Strangers sojourning

1 Peter 1

¹ Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, **to the <u>strangers</u>** [converts] <u>scattered</u> [dispersed in the land of Gentiles] throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia [all of Asia], Peter – <u>NT:4074</u> Πέτρος **Petros** (pet'-ros); apparently a primary word; a (piece of) rock (larger than <u>NT:3037</u>); as a name, Petrus, an apostle: **KJV** - Peter, rock. Compare NT:2786.

<u>Apostle</u> – <u>NT:652</u> ἀπόστολος **apostolos** (ap-os'-tol-os); from <u>NT:649</u>; a delegate; specially, an ambassador of the Gospel; officially a commissioner of Christ ["apostle"] (with miraculous powers):

KJV - apostle, messenger, he that is sent.

Strangers – NT:3927 παρεπίδεμος **parepidemos** (par-ep-id'-ay-mos); from NT:3844 and the base of NT:1927; an alien alongside, i.e. a resident foreigner: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - pilgrim, stranger.

Scattered – NT:1290 διασπορά **diaspora** (dee-as-por-ah'); from NT:1289; dispersion, i.e. (specially and concretely) the (converted) Israelite resident in Gentile countries: **KJV** - (which are) scattered (abroad).

Psalm 44

¹¹ Thou hast **given us like sheep** appointed for meat; and hast **scattered us among the heathen**.

Jeremiah 10

²¹ For the **pastors are become brutish**, and have not sought the LORD: therefore they shall not prosper, and all **their flocks shall be scattered**.

Jeremiah 30

¹¹ For I am with thee, saith the LORD, to save thee: though I make a full end of all nations whither I have scattered thee, yet I will not make a full end of thee: but I will correct thee in measure, and will not leave thee altogether unpunished.

Ezekiel 11

Salvation Plan (cont)

Selected Sanctified

1 Peter 1

² <u>Elect</u> [strangers] according to the <u>foreknowledge</u> of God the Father, through <u>sanctification</u> of the <u>Spirit</u>, unto [into – the point; fig. purpose] <u>obedience</u> and <u>sprinkling</u> of the <u>blood</u> of <u>Jesus Christ</u>: Grace unto you, and peace, be multiplied. <u>Elect</u> – <u>NT:1588</u> ἐκλεκτός **eklektos** (ek-lek-tos'); from <u>NT:1586</u>; select; by implication, favorite: **KJV** - chosen, elect.

<u>Foreknowledge</u> – <u>NT:4268</u> πρόγνωσις **prognosis** (prog'-no-sis); from <u>NT:4267</u>; forethought: **KJV** - foreknowledge.

...from – ΝΤ:4267 προγινώσκω **proginosko** (prog-in-oce'-ko); from NT:4253 and NT:1097; to know beforehand, i.e. foresee: **KJV** - foreknow (ordain), know (before).

<u>Sanctification</u> – <u>NT:38</u> ἀγιασμός **hagiasmos** (hag-ee-as-mos'); from <u>NT:37</u>; properly, purification, i.e. (the state) purity; concretely (by Hebraism) a purifier: *KJV* - holiness, sanctification.

...from – NT:37 Δ΄γιάζω **hagiazo** (hag-ee-ad'-zo); from NT:40; to make holy, i.e. (ceremonially) purify or consecrate; (mentally) to venerate: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - hallow, be holy, sanctify.

...from – NT:40 αγιος **hagios** (hag'-ee-os); from **hagos** (an awful thing) [compare NT:53, NT:2282]; sacred (physically, pure, morally blameless or religious, ceremonially, consecrated): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - (most) holy (one, thing), saint.

Obedience – NT:5218 ὑπακοή **hupakoe** (hoop-ak-o-ay'); from NT:5219; attentive hearkening, i.e. (by implication) compliance or submission: **KJV** - obedience, (make) obedient, obey (-ing).

Sprinkling – NT:4473 ράντισμός **rhantismos** (hran-tis-mos'); from NT:4472; aspersion [Archaic – shower or spray] (ceremonially or figuratively): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - sprinkling.

