Love Because We Are Creatures of Love

Colossians 2

² That their hearts might be comforted, being <u>knit together</u> in love, and unto all riches of the full assurance of understanding, to the acknowledgement of the mystery of God, and of the Father, and of Christ;

Knit - sumbibazo (soom-bib-ad'-zo); from NT:4862 and bibazo (to force; causative [by reduplication] of the base of NT:939); to drive together, i.e. unite (in association or affection), (mentally) to infer, show, teach:

KJV - compact, assuredly gather, intrust, knit together, prove.

Walk/Live in Love

Ephesians 5

² And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour.

Hebrews 10

²⁴ And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works:

Philippians 1

²¹ For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain.

Love With A Pure Heart

1 Peter 1

²² Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently:

2 Corinthians 6

⁶ By pureness, by knowledge, by long suffering, by kindness, by the Holy Ghost, by love unfeigned,

unfeigned - anupokritos (an-oo-pok'-ree-tos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of NT:5271; undissembled, i.e. <u>sincere</u>:

KJV - without dissimulation (hypocrisy), unfeigned.

Philippians 4

⁸ Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things.

1 Peter 1

²² Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently:

<u>Pitiful</u> – eusplagchnos (yoo'-splangkh-nos); from NT:2095 and NT:4698; well compassioned, i.e. sympathetic:

KJV - pitiful, tender-hearted.

<u>Courteous</u> - tapeinophron (tap-i-no'-frohn); related to NT:5013; found only in 1 Peter 3:8; the Textus Receptus has philophrones (See NT:5391): humble, humble-minded.

Proverbs 6

 3 Do this now, my son, and deliver thyself, when thou art come into the hand of thy friend; go, humble thyself, and make sure thy friend.

1 John 4

¹⁹ We love him, because he first loved us.

Love is Unsurpassed, Extreme

2 Samuel 1

 26 I am distressed for thee, my brother Jonathan: very pleasant hast thou been unto me: thy <u>love to me was wonderful</u>, passing the love of women.

<u>Love - affection</u> <u>Wonderful</u> – great, difficult

1 John 4

⁹ In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him.

Ephesians 3

¹⁹ And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be filled with all the fulness of God.

Love Is Kind

2 Samuel 9

And David said unto him, Fear not: for <u>I will surely shew thee kindness</u> for Jonathan thy father's sake, and will restore thee all the land of Saul thy father; and thou shalt eat bread at my table continually.

1 Samuel 20 ... And Does Not Forget

And thou shalt not only while yet I live shew me the kindness of the LORD. that I die not:

15 But also thou shalt not cut off thy kindness from my house for ever: no, not when the LORD hath cut off the enemies of David every one from the face of the earth.

So Jonathan made a covenant with the house of David, saying, Let the LORD even require it at the hand of David's enemies.

Friends are for times of Adversity

Proverbs 17

¹⁷ A friend loveth at all times, and a brother is born for adversity.

Adversity – tsarah (tsaw-raw'); feminine of OT:6862; tightness (i.e. figuratively, trouble); transitively, a female rival:

KJV - adversary, adversity, affliction, anguish, distress, tribulation, trouble.

1 Timothy 6

¹⁸ That they do good, that they be rich in good works, ready to distribute, willing to communicate;

Hebrews 13

¹⁶ But to do good and to communicate forget not: for with such sacrifices God is well pleased.

Job 42

¹⁰ And the LORD turned the captivity of Job, when he prayed for his friends: also the LORD gave Job twice as much as he had before.

1 Kings 9

Friendship Should Be Pleasant

Proverbs 27 (Know when to counsel)

⁹ Ointment and perfume rejoice the heart: so doth the <u>sweetness</u> of a man's friend by hearty <u>counsel</u>.

<u>Sweetness</u> - `etsah (ay-tsaw'); from OT:3289; advice; by implication, plan; also prudence: KJV - advice, advisement, counsel (l- [or]), purpose.

<u>Counsel</u> - `etsah (ay-tsaw'); from OT:3289; advice; by implication, plan; also prudence: KJV - advice, advisement, counsel (l- [or]), purpose.

Proverbs 27 (Know when to stay near)

¹⁰ Thine own friend, and thy father's friend, forsake not; neither go into thy brother's house in the day of thy calamity: for better is a neighbour that is near than a brother far off.

Psalm 119 (toward the servant)

¹⁴⁰ Thy word is very pure: therefore thy servant loveth it.

Proverbs 22 (toward the master)

¹¹ He that loveth pureness of heart, for the grace of his lips the king shall be his friend.

Love thyself

Leviticus 19

¹⁸ Thou shalt not avenge, nor bear any grudge against the children of thy people, but thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself: I am the LORD.

Love of Friendship is Reciprocating

1 Kings 5

¹ And Hiram king of Tyre sent his servants unto Solomon; for he had heard that they had anointed him king in the room of his father: for Hiram was ever a lover of David.

