<u>Collection</u> – <u>NT:3048</u>  $\lambda$ oyí $\alpha$  **logeia** (log-i'-ah) or logia (log-ee'-ah); from <u>NT:3056</u> (in the commercial sense); a contribution: **KJV** - collection, gathering.

<u>Given order</u> – <u>NT:1299</u> διατάσσω **diatasso** (dee-at-as'-so); from <u>NT:1223</u> and <u>NT:5021</u>; to arrange thoroughly, i.e. (specially) institute, prescribe, etc.:

**KJV** - appoint, command, give, (set in) order, ordain.

# Philippians 4

<sup>14</sup> Notwithstanding ye have well done, that ye did communicate with my affliction.

<sup>15</sup> Now ye Philippians know also, that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no church communicated with me as concerning giving and receiving, but ye only.

<sup>16</sup> For even in Thessalonica ye sent once and again unto my necessity.

### 1 Timothy 6

**KJV** - (to) communicate (-ation), communion, (contri-) distribution, fellowship.

#### Galatians 6

<sup>9</sup> And **let us not be weary in well doing**: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.

<sup>10</sup> As we have therefore opportunity, let us **do good unto all men**, **especially** unto them who are of the **household of faith**.

#### Genesis 14

<sup>19</sup> And he blessed him, and said, Blessed be Abram of the most high God, possessor of heaven and earth:

let lay – NT:5087  $\tau$ ίθημι **tithemi** (tith'-ay-mee); a prolonged form of a primary theo (theh'-o) (which is used only as alternate in certain tenses); to place (in the widest application, literally and figuratively; properly, in a passive or horizontal posture, and thus different from NT:2476, which properly denotes an upright and active position, while NT:2749 is properly reflexive and utterly prostrate):

**KJV** - + advise, appoint, bow, commit, conceive, give, \*kneel down, lay (aside, down, up), make, ordain, purpose, put, set (forth), settle, sink down.

Prospered – NT:2137 εὐοδόω **euodoo** (yoo-od-o'-o); from a compound of NT:2095 and NT:3598; to help on the road, i.e. (passively) succeed in reaching; figuratively, to succeed in business affairs:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - (have a) prosper (-ous journey).

<u>Gatherings</u> – <u>NT:3048</u>  $\lambda$ oyí $\alpha$  **logeia** (log-i'-ah) or logia (log-ee'-ah); from <u>NT:3056</u> (in the commercial sense); a contribution: **KJV** - collection, gathering.

<u>Liberality</u> – <u>NT:5485</u> χάρις **charis** (khar'-ece); from <u>NT:5463</u>; graciousness (as gratifying), of manner or act (abstract or concrete; literal, figurative or spiritual; especially the divine influence upon the heart, and its reflection in the life; including gratitude): **KJV** - acceptable, benefit, favour, gift, grace (-ious), joy, liberality, pleasure, thank (-s, -worthy).

#### Matthew 6

<sup>2</sup> Therefore when thou doest thine alms, do not sound a trumpet before thee, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may have glory of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward.

<sup>3</sup> But when thou doest alms, let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth:

## 2 Corinthians 8

<sup>14</sup> But by an equality, that now at this time your abundance may be a **supply for their want**, that **their abundance also may be a supply for your want**: that there may be **equality**:

Equality – NT:2471 ἰσότης **isotes** (ee-sot'-ace); likeness (in condition or proportion); by implication, equity: KJV - equal (-ity).

 $\underline{\text{Meet}} - \underline{\text{NT:514}}$  ἄξιος **axios** (ax'-ee-os); probably from  $\underline{\text{NT:71}}$ ;  $\underline{\text{deserving}}$ , comparable or suitable (as if drawing praise):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - due reward, meet, [un-] worthy.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> That thine alms may be in secret: and thy Father which seeth in secret himself shall reward thee openly.

## 1 Corinthians 16 ...a purpose to travel

<sup>5</sup> Now I will come unto you, when I shall <u>pass through</u> Macedonia: for I do <u>pass through</u> Macedonia. <u>Pass through</u> – <u>NT:1330</u> δι έρχομαι **dierchomai** (dee-er'-khom-ahee); from <u>NT:1223</u> and <u>NT:2064</u>; to traverse (literally):

**KJV** - come, depart, go (about, abroad, everywhere, over, through, throughout), pass (by, over, through, throughout), pierce through, travel, walk through.

## 1 Corinthians 16 ... provision for the journey

<sup>6</sup> And it may be that I will abide, yea, and winter with you, that ye may <u>bring</u> me on my journey whithersoever I go [travel].