Blood – NT:129 αἷμα **haima** (hah'-ee-mah); of uncertain derivation; blood, literally (of men or animals), figuratively (the juice of grapes) or specially (the atoning blood of Christ); by implication bloodshed, also kindred: **KJV** - blood.

Salvation Plan (cont)

Mercy bear us alive

1 Peter 1

³ <u>Blessed</u> be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his **abundant** mercy hath <u>begotten US again</u> [we are born again] unto a <u>lively hope</u> [being quickened] by the <u>resurrection</u> of Jesus Christ from the dead, <u>Blessed</u> – <u>NT:2128</u> εὐλογητός **eulogetos** (yoo-log-ay-tos'); from <u>NT:2127</u>; <u>adorable</u>: **KJV** - blessed.

Begotten us again – NT:313 ἀναγεννάω **anagennao** (an-ag-en-nah'-o); from NT:303 and NT:1080; to beget or (by extension) bear (again): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - beget, (bear) $^{\text{X}}$ (again).

John 3

³ Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, **Except [unless] a** man be born again, he **cannot see** the kingdom of God.

John 3

⁷ Marvel not that I said unto thee, **Ye must be born again**.

Resurrection – NT:386 ἀνάστασις **anastasis** (an-as'-tas-is); from NT:450; a standing up again, i.e. (literally) a <u>resurrection from death</u> (individual, genitive case or by implication [its author]), or (figuratively) a (moral) recovery (of spiritual truth):

KJV - raised to life again, resurrection, rise from the dead, that should rise, rising again.

<u>Lively</u> – <u>NT:2198</u> ζάω **zao** (dzah'-o); a primary verb; <u>to live</u> (literally or figuratively): *KJV* - life (-time), (a-) live (-ly), quick.

 $\underline{\text{Hope}} = \underline{\text{NT:}1680}$ έλπίς **elpis** (el-pece'); from a primary **elpo** (to <u>anticipate</u>, <u>usually with pleasure</u>); <u>expectation</u> (abstractly or <u>confidence</u>:

KJV - faith, hope.

A living hope as a result of the quickening Spirit that has made us alive...

Salvation Plan (cont)

Irreversible possession

1 Peter 1

⁴To an <u>inheritance incorruptible</u>, and <u>undefiled</u>, and that <u>fadeth</u> not away,

reserved in heaven for you,

<u>Inheritance</u> – <u>NT:2817</u> κληρονομία **kleronomia** (klay-ron-om-ee'-ah); from <u>NT:2818</u>; heirship, i.e. (concretely) a patrimony or (genitive case) a <u>possession</u>: **KJV** - inheritance.

<u>Incorruptible</u> – <u>NT:862</u> ἄφθαρτος **aphthartos** (af'-thar-tos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a derivative of <u>NT:5351</u>; undecaying (in essence or continuance): **KJV** - not (in-, un-) corruptible, immortal.

...remains after death

<u>Undefiled</u> – <u>NT:283</u> ἀμίαντος **amiantos** (am-ee'-an-tos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a derivative of <u>NT:3392</u>; <u>unsoiled</u>, i.e. (figuratively) pure: **KJV** - undefiled.

...it remains undefiled

Fadeth – NT:263 ἀμαράντος **amarantos** (am-ar'-an-tos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of NT:3133; unfading, i.e. (by implication) perpetual: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - that fadeth not away.

Reserved – NT:5083 Τηρέω **tereo** (tay-reh'-o); from teros (a watch; perhaps akin to NT:2334); to guard (from loss or injury, properly, by keeping the eye upon; and thus differing from NT:5442, which is properly to prevent escaping; and from NT:2892, which implies a fortress or full military lines of apparatus), i.e. to note (a prophecy; figuratively, to fulfil a command); by implication, to detain (in custody; figuratively, to maintain); by extension, to withhold (for personal ends; figuratively, to keep unmarried); by extension, to withhold (for personal ends; figuratively, to keep unmarried):

KJV - hold fast, keep (-er), (pre-, re-) serve, watch.

