-ious), full of (have) glory, honour, magnify.

2 Timothy 1

¹² For the which **cause** I also **suffer** these things: nevertheless **I am not ashamed**: for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day.

(See also Rom 1:16 I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ! ...)

Reinforcement of Suffering (cont)

Not without innocence

1 Peter 4

¹⁷ For the time is come that **judgment must begin at the house of God**: and if it first

begin at us, what shall the end be of them that obey not the gospel of God?

<u>Judgment</u> – <u>NT:2917</u> κρίμα **krima** (kree'-mah); from <u>NT:2919</u>; a <u>decision</u> (the function or the effect, for or against ["crime"]):

KJV - avenge, condemned, condemnation, damnation, + go to law, judgment.

what shall the end be - How much worse must it be for the wicked!

Obey not – NT:544 ἀπειθέω **apeitheo** (ap-i-theh'-o); from NT:545; to disbelieve (wilfully and perversely): KJV - not believe, disobedient, obey not, unbelieving.

1 Timothy 3

¹⁵ But if I tarry long, that thou mayest **know how thou oughtest to behave** thyself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth.

Not without Godliness

1 Peter 4

¹⁸ And if the <u>righteous</u> <u>scarcely</u> be saved, where shall the <u>ungodly</u> and the sinner appear?

Righteous – NT:1342 δίκαιος **dikaios** (dik'-ah-yos); from NT:1349; equitable (in character or act); by implication, innocent, holy (absolutely or relatively): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - just, meet, right (-eous).

Scarcely – NT:3433 μόλις **molis** (mol'-is); probably by var. for NT:3425; with difficulty: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - hardly, scarce (-ly), + with much work.

<u>Appear</u> – <u>NT:5316</u> φαίνω **phaino** (fah'-ee-no); prolongation for the base of <u>NT:5457</u>; to lighten (shine), i.e. show (transitive or intransitive, literal or figurative): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - appear, seem, be seen, shine, $^{\textbf{X}}$ think.

<u>Ungodly</u> – <u>NT:765</u> ἀσεβής **asebes** (as-eb-ace'); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of <u>NT:4576</u>; irreverant, i.e. (by extension) impious or wicked: **KJV** - ungodly (man).

Not without Godliness (cont)

Matthew 19

²² But when the young man heard that saying, he went away sorrowful: for he had great possessions.

²³ Then said Jesus unto his disciples, Verily I say unto you, That a rich man shall hardly enter into the kingdom of heaven.

²⁴ And again I say unto you, It is **easier for a camel** to go through **the eye of a needle**, than for a **rich man to enter** into the kingdom of God.

James 1

¹¹ For the sun is no sooner risen with a burning heat, but it withereth the grass, and the flower thereof falleth, and the grace of the fashion of it perisheth: so also shall **the rich man fade away in his ways.**

1 Timothy 6

⁵ Perverse disputings of men of corrupt minds, and destitute of the truth, supposing that gain is godliness: from such withdraw thyself.

2 Timothy 3

⁵ Having a **form of godliness**, but **denying the power** thereof: **from such turn away**.

⁶ But godliness with contentment is great gain.

<u>Charity</u> – <u>NT:26</u> ἀγάπη **agape** (ag-ah'-pay); from <u>NT:25</u>; love, i.e. affection or benevolence; specially (plural) a love-feast:

KJV - (feast of) charity ([-ably]), dear, love.

Godliness leads us always to LOVE

Reinforcement of Suffering (cont)

The Will of God

Not without doing all things as unto the LORD

1 Peter 4

¹⁹ Wherefore [so too] let them that <u>suffer</u> according to the will of God <u>commit the</u> keeping of their souls to him in well doing, as unto a <u>faithful Creator</u>.

<u>Suffer</u> – <u>NT:3958</u> πάσχω **pascho** (pas'-kho); including the forms (patho (path'-o) and pentho (pen'-tho)), used only in certain tenses for it; apparently a primary verb; to experience a sensation or impression (usually painful):

KJV - feel, passion, suffer, vex.

Commit the keeping – NT:3908 παρατίθημι **paratithemi** (par-at-ith'-ay-mee); from NT:3844 and NT:5087; to place alongside, i.e. present (food, truth); by implication, to deposit (as a trust or for protection):

KJV - allege, commend, commit (the keeping of), put forth, set before.

Souls – NT:5590 ψυχή **psuche** (psoo-khay'); from NT:5594; breath, i.e. (by implication) spirit, abstractly or concretely (the animal sentient principle only; thus distinguished on the one hand from NT:4151, which is the rational and immortal soul; and on the other from NT:2222, which is mere vitality, even of plants: these terms thus exactly correspond respectively to the Hebrew OT:5315, OT:7307 and OT:2416):

KJV - heart (+-ily), life, mind, soul, +us, +you.

Well doing – NT:16 ἀγαθοποιΐα **agathopolia** (ag-ath-op-oy-ee'-ah); from NT:17; well-doing, i.e. virtue: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - well-doing.

<u>Faithful</u> – <u>NT:4103</u> π ιστός **pistos** (pis-tos'); from <u>NT:3982</u>; objectively, trustworthy; subjectively, trustful: **KJV** - believe (-ing, -r), faithful (-ly), sure, true.

<u>Creator</u> – <u>NT:2939</u> ΚΤΙ σ τής **ktistes** (ktis-tace'); from <u>NT:2936</u>; a founder, i.e. God (as author of all things): **KJV** - Creator.

Our souls are saved by the earnest deposit of the Holy Spirit woven into the fabric of our spiritual being thus keeping of our souls from death...the second death.

We should commit to the Holy Spirit who keeps our souls from death...

The only way the Scriptures tells us that we do that is be DOING GOOD... even as we should do directly unto the ONE and ONLY Creator our God who is author of ALL THINGS.

1 Peter 4 (cont)

I fear we misuse this Scripture so often as some assume that we do things for others and for ourselves like we would do them for the LORD and it is sufficient...