Bring – NT:4311 προπέμπω **propempo** (prop-em'-po); from NT:4253 and NT:3992; to send forward, i.e. escort or **aid in travel**:

**KJV** - accompany, bring (forward) on journey (way), conduct forth.

# 1 Corinthians 16 ...according to the Lord's will

<sup>7</sup>For I will not see you now by the way; but I trust to tarry a while with you, if the Lord <u>permit</u>.

<u>Permit</u> – <u>NT:2010</u> ἐπιτρέπω **epitrepo** (ep-ee-trep'-o); from <u>NT:1909</u> and the base of NT:5157; to turn over (transfer), i.e. allow:

**KJV** - give leave (liberty, license), let, permit, suffer.

## 1 Corinthians 16 ...in the Lord's timing

<sup>8</sup> But I will tarry at Ephesus until Pentecost.

Pentecost – NT:4005 πεντηκοστή **pentekoste** (pen-tay-kos-tay'); feminine of the ord. of NT:4004; fiftieth (NT:2250 being implied) from Passover, i.e. the festival of "Pentecost": **KJV** - Pentecost.

# 1 Corinthians 16 ... powerful in the face of the enemy

<sup>9</sup> For a great <u>door</u> and <u>effectual</u> is opened unto me, and there are many <u>adversaries</u>.

 $\underline{\text{Door}} - \underline{\text{NT:2374}} \theta \acute{\text{o}} \rho \alpha$  **thura** (thoo'-rah); apparently a primary word [compare "door"]; a portal or entrance (the opening or the closure, literally or figuratively):

**KJV** - door, gate.

Effectual – NT:1756 ἐνεργής **energes** (en-er-gace'); from NT:1722 and NT:2041; active, operative:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - effectual, powerful.

Adversaries – NT:480 ἀντίκειμαι **antikeimai** (an-tik'-i-mahee); from NT:473 and NT:2749; to lie opposite, i.e. be adverse (figuratively, repugnant) to:

**KJV** - adversary, be contrary, oppose.

Perhaps in the same way gladiators entered the door of the arena knowing the adversity before them was opportunity for victory.

#### 2 Corinthians 4

<sup>17</sup> For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory;

#### 2 Corinthians 6

- <sup>1</sup>We then, as workers together with him, beseech you also that ye receive not the grace of God in vain.
- <sup>2</sup> (For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.)

Despise – NT:1848 έξουθενέω **exoutheneo** (ex-00-then-eh'-0); a variation of NT:1847 and meaning the same: KJV - contemptible, despise, least esteemed, set at nought.

...from – NT:1847 ἐξουδενόω **exoudenoo** (ex-oo-den-o'-o); from NT:1537 and a derivative of the neuter of NT:3762; to make utterly nothing of, i.e. despise:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - set at nought. See also NT:1848.

Peace – NT:1515 εἰρήνη **eirene** (i-ray'-nay); probably from a primary verb eiro (to join); peace (literally or figuratively); by implication, prosperity:

**KJV** - one, peace, quietness, rest, + set at one again.

# 1 Corinthians 16 ...as ministers minister ~ All Come when called by God

<sup>12</sup> As touching our brother Apollos, I greatly desired him to come unto you with the brethren: but **his will** was not at all to come at this time; but **he will come when** he shall have <u>convenient time</u>.

Convenient time – NT:2119 εὐκαιρέω **eukaireo** (yoo-kahee-reh'-o); from NT:2121; to have good time, i.e. opportunity or leisure:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - have leisure (convenient time), spend time.

#### Real Men

#### 1 Corinthians 16

<sup>13</sup> Watch ye, <u>stand fast</u> in the faith, <u>quit you like men</u>, be strong.

Stand fast – NT:4739 στήκω **steko** (stay'-ko); from the perfect tense of NT:2476; to be stationary, i.e. (figuratively) to persevere:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - stand (fast).

Quit you like men – NT:407 ἀνδρίζομαι **andrizomai** (an-drid'-zom-ahee); middle voice from NT:435; to act manly: **KJV** - quit like men.

## 1 Timothy 6

<sup>10</sup> For the **love of money is the root of all evil**: which while some coveted after, they have **erred from the faith**, and **pierced themselves through with many sorrows**.

<sup>11</sup> But thou, **O man of God**, flee these things; and **follow after righteousness**, **godliness**, **faith**, **love**, **patience**, **meekness**.

..as a Moses, Elijah, Elisha, David, Shamaiah unto Rehoboam... Lived by the Word of God...