³ And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also.

Salvation Plan (cont)

Moving Day

Ezekiel 12

- ³ Therefore, thou son of man, prepare thee stuff for removing, and remove by day in their sight; and thou shalt remove from thy place to another place in their sight: it may be they will consider, though they be a rebellious house.
- ⁴ Then shalt thou bring forth thy stuff by day in their sight, as stuff for removing: and thou shalt go forth at even in their sight, as they that go forth into captivity.

⁵ Dig thou through the wall in their sight, and carry out thereby.

⁶ In their sight shalt thou bear it upon thy shoulders, and carry it forth in the twilight: thou shalt cover thy face, that thou see not the ground: for I have set thee for a sign unto the house of Israel.

Salvation Plan (cont)

Power of God

1 Peter 1

⁵ Who ["us" (vs4) "begotten again"] are <u>kept</u> by the <u>power</u> **of** God <u>through</u> <u>faith</u> <u>unto</u> <u>salvation</u> ready to be <u>revealed</u> in the last time.

<u>Kept</u> – <u>NT:5432</u> φρουρέω **phroureo** (froo-reh'-o); from a compound of <u>NT:4253</u> and <u>NT:3708</u>; to be a watcher in advance, i.e. to mount guard as a sentinel (post spies at gates); figuratively, to hem in, protect:

KJV - keep (with a garrison). Compare NT:5083.

...from – NT:4253 πρό **pro** (pro); a primary preposition; "fore", i.e. in front of, prior (figuratively, superior) to:

KJV - above, ago, before, or ever. In comparison it retains the same significations.

...from – NT:3708 $\dot{\delta}\rho\dot{\alpha}\omega$ horao (hor-ah'-o); properly, to stare at [compare NT:3700], i.e. (by implication) to discern clearly (physically or mentally); by extension, to attend to; by Hebraism, to experience; passively, to appear:

KJV - behold, perceive, see, take heed.

Power – NT:1411 δύναμις **dunamis** (doo'-nam-is); from NT:1410; force [power, strength] (literally or figuratively); specially, miraculous power (usually by implication, a miracle itself):

KJV - ability, abundance, meaning, might (-ily, -y, -y deed), (worker of) miracle (-s), power, strength, violence, mighty (wonderful) work.

<u>Through</u> – <u>NT:1223</u> $\delta\iota\dot{\alpha}$ **dia** (dee-ah'); a primary preposition denoting the <u>channel</u> <u>of an act</u>; through (in very wide applications, local, causal, or occasional): **KJV** - after, always, among, at, to avoid, because of (that), briefly, by, for (cause). ..fore, from, in, by occasion of, of, by reason of, for sake, that, thereby, therefore, ^X though, through (-out), to, wherefore, with (-in). In composition it retains the same general import.

⁴ For though he was **crucified through weakness**, yet **he liveth by the power of God**. For we also are **weak in him**, but we shall **live with him by** the **power of God** toward you.

2 Timothy 1

⁸ Be not thou therefore ashamed of the testimony of our Lord, nor of me his prisoner: but be thou **partaker of the afflictions of the gospel** according to the **power of God**:

⁵ Who ["us" (vs4) "begotten again"] are **kept** by the **power Of God through** <u>faith</u> <u>unto</u> <u>salvation</u> ready to be <u>revealed</u> in the last time.

Faith – NT:4102 πίστις **pistis** (pis'-tis); from NT:3982; persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (of religious truth, or the <u>truthfulness of God</u> or a religious teacher), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation; abstractly, constancy in such profession; by extension, the system of religious (Gospel) truth itself: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - assurance, belief, believe, faith, fidelity.

Matthew 22

²⁹ Jesus answered and said unto them, Ye do err, not knowing the scriptures, nor the **power of God**.

Romans 1

¹⁶ For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the **power of God** unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.