2 Samuel 5

¹¹ And Hiram king of Tyre sent messengers to David, and cedar trees, and carpenters, and masons: and they built David an house.

1 Kings 9

Pay again - shalam (shaw-lam'); a primitive root; to be safe (in mind, body or estate); figuratively, to be (causatively, make) completed; by implication, to be friendly; by extension, to reciprocate (in various applications):

KJV - make amends, (make an) end, finish, full, give again, make good, (re-) pay (again), (make) (to) (be at) peace (-able), that is perfect, perform, (make) prosper (-ous), recompense, render, requite, make restitution, restore, reward, X surely.

What kind of Love of Friendship

1 Corinthians 13

⁴ Charity suffereth long, and is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up,

⁵ Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil;

⁶ Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth;

⁷ Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things.

<u>Charity</u> – agape (ag-ah'-pay); from NT:25; love, i.e. affection or benevolence; specially (plural) a love-feast:

<u>Suffers</u> – makrothumeo (mak-roth-oo-meh'-o); from the same as NT:3116; to be long-spirited, i.e. (objectively) forbearing or (subjectively) patient:

KJV - bear (suffer) long, be longsuffering, have (long) patience, be patient, patiently endure.

Micah 7

⁵ Trust ye not in a friend, put ye not confidence in a guide: keep the doors of thy mouth from her that lieth in thy bosom.

<u>Kind</u> – chresteuomai (khraste-yoo'-om-ahee); middle voice from NT:5543; to show oneself useful, i.e. act benevolently: KJV - be kind.

Proverbs 22

²⁴ Make no friendship with an angry man; and with a furious man thou shalt not go:

<u>Envies</u> – zeloo (dzay-lo'-o) or zeleuo (dzay-loo'-o); from NT:2205; to have warmth of feeling for or against:

KJV - affect, covet (earnestly), (have) desire, (move with) envy, be jealous over, (be) zealous (-ly affect).

Proverbs 14

²⁰ The poor is hated even of his own neighbour: but the <u>rich hath many friends</u>.

<u>Vaunteth</u> – perpereuomai (per-per-yoo'-om-ahee); middle voice from perperos (braggart; perhaps by reduplication of the base of NT:4008); to boast:

James 4

⁴ Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the <u>friendship of the world</u> is enmity with God? Whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God.

<u>Puffed up</u> – phusioo (foo-see-o'-o); from NT:5449 in the primary sense of blowing; to inflate, i.e. (figuratively) make proud (haughty):

Proverbs 27

¹⁴ He that blesseth his friend with a loud voice, rising early in the morning, it shall be counted a curse to him.

<u>Unseemly</u> – aschemoneo (as-kay-mon-eh'-o); from NT:809; to be (i.e. act) unbecoming: KJV - behaveself uncomely (unseemly).

Proverbs 18

²⁴ A man that hath friends must shew himself friendly: and there is a friend that sticketh closer than a brother.

Love of Friendship (Cont)

<u>Her own</u> – heautou (heh-ow-too') (including all other cases); from a reflexive pronoun otherwise obsolete and the genitive case (dative case or accusative case) of NT:846; him-(her-, it-, them-, also [in conjunction with the personal pronoun of the other persons] my-, thy-, our-, yourself-) (selves), etc.:

KJV - alone, her (own, -self), (he) himself, his (own), itself, one (to) another, our (thine) own (-selves), + that she had, their (own, own selves), (of) them (-selves), they, thyself, you, your (own, own conceits, own selves, -selves).

.<u>Provoked</u> – paroxuno (par-ox-oo'-no); from NT:3844 and a derivative of NT:3691; to sharpen alongside, i.e. (figuratively) to exasperate:

KJV - easily provoke, stir.

Job 19 ¹⁹ All my <u>inward friends abhorred me</u>: and they whom I loved are turned against me

<u>Thinks</u> – logizomai (log-id'-zom-ahee); middle voice from NT:3056; to take an inventory, i.e. estimate (literally or figuratively):

KJV - conclude, (ac-) count (of), + despise, esteem, impute, lay, number, reason, reckon, suppose, think (on).

NT:3056 logos (log'-os); from NT:3004; something said (including the thought); by implication a topic (subject of discourse), also reasoning (the mental faculty) or motive; by extension, a computation; specifically (with the article in John) the Divine Expression (i.e. Christ):

Psalm 41

⁹ Yea, mine own familiar friend, in whom I trusted, which did eat of my bread, hath lifted up his heel against me.

The True Test of Friendship does not depend upon what you expect from them what they expect from you what the world thinks how you feel how others feel how much or how little you have how much or little others have What you think you should have in return

Romans 13

⁸ Owe no man any thing, but to love one another: for <u>he that loveth</u> <u>another hath fulfilled the law</u>.

Philippians 2

¹⁹ But <u>I trust in the Lord Jesus to send</u> Timotheus shortly unto you, that I also may be of good comfort, when I know your state.
