### Reconciliation

### **Hebrews 2**

<sup>17</sup> Wherefore in all things it <u>behoved</u> him to be made <u>like</u> unto his brethren, that he might be a <u>merciful</u> and <u>faithful</u> <u>high priest</u> in things pertaining to God, to make <u>reconciliation</u> for the sins of the <u>people</u>.

Behoved – NT:3784 ὀφείλω **opheilo** (of-i'-lo); or (in certain tenses) its prolonged form opheileo (of-i-leh'-o); probably from the base of NT:3786 (through the idea of accruing); to owe (pecuniarily); figuratively, to be under obligation (ought, must, should); morally, to fail in duty:

**KJV** - behove, be bound, (be) debt (-or), (be) due (-ty), be guilty (indebted), (must) need (-s), ought, owe, should. See also NT:3785.

<u>Like</u> – <u>NT:3666</u> δμοιόω **homoioo** (hom-oy-o'-o); from <u>NT:3664</u>; to assimilate, i.e. compare; passively, to become <u>similar</u>:

*KJV* - be (make) like, (in the) liken (-ess), resemble.

Merciful – NT:1655 ἐλεήμων **eleemon** (el-eh-ay'-mone); from NT:1653; compassionate (actively): **KJV** - merciful.

<u>Faithful</u> – <u>NT:4103</u>  $\pi$ ιστός **pistos** (pis-tos'); from <u>NT:3982</u>; objectively, trustworthy; subjectively, trustful: **KJV** - believe (-ing, -r), faithful (-ly), sure, true.

...from – NT:3982  $\pi\epsilon i\theta\omega$  **peitho** (pi'-tho); a primary verb; to convince (by argument, true or false); by analogy, to pacify or conciliate (by other fair means); reflexively or passively, to assent (to evidence or authority), to rely (by inward certainty):

**KJV** - agree, assure, believe, have confidence, be (wax) confident, make friend, obey, persuade, trust, yield.

High priest – ΝΤ:749 ἀρχιερεύς **archiereus** (ar-khee-er-yuce'); from NT:746 and NT:2409; the high-priest (literally, of the Jews, typically, Christ); by extension a chief priest:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - chief (high) priest, chief of the priests.

## **Reconciliation** (cont)

### **Hebrews 2**

<sup>17</sup> Wherefore in all things it <u>behoved</u> him to be made <u>like</u> unto his brethren, that he might be a <u>merciful</u> and <u>faithful</u> <u>high priest</u> in things pertaining to God, to make <u>reconciliation</u> for the sins of the <u>people</u>.

Reconciliation – NT:2433 ίλάσκομαι **hilaskomai** (hil-as'-kom-ahee); middle voice from the same as NT:2436; to conciliate, i.e. (transitively) to atone for (sin), or (intransitively) be propitious:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - be merciful, make reconciliation for.

...from – NT:2436 ἴλεως **hileos** (hil'-eh-oce); perhaps from the alternate form of NT:138; cheerful (as attractive), i.e. propitious; adverbially (by Hebraism) God be gracious!, i.e. (in averting some calamity) far be it:

**KJV** -be it far, merciful.

#### Romans 5

<sup>10</sup> For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by his life.

### 2 Corinthians 5

<sup>18</sup> And all things are of God, who hath **reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ**, and hath given to us the **ministry of reconciliation**;

#### 2 Corinthians 5

<sup>19</sup> To wit, that **God was in Christ**, reconciling the world unto Himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath **committed unto us** the **word of reconciliation**.

People – NT:2992 λαός **laos** (lah-os'); apparently a primary word; **a people** (in general; thus differing from NT:1218, which denotes **one's own** populace):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - people.

## 2 Corinthians 5 ... His own people

<sup>20</sup> Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God.

## **Reconciliation** (cont)

### **Hebrews 2**

<sup>17</sup> Wherefore in all things it <u>behoved</u> him to be made <u>like</u> unto his brethren, that he might be a <u>merciful</u> and <u>faithful</u> <u>high priest</u> in things pertaining to God, to make <u>reconciliation</u> for the sins of the <u>people</u>.

<u>More earnest</u> – <u>NT:4056</u> περισσοτέρως **perissoteros** (per-is-sot-er'-oce); adverb from <u>NT:4055</u>; more superabundantly:

**KJV** - more abundant (-ly), <sup>X</sup> the more earnest, (more) exceedingly, more frequent, much more, the rather.

<u>Heed</u> – <u>NT:4337</u> προσέχω **prosecho** (pros-ekh'-o); from <u>NT:4314</u> and <u>NT:2192</u>; (figuratively) to hold the mind (<u>NT:3563</u> implied) towards, i.e. pay attention to, be cautious about, apply oneself to, adhere to:

**KJV** - (give) attend (-ance, -ance at, -ance to, unto), beware, be given to, give (take) heed (to unto); have regard.

### Romans 10

And how shall they preach, except they be sent? as it is written, How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things!