<u>Unto</u> – <u>NT:1519</u> ϵ **i** ς **eis** (ice); a primary preposition; to or into (indicating the point reached or entered), of place, time, or (figuratively) purpose (result, etc.); also in adverbial phrases:

KJV - [abundantly-], against, among, as, at, [back-] ward, before, by, concerning, + continual, + far more exceeding, for [intent, purposefore],, + forth, in (among, at, unto, -so much that, -to), to the intent that, + of one mind, + never, of, (up-) on, + perish, + set at one again, (so) that, therefore (-unto), throughout, til, to (be, the end, -ward), (here-) until (-to), ... ward, [wherefore-], with. Often used in composition with the same general import, but only with verbs (etc.) expressing motion (literally or figuratively).

Salvation – NT:4991 σωτηρία **soteria** (so-tay-ree'-ah); feminine of a derivative of NT:4990 as (properly, abstract) noun; rescue or safety (physically or morally): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - deliver, health, salvation, save, saving.

Ready – NT:2092 ἕτοιμος **hetoimos** (het-oy'-mos); from an old noun heteos (fitness); adjusted, i.e. ready:

KJV - prepared, (made) ready (-iness, to our hand).

Revealed – NT:601 ἀποκαλύπτω **apokalupto** (ap-ok-al-oop'-to); from NT:575 and NT:2572; to take off the cover, i.e. disclose: **KJV** - reveal.

<u>Last</u> – NT:2078 ἔσχατος **eschatos** (es'-khat-os); a superlative probably from NT:2192 (in the sense of contiguity); farthest, final (of place or time): **KJV** - ends of, last, latter end, lowest, uttermost.

 $\underline{\text{Time}}$ – NT:2540 καιρός **kairos** (kahee-ros'); of uncertain affinity; an occasion, i.e. set or proper time:

KJV - $^{\chi}$ always, opportunity, (convenient, due) season, (due, short, while) time, a while. Compare NT:5550.

Salvation Prophesied

1 Peter 1

⁶ Wherein **ye greatly rejoice**, though now for a **season** [while], if need be, ye are in **heaviness** through **manifold** [various kinds of] **temptations**:

Greatly rejoice – $\underline{\text{NT:21}}$ ἀγαλλιάω **agalliao** (ag-al-lee-ah'-o); from **agan** (much) and $\underline{\text{NT:242}}$; properly, to jump for joy, i.e. exult:

KJV - be (exceeding) glad, with exceeding joy, rejoice (greatly).

Season – NT:3641 ὀλίγος **oligos** (ol-ee'-gos); of uncertain affinity; puny (in extent, degree, number, <u>duration</u> or value); especially neuter (adverbial) somewhat: KJV - + almost, brief [-ly], few, (a) little, + long, a season, short, small, a while.

<u>Heaviness</u> – <u>NT:3076</u> λυπέω **lupeo** (loo-peh'-o); from <u>NT:3077</u>; to <u>distress</u>; reflexively or passively, <u>to be sad</u>:

KJV - cause grief, grieve, be in heaviness, (be) sorrow (-ful), be (make) sorry.

<u>Temptations</u> – <u>NT:3986</u> π ειρασμός **peirasmos** (pi-ras-mos'); from <u>NT:3985</u>; a putting to proof (by experiment [of good], experience [of evil], solicitation, discipline or provocation); by implication, adversity: **KJV** - temptation, ^X try.

Psalm 69

²⁰ Reproach hath broken my heart; and I am full of **heaviness**: and I looked for some to take pity, but there was none; and for comforters, but I found none.

James 4

⁹ Be afflicted, and mourn, and weep: let your laughter be turned to mourning, and your joy to heaviness.

Salvation Prophesied (cont)

1 Peter 1

⁷ That the <u>trial</u> of your <u>faith</u>, being <u>much more precious</u> than of gold that <u>perisheth</u>, though it be <u>tried</u> with fire, might be found unto <u>praise</u> and <u>honour</u> and <u>glory</u> at the <u>appearing</u> [revelation] of Jesus Christ:

<u>Trial</u> – <u>NT:1383</u> δοκίμιον **dokimion** (dok-im'-ee-on); neuter of a presumed derivative of <u>NT:1382</u>; a testing; by implication, trustworthiness: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - trial, trying.