# 2 Timothy 3 ...so also be like them men who live

**KJV** - (feast of) charity ([-ably]), dear, love.

#### 1 Corinthians 8:1

Now as touching things offered unto idols, we know that we all have knowledge. Knowledge puffeth up, but **charity edifieth.** 

#### 1 Corinthians 13:2

And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing.

#### 1 Corinthians 13:3

And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing.

Addicted – NT:5021 T $\acute{\alpha}$ OO $\acute{\omega}$  **tasso** (tas'-so); a prolonged form of a primary verb (which latter appears only in certain tenses); to <u>arrange in an orderly manner</u>, i.e. assign or dispose (to a certain position or lot): **KJV** - addict, appoint, <u>determine</u>, ordain, set.

#### 2 Corinthians 9

<sup>2</sup> For I know the **forwardness [eagerness] of your mind**, for which **I boast of you** to them of Macedonia, that **Achaia was ready a year ago**; and your **zeal hath provoked very many**.

#### Submissive

#### 1 Corinthians 16

<sup>16</sup> That ye <u>submit</u> yourselves unto such, and to every one that <u>helpeth</u> with us, and <u>laboureth</u>. <u>Submit</u> – <u>NT:5293</u> ὑποτάσσω **hupotasso** (hoop-ot-as'-so); from <u>NT:5259</u> and <u>NT:5021</u>; to subordinate; reflexively, to obey:

**KJV** - be under obedience (obedient), put under, subdue unto, (be, make) subject (to, unto), be (put) in subjection (to, under), submitself unto.

Helpeth – NT:4903 συνεργέω **sunergeo** (soon-erg-eh'-o); from NT:4904; to be a fellowworker, i.e. co-operate:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - help (work) with, work (-er) together.

<u>Laboureth</u> – <u>NT:2872</u> κοπιάω **kopiao** (kop-ee-ah'-o); from a derivative of <u>NT:2873</u>; to feel fatigue; by implication, to work hard:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - (bestow) labour, toil, be wearied.

#### James 4

**KJV** - that which is behind, (that which was) lack (-ing), penury, want.

Supplied – NT:378 ἀναπληρόω **anapleroo** (an-ap-lay-ro'-o); from NT:303 and NT:4137; to complete; by implication, to occupy, supply; figuratively, to accomplish (by coincidence ot obedience): **KJV** - fill up, fulfill, occupy, supply.

#### Matthew 19

<sup>20</sup> The young man saith unto him, All these things have I kept from my youth up: what lack I yet?

The Lord said..sell everything and give to the poor...take up your cross and follow me...

#### 2 Corinthians 8

<sup>15</sup> As it is written, He that had gathered much had nothing over; and he that had gathered little had no lack.

<sup>19</sup> The churches of Asia salute you. Aquila and Priscilla salute you much in the Lord, with the church that is in their house.

#### Romans 16

<sup>3</sup> Greet **Priscilla** and **Aquila** my helpers in Christ Jesus:\

 $\underline{\text{Holy}}$  –  $\underline{\text{NT:40}}$  ἄγιος **hagios** (hag'-ee-os); from **hagos** (an awful thing) [compare  $\underline{\text{NT:53}}$ ,  $\underline{\text{NT:2282}}$ ; sacred (physically, pure, morally blameless or religious, ceremonially, consecrated):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - (most) holy (one, thing), saint.

Kiss – NT:5370  $\phi$ ίλημα **philema** (fil'-ay-mah); from NT:5368; a kiss: **KJV** - kiss.

...from – NT:5368  $\phi \iota \lambda \acute{\epsilon} \omega$  **phileo** (fil-eh'-o); from NT:5384; to be a friend to (fond of [an individual or an object]), i.e. have affection for (denoting personal attachment, as a matter of sentiment or feeling; while NT:25 is wider, embracing especially the judgment and the deliberate assent of the will as a matter of principle, duty and propriety: the two thus stand related very much as NT:2309 and NT:1014, or as NT:2372 and NT:3563 respectively; the former being chiefly of the heart and the latter of the head); specifically, to kiss (as a mark of tenderness): **KJV** - kiss, love.

<sup>16</sup> Salute one another with an holy **kiss**. The churches of Christ salute you.

#### Psalm 85

<sup>10</sup> Mercy and truth are met together; righteousness and peace have kissed each other.

**KJV** - accused, anathema, curse, <sup>X</sup> great.

<u>Maranatha</u> – NT:3134 μαράν ἀθά **maran atha** (mar'-an ath'-ah); of Aramaic origin (meaning <u>our Lord has come</u>); maranatha, i.e. an <u>exclamation of the approaching</u> divine judgment: **KJV** - Maran-atha.