### **Ephesians 6**

<sup>15</sup> And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace;

### 1 Timothy 4

<sup>16</sup> Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee.

### Titus 1

14 Not giving heed to Jewish fables, and commandments of men, that turn from the truth.

<u>Lest at any time</u> – <u>NT:3379</u> μήποτε **mepote** (may'-pot-eh); or **me pote** (may pot'-eh); from <u>NT:3361</u> and <u>NT:4218</u>; not ever; also if (or lest) ever (or perhaps): **KJV** - if peradventure, lest (at any time, haply), not at all, whether or not.

<u>Slip</u> – <u>NT:3901</u> παραρρυέω **pararrhueo** (par-ar-hroo-eh'-o); from <u>NT:3844</u> and the alternate of <u>NT:4482</u>; to flow by, i.e. (figuratively) carelessly pass (miss): **KJV** - let slip.

### Psalm 94

<sup>18</sup> When I said, My foot slippeth; thy mercy, O LORD, held me up.

### Psalm 17

<sup>5</sup> Hold up my goings in thy paths, that my footsteps slip not.

### Psalm 73

<sup>1</sup>Truly **God is good** to Israel, even **to such as are of a clean heart**.

### Psalm 35

<sup>6</sup> Let their way be dark and slippery: and let the angel of the LORD persecute them.

#### 2 Peter 3

### **Hebrews 2**

<sup>2</sup> For if the <u>word spoken</u> by angels was <u>stedfast</u>, and every <u>transgression</u> and <u>disobedience</u> received a <u>just recompence of reward</u>;

<u>Word</u> – <u>NT:3056</u> λόγος **logos** (log'-os); from <u>NT:3004</u>; something said (including the thought); by implication a topic (subject of discourse), also reasoning (the mental faculty) or motive; by extension, a computation; specifically (with the article in John) the Divine Expression (i.e. Christ):

*KJV* - account, cause, communication, <sup>X</sup> concerning, doctrine, fame, <sup>X</sup> have to do, intent, matter, mouth, preaching, question, reason, <sup>+</sup> reckon, remove, say (-ing), shew, <sup>X</sup> speaker, speech, talk, thing, <sup>+</sup> none of these things move me, tidings, treatise, utterance, word, work.

Spoken – NT:2980 λαλέω **laleo** (lal-eh'-o); a prolonged form of an otherwise obsolete verb; to talk, i.e. utter words:

*KJV* - preach, say, speak (after), talk, tell, utter. Compare NT:3004.

<u>Stedfast</u> – <u>NT:949</u> βέβαιος **bebaios** (beb'-ah-yos); from the base of <u>NT:939</u> (through the idea of basality); stable (literally or figuratively):

KJV - firm, of force, stedfast, sure.

<u>Transgression</u> – <u>NT:3847</u> παράβασις **parabasis** (par-ab'-as-is); from <u>NT:3845</u>; violation:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - breaking, transgression.

<u>Disobedience</u> – <u>NT:3876</u> παρακοή **parakoe** (par-ak-o-ay'); from <u>NT:3878</u>; inattention, i.e. (by implication) disobedience: *KJV* - disobedience.

Just – NT:1738 ἔνδικος **endikos** (en'-dee-kos); from NT:1722 and NT:1349; in the right, i.e. equitable:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - just.

Recompence of reward – NT:3405  $\mu$ ισθαποδοσία **misthapodosia** (mis-thap-od-os-ee'-ah); from NT:3406; requital (good or bad): **KJV** - recompence of reward.

## Proverbs 11 ...of the wicked

<sup>31</sup> Behold, the **righteous shall be recompensed in the earth**: **much more the wicked** and the sinner.

### Psalm 18 ... of the saints

<sup>20</sup> The LORD rewarded me according to my righteousness; according to the cleanness of my hands hath He recompensed me.

Escape – NT:1628 ἐκφεύγω **ekpheugo** (ek-fyoo'-go); from NT:1537 and NT:5343; to flee out:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - escape, flee.

Neglect – NT:272 ἀμελέω **ameleo** (am-el-eh'-o); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and NT:3199; to be careless of:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - make light of, neglect, be negligent, no regard.

Salvation – NT:272 ἀμελέω **ameleo** (am-el-eh'-o); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and NT:3199; to be careless of:

*KJV* - make light of, neglect, be negligent, no regard.

Confirmed – NT:950 βεβαιόω **bebaioo** (beb-ah-yo'-o); from NT:949; to stabilitate (figuratively):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - confirm, (e-) stablish.

### Psalm 71

<sup>2</sup> Deliver me in thy righteousness, and cause me to escape: incline thine ear unto me, and save me.