Faith – NT:4102 πίστις **pistis** (pis'-tis); from NT:3982; persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (of religious truth, or the truthfulness of God or a religious teacher), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation; abstractly, constancy in such profession; by extension, the system of religious (Gospel) truth itself: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - assurance, belief, believe, faith, fidelity.

<u>Much more precious</u> $- NT:4186 \pi ολύτιμος$ **polutimos**(pol-oot'-ee-mos); from NT:4183 and NT:5092; extremely valuable:

KJV - very costly, of great price.

Perisheth – NT:622 ἀπόλλυμι **apollumi** (ap-ol'-loo-mee); from NT:575 and the base of NT:3639; to destroy fully (reflexively, to perish, or lose), literally or figuratively: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - destroy, die, lose, mar, perish.

<u>Tried</u> – <u>NT:1381</u>δοκιμάζω **dokimazo** (dok-im-ad'-zo); from <u>NT:1384</u>; to test (literally or figuratively); by implication, to approve:

KJV - allow, discern, examine, X like, (ap-) prove, try.

Praise – NT:1868 ξ παινος **epainos** (ep'-ahee-nos); from NT:1909 and the base of NT:134; laudation; concretely, a commendable thing: **KJV** - praise.

<u>Honour</u> – <u>NT:5091</u> τιμάω **timao** (tim-ah'-o); from <u>NT:5093</u>; to prize, i.e. fix a valuation upon; by implication, to revere: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - honour, value.

Glory – NT:1391 δόξα **doxa** (dox'-ah); from the base of NT:1380; glory (as very apparent), in a wide application (literal or figurative, objective or subjective): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - dignity, glory (-ious), honour, praise, worship.

<u>Appearing</u> – <u>NT:602</u> ἀποκάλυψις **apokalupsis** (ap-ok-al'-oop-sis); from <u>NT:601</u>; disclosure:

KJV - appearing, coming, lighten, manifestation, be revealed, revelation.

Salvation Prophesied (cont)

1 Peter 1

⁸ Whom having **not seen**, **ye love**; in whom, though **now ye see him not**, **yet believing**, ye **rejoice** with **joy unspeakable** and **full of glory**:

2 Timothy 2:15

Study to shew thyself **approved** unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.

2 Corinthians 7

¹⁰ For godly sorrow worketh **repentance to salvation not to be repented of**: but the **sorrow of the world worketh death**.

¹¹ For behold this selfsame thing, that **ye sorrowed after a godly sort**, what **carefulness** it wrought in you, yea, what **clearing of yourselves**, yea, what **indignation**, yea, what **fear**, yea, what **vehement desire**, yea, what **zeal**, yea, **what revenge**! In all things ye have **approved yourselves** to be **clear in this matter**.

Believing – NT:4100 πιστεύω **pisteuo** (pist-yoo'-o); from NT:4102; to have faith (in, upon, or with respect to, a person or thing), i.e. credit; by implication, to entrust (especially one's spiritual well-being to Christ):

KJV - believe (-r), commit (to trust), put in trust with.

Rejoice – NT:21 ἀγαλλιάω **agalliao** (ag-al-lee-ah'-o); from **agan** (much) and NT:242; properly, to jump for joy, i.e. exult:

KJV - be (exceeding) glad, with exceeding joy, rejoice (greatly).

 $\underline{\text{Joy}} - \underline{\text{NT:5479}} \chi \alpha \rho \acute{\alpha}$ **chara** (khar-ah'); from $\underline{\text{NT:5463}}$; cheerfulness, i.e. calm delight:

KJV - gladness, ^X greatly, (X be exceeding) joy (-ful, -fully, -fulness, -ous). <u>Unspeakable</u> – <u>NT:412</u> ἀνεκλάλητος **aneklaletos** (an-ek-lal'-ay-tos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of <u>NT:1583</u>; not spoken out, i.e. (by implication) unutterable: **KJV** - unspeakable.

Full of glory – NT:1392 δοξάζω **doxazo** (dox-ad'-zo); from NT:1391; to render (or esteem) glorious (in a wide application):

KJV - (make) glorify (-ious), full of (have) glory, honour, magnify.

Salvation Prophesied (cont)

1 Peter 1

⁹ Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls.

Receiving – NT:2865 κομίζω **komizo** (kom-id'-zo); from a primary komeo (to tend, i.e. take care of); properly, to provide for, i.e. (by implication) to carry off (as if from harm; genitive case obtain): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - bring, receive.

End – NT:5056 Τέλος **telos** (tel'-os); from a primary tello (to set out for a definite point or goal); properly, the <u>point aimed at as a limit</u>, i.e. (by implication) the **conclusion of an act** or state (termination [literally, figuratively or indefinitely], <u>result</u> [immediate, ultimate or prophetic], purpose); specifically, an impost or levy (as paid):

KJV - + continual, custom, end (-ing), finally, uttermost.

<u>Faith</u> – <u>NT:4102</u> πίστις **pistis** (pis'-tis); from <u>NT:3982</u>; persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (of religious truth, or the truthfulness of God or a religious teacher), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation; abstractly, constancy in such profession; by extension, the system of religious (Gospel) truth itself: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - assurance, belief, believe, faith, fidelity.

Salvation – NT:4991 σωτηρία **soteria** (so-tay-ree'-ah); feminine of a derivative of NT:4990 as (properly, abstract) noun; rescue or safety (physically or morally): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - deliver, health, salvation, save, saving.

<u>Souls</u> – NT:5590 ψυχή **psuche** (psoo-khay'); from NT:5594; breath, i.e. (by implication) spirit, abstractly or concretely (the animal sentient principle only; thus distinguished on the one hand from NT:4151, which is the rational and immortal soul; and on the other from NT:2222, which is mere vitality, even of plants: these terms thus exactly correspond respectively to the Hebrew OT:5315, OT:7307 and OT:2416):

KJV - heart (+-ily), life, mind, soul, +us, +you.

Salvation Prophesied (cont)

1 Peter 1

¹⁰ Of which <u>salvation</u> the <u>prophets have enquired</u> and <u>searched diligently</u>, who <u>prophesied</u> of the grace that *should come* <u>unto</u> you:

Salvation – NT:4991 σωτηρία **soteria** (so-tay-ree'-ah); feminine of a derivative of NT:4990 as (properly, abstract) noun; rescue or safety (physically or morally): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - deliver, health, salvation, save, saving.

Enquired – NT:1567 ἐκζητέω **ekzeteo** (ek-zay-teh'-o); from NT:1537 and NT:2212; to search out, i.e. (figuratively) investigate, crave, demand, (by Hebraism) worship: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - enre-) quire, seek after (carefully, diligently).

Searched diligently – NT:1830 έξερευνάω **exercunao** (ex-er-yoo-nah'-o); from NT:1537 and NT:2045; to explore (figuratively):

KJV - search diligently.

Prophesied – ΝΤ:4395 προφητεύω **propheteuo** (prof-ate-yoo'-o); from NT:4396; to foretell events, divine, speak under inspiration, exercise the prophetic office: **KJV** - prophesy.

<u>Unto</u> – <u>NT:1519</u> ϵ is (ice); a primary preposition; to or into (indicating the point reached or entered), of place, time, or (figuratively) <u>purpose</u> (result, etc.); also in adverbial phrases:

KJV - [abundantly-], against, among, as, at, [back-] ward, before, by, concerning, + continual, + far more exceeding, for [intent, purposefore],, + forth, in (among, at, unto, -so much that, -to), to the intent that, + of one mind, + never, of, (up-) on, + perish, + set at one again, (so) that, therefore (-unto), throughout, til, to (be, the end, -ward), (here-) until (-to), ... ward, [wherefore-], with. Often used in composition with the same general import, but only with verbs (etc.) expressing motion (literally or figuratively).