### 1 Corinthians 10

<sup>13</sup> There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but **God is faithful**, who **will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able**; but will with the temptation also **make a way to escape**, that ye may be **able to bear it**.

Bearing them witness – NT:4901 συνεπιμαρτυρέω **sunepimartureo** (soon-ep-ee-martoo-reh'-o); from NT:4862 and NT:1957; to testify further jointly, i.e. unite in adding evidence: **KJV** - also bear witness.

<u>Signs</u> – <u>NT:4592</u> σημειον **semeion** (say-mi'-on); neuter of a presumed derivative of the base of <u>NT:4591</u>; an indication, especially ceremonially or supernaturally: **KJV** - miracle, sign, token, wonder.

Wonders – NT:5059 τέρας **teras** (ter'-as); of uncertain affinity; a prodigy or omen:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - wonder.

<u>Miracles</u> – <u>NT:1411</u> δύναμις **dunamis** (doo'-nam-is); from <u>NT:1410</u>; force (literally or figuratively); specially, miraculous power (usually by implication, a miracle itself):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - ability, abundance, meaning, might (-ily, -y, -y deed), (worker of) miracle (-s), power, strength, violence, mighty (wonderful) work.

<u>Gifts</u> – <u>NT:3311</u> μερισμός **merismos** (mer-is-mos'); from <u>NT:3307</u>; a separation or distribution:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - dividing asunder, gift.

Will – NT:2308 θέλησις **thelesis** (thel'-ay-sis); from NT:2309; determination (properly, the act), i.e. option: **KJV** - will.

## **Ephesians 1**

<sup>1f</sup> In whom also we have obtained an inheritance, being predestinated according to the purpose of Him who worketh all things after the counsel of **His own will**:

#### Acts 2

<sup>38</sup> Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall **receive the gift of the Holy Ghost**.

### James 1

<u>Subjection</u> – <u>NT:5293</u> ὑποτάσσω **hupotasso** (hoop-ot-as'-so); from <u>NT:5259</u> and <u>NT:5021</u>; to subordinate; reflexively, to obey:

**KJV** - be under obedience (obedient), put under, subdue unto, (be, make) subject (to, unto), be (put) in subjection (to, under), submit self unto.

### Genesis 1

<sup>26</sup> And God said, Let us **make man** in our image, after our likeness: and **let them have dominion** over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth.

### Genesis 1

<sup>28</sup> And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and **have dominion** over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.

## Hebrews 2 Man has dominion over God's works

<sup>6</sup> But one in a certain place <u>testified</u>, saying, What is man, that thou art <u>mindful</u> of him? or the son of man that thou <u>visitest</u> him?

Testified – NT:1263 διαμαρτύρομαι **diamarturomai** (dee-am-ar-too'-rom-ahee); from NT:1223 and NT:3140; to attest or protest earnestly, or (by implication) hortatively:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - charge, testify (unto), witness.

 $\underline{\text{Mindful}} - \underline{\text{NT:3403}}$  μιμνήσκω **mimnesko** (mim-nace'-ko); a prolonged form of  $\underline{\text{NT:3415}}$  (from which some of the tenses are borrowed); to remind, i.e. (middle voice) to recall to mind:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - be mindful, remember.

<u>Visitest</u> – <u>NT:1980</u> ἐπισκέπτομαι **episkeptomai** (ep-ee-skep'-tom-ahee); middle voice from <u>NT:1909</u> and the base of <u>NT:4649</u>; to inspect, i.e. (by implication) to select; by extension, to go to see, relieve: KJV - look out, visit.

#### Psalm 8

- <sup>4</sup>What is man, that thou art mindful of him? and the son of man, that thou visitest him?
- <sup>5</sup> For thou hast **made him a little lower than the angels**, and hast **crowned him with glory and honour.**
- <sup>6</sup> Thou madest him to have dominion over the works of thy hands; thou hast put all things under his feet:
- <sup>7</sup> All sheep and oxen, yea, and the beasts of the field;

<u>Lower</u> – <u>NT:1642</u> ἐλαττόω **elattoo** (el-at-to'-o); from <u>NT:1640</u>; to lessen (in rank or influence): **KJV** - decrease, make lower.

<u>Crownedst</u> – <u>NT:4737</u> στεφανόω **stephanoo** (stef-an-o'-o); from <u>NT:4735</u>; to adorn with an honorary wreath (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - crown.

### **Hebrews 2**

<sup>8</sup> Thou hast put all things in <u>subjection</u> under his feet. For in that he put all in subjection under him, he left nothing that is not put under him. But now we see **not** yet all things put under him.

<u>Subjection</u> – <u>NT:5293</u> ὑποτάσσω **hupotasso** (hoop-ot-as'-so); from <u>NT:5259</u> and <u>NT:5021</u>; to subordinate; reflexively, to obey:

**KJV** - be under obedience (obedient), put under, subdue unto, (be, make) subject (to, unto), be (put) in subjection (to, under), submitself unto.

## **Ephesians 1**

The eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints,

<sup>19</sup> And what is the exceeding greatness of his power to us-ward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power,

<sup>20</sup> Which he wrought in Christ, when he **raised him from the dead**, and **set him at his own right hand** in the heavenly places,

Lower – NT:1642 ἐλαττόω **elattoo** (el-at-to'-o); from NT:1640; to lessen (in rank or influence):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - decrease, make lower.

<u>Taste</u> – NT:1089 γεύομαι **geuomai** (ghyoo'-om-ahee); a primary verb; to taste; by implication, to eat; figuratively, to <u>experience</u> (good or ill):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - eat, taste.

### Suffer

### **Hebrews 2**

<sup>10</sup> For it <u>became</u> him, for whom are all things, and by whom are all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the <u>captain</u> of their <u>salvation perfect</u> through <u>sufferings</u>.

Became – NT:4241 πρέπω **prepo** (prep'-o); apparently a primary verb; to tower up (be conspicuous), i.e. (by implication) to be suitable or proper (third person singular present indicative, often used impersonally, it is <u>fit or right</u>):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - become, comely.

<u>Captain</u> – <u>NT:747</u> ἀρχηγός **archegos** (ar-khay-gos'); from <u>NT:746</u> and <u>NT:71</u>; a chief leader: **KJV** - author, captain, prince.

Salvation – NT:4991 σωτηρία **soteria** (so-tay-ree'-ah); feminine of a derivative of NT:4990 as (properly, abstract) noun; rescue or safety (physically or morally):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - deliver, health, salvation, save, saving.

Perfect – NT:5048 Τελειόω **teleioo** (tel-i-o'-o); from NT:5046; to complete, i.e. (literally) accomplish, or (figuratively) consummate (in character): **KJV** - consecrate, finish, fulfil, make) perfect.

Sufferings – NT:3804 πάθημα **pathema** (path'-ay-mah); from a presumed derivative of NT:3806; something undergone, i.e. hardship or pain; subjectively, an emotion or influence:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - affection, affliction, motion, suffering.

# **Sanctified**

#### **Hebrews 2**

<sup>11</sup> For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified are all of one: for which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethren,

Sanctifieth – NT:37  $\dot{\alpha}$ γι $\dot{\alpha}$ ζω **hagiazo** (hag-ee-ad'-zo); from NT:40; to make holy, i.e. (ceremonially) purify or consecrate; (mentally) to venerate: **KJV** - hallow, be holy, sanctify.

Ashamed – NT:1870 ἐπαισχύνομαι **epaischunomai** (ep-ahee-skhoo'-nom-ahee); from NT:1909 and NT:153; to feel shame for something: **KJV** - be ashamed.

One – NT:1520 είς **heis** (hice); (including the neuter [etc.] hen); a primary numeral; one:

*KJV* - a (-n, -ny, certain), \* abundantly, man, one (another), only, other, some. See also NT:1527, NT:3367, NT:3391, NT:3762.

### **Praised**

#### Hebrews 2

<sup>12</sup> Saying, I will declare thy name unto my brethren, in the midst of the church will I sing praise unto thee.

<u>Deliver</u> – <u>NT:525</u> ἀπαλλάσσω **apallasso** (ap-al-las'-so); from <u>NT:575</u> and <u>NT:236</u>; to change away, i.e. release, (reflexively) remove: **KJV** - deliver, depart.

<u>Subject</u> – <u>NT:1777</u> ἔνοχος **enochos** (en'-okh-os); from <u>NT:1758</u>; liable to (a condition, penalty or imputation): **KJV** - in danger of, guilty of, subject to.

<u>Bondage</u> – <u>NT:1397</u> δουλεία **douleia** (doo-li'-ah); from <u>NT:1398</u>; slavery (ceremonially or figuratively): **KJV** - bondage.

<sup>18</sup> For in that he Himself hath <u>suffered</u> being <u>tempted</u>, he is able to <u>succour</u> them that are <u>tempted</u>. <u>Suffered</u> – <u>NT:3958</u> πάσχω **pascho** (pas'-kho); including the forms (patho (path'-o) and pentho (pen'-tho)), used only in certain tenses for it; apparently a primary verb; to experience a sensation or impression (usually painful): **KJV** - feel, passion, suffer, vex.

Tempted – NT:3985 πειράζω **peirazo** (pi-rad'-zo); from NT:3984; to test (objectively), i.e. endeavor, scrutinize, entice, discipline:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - assay, examine, go about, prove, tempt (-er), try.

Succour – NT:997 βοηθέω **boetheo** (bo-ay-theh'-o); from NT:998; to aid or relieve: **KJV** - help, sucour.