Searching – NT:2045 ἐρευνάω **ereunao** (er-yoo-nah'-o) or eraunao (er-ouw-nah'-o); apparently from NT:2046 (through the idea of inquiry); to seek, i.e. (figuratively) to investigate: **KJV** - search.

<u>Manner</u> – <u>NT:4169</u> π 0 $\hat{1}$ 0 ζ **poios** (poy'-os); from the base of <u>NT:4226</u> and <u>NT:3634</u>; individualizing interrogative (of character) what sort of, or (of number) which one: **KJV** - what (manner of), which.

Time – NT:2540 καιρός **kairos** (kahee-ros'); of uncertain affinity; an occasion, i.e. set or proper time:

KJV - X always, opportunity, (convenient, due) season, (due, short, while) time, a while. Compare NT:5550.

Signify – NT:1213 δηλόω **deloo** (day-lo'-o); from NT:1212; to make plain (by words): **KJV** - declare, shew, signify.

<u>Testified beforehand</u> – <u>NT:4303</u> προμαρτύρομαι **promarturomai** (prom-ar-too'-rom-ahee); from <u>NT:4253</u> and <u>NT:3143</u>; to be a <u>witness in advance</u> i.e. <u>predict</u>: **KJV** - testify beforehand.

<u>Sufferings</u> – <u>NT:3804</u> πάθημα **pathema** (path'-ay-mah); from a presumed derivative of <u>NT:3806</u>; something undergone, i.e. hardship or pain; subjectively, an emotion or influence:

KJV - affection, affliction, motion, suffering.

Hebrews 9

⁸ The Holy Ghost this signifying, that the way into the holiest of all was not yet made manifest, while as the first tabernacle was yet standing:

¹² Unto whom [them the prophets] it was <u>revealed</u>, that **not** unto themselves, but unto us they did <u>minister</u> the things, which are now <u>reported</u> unto you by them that have preached the gospel unto you with the Holy Ghost sent down from heaven; which things the angels <u>desire</u> to <u>look</u> into.

Revealed – NT:601 ἀποκαλύπτω **apokalupto** (ap-ok-al-oop'-to); from NT:575 and NT:2572; to take off the cover, i.e. disclose: **KJV** - reveal.

Minister – NT:1247 διακονέω **diakoneo** (dee-ak-on-eh'-o); from NT:1249; to be an attendant, i.e. wait upon (menially or as a host, friend, or [figuratively] teacher); techn. to act as a Christian deacon:

KJV - (ad-) minister (unto), serve, use the office of a deacon.

Reported – NT:312 ἀναγγέλλω **anaggello** (an-ang-el'-lo); from NT:303 and the base of NT:32; to announce (in detail):

KJV - declare, rehearse, report, show, speak, tell.

Desire – NT:1937 ἐπιθυμέω **epithumeo** (ep-ee-thoo-meh'-o); from NT:1909 and NT:2372; to set the heart upon, i.e. long for (rightfully or otherwise):

KJV - covet, desire, would fain, lust (after).

<u>Look</u> – <u>NT:3879</u> παρακύπτω **parakupto** (par-ak-oop'-to); from <u>NT:3844</u> and <u>NT:2955</u>; to bend beside, i.e. lean over (so as to peer within):

KJV - look (into), stoop down.

Gird up – NT:328 ἀναζώννυμι **anazonnumi** (an-ad-zone'-noo-mee); from NT:303 and NT:2224; to gird afresh: **KJV** - gird up.

<u>Loins</u> – <u>NT:3751</u> ὀσφύς **osphus** (os-foos'); of uncertain affinity; the loin (externally), i.e. the hip; intern. (by extension) procreative power: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - loin.

 $\underline{\text{Mind}}$ – NT:1271 διάνοια **dianoia** (dee-an'-oy-ah); from NT:1223 and NT:3563; deep thought, properly, the faculty (mind or its disposition), by implication, its exercise: **KJV** - imagination, mind, understanding.

Sober – NT:3525 νήφω **nepho** (nay'-fo); of uncertain affinity: to abstain from wine (keep sober), i.e. (figuratively) be discreet: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - be sober, watch.

Hope – NT:1679 ἐλπίζω **elpizo** (el-pid'-zo); from NT:1680; to expect or confide: **KJV** - (have, thing) hope (-d) (for), trust.

To the end – NT:5049 Τελείως **teleios** (tel-i'-oce); adverb from NT:5046; completely, i.e. (of hope) without wavering: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - to the end.

Brought – NT:5342 φέρω **phero** (fer'-o); a primary verb (for which other and apparently not cognate ones are used in certain tenses only; namely, **oio** (oy'-o); and **enegko** (en-eng'-ko); to "bear" or carry (in a very wide application, literally and figuratively, as follows):

KJV - be, bear, bring (forth), carry, come, +let her drive, be driven, endure, go on, lay, lead, move, reach, rushing, uphold.

<u>Revelation</u> – <u>NT:602</u> ἀποκάλυψις **apokalupsis** (ap-ok-al'-oop-sis); from <u>NT:601</u>; disclosure:

KJV - appearing, coming, lighten, manifestation, be revealed, revelation.

Galatians 1

¹¹ But I certify you, brethren, that the gospel which was **preached of me** is **not** after man.

¹² For I neither received it of man, neither was I taught it, but by the revelation of Jesus Christ.

Revelation 1

Obedient – NT:5218 ὑπακοή **hupakoe** (hoop-ak-o-ay'); from NT:5219; attentive hearkening, i.e. (by implication) compliance or submission:

KJV - obedience, (make) obedient, obey (-ing).

...from – NT:5219 ὑπακούω **hupakouo** (hoop-ak-oo'-o); from NT:5259 and NT:191; to hear under (as a subordinate), i.e. to listen attentively; by implication, to heed or conform to a command or authority: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - hearken, be obedient to, obey.

<u>Fashioning</u> – <u>NT:4964</u> συσχηματίζω **suschematizo** (soos-khay-mat-id'-zo); from <u>NT:4862</u> and a derivative of <u>NT:4976</u>; to <u>fashion</u> alike, i.e. <u>conform to</u> the same pattern (figuratively):

KJV - conform to, fashionself according to.

¹⁵ But as he which hath called you is <u>holy</u>, so **be ye <u>holy</u>** in all **manner of conversation**:

 $\underline{\text{Holy}} - \underline{\text{NT:40}}$ αντισς **hagios** (hag'-ee-os); from **hagos** (an awful thing) [compare $\underline{\text{NT:53}}$, $\underline{\text{NT:2282}}$]; sacred (physically, pure, morally blameless or religious, ceremonially, consecrated):

KJV - (most) holy (one, thing), saint.

<u>Conversation</u> – <u>NT:391</u> ἀναστροφή **anastrophe** (an-as-trof-ay'); from <u>NT:390</u>; behavior: **KJV** - conversation.

...from – $\underline{\text{NT:390}}$ ἀναστρέφο **anastrepho** (an-as-tref-o); from $\underline{\text{NT:303}}$ and $\underline{\text{NT:4762}}$; to overturn; also to return; by implication, to <u>busy oneself</u>, i.e. remain, live:

KJV - abide, <u>behave self</u>, have conversation, live, overthrow, pass, return, be used.

Ephesians 2

³ Among whom also **we all had our conversation in times** past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were **by nature the children of wrath, even as others.**

Ephesians 4

That ye **put off concerning the former conversation** the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts;

Be ye — NT:2071 ἔσομαι **esomai** (es'-om-ahee); future of NT:1510; will be: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - shall (should) be (have), (shall) come (to pass), ^X may have, ^X fall, what would follow, ^X live long, ^X sojourn.

Leviticus 20

Sanctify – OT:6942 VIP **qadash** (kaw-dash'); a primitive root; to be (causatively, make, pronounce or observe as) clean (ceremonially or morally): **KJV** - appoint, bid, consecrate, dedicate, defile, hallow, (be, keep) holy (-er, place), keep, prepare, proclaim, purify, sanctify (-ied oneself,), ^X wholly.

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
