Typification – to have all or most of the characteristics of a particular type of person or thing and therefore be a suitable example of it

OBLATION

2 Timothy 4

⁶For I am now <u>ready to be offered</u>, and the <u>time</u> of my <u>departure</u> is <u>at hand</u>.

Ready to be offered – NT:4689 σπένδω **spendo** (spen'-do); apparently a primary verb; to <u>pour out as a libation</u>, i.e. (figuratively) to <u>devote</u> (one's life or blood, <u>as a sacrifice</u>) ("spend"): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - (be ready to) be offered.

It's a glorious thing to know: you're ready...

Romans 12

¹ I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a **living** sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.

<u>Time</u> – <u>NT:2540</u> καιρός **kairos** (kahee-ros'); of uncertain affinity; an occasion, i.e. set or proper time:

KJV - ^X always, opportunity, (convenient, due) season, (due, short, while) time, a while. Compare NT:5550.

Departure – NT:359 ἀνάλυσις **analusis** (an-al'-oo-sis); from NT:360; departure: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - departure.

...from – NT:360 ἀναλύω **analuo** (an-al-oo'-o); from NT:303 and NT:3089; to break up, i.e. depart (literally or figuratively): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - depart, return.

At hand – NT:2186 ἐφίστημι **ephistemi** (ef-is'-tay-mee); from NT:1909 and NT:2476; to stand upon, i.e. be present (in various applications, friendly or otherwise, usually literal);

KJV - assault, come (in, to, unto, upon), be at hand (instant), present, stand (before, by, over).

<u>Forsaken</u> – <u>NT:1459</u> ἐγκαταλείπω **egkataleipo** (eng-kat-al-i'-po); from <u>NT:1722</u> and <u>NT:2641</u>; to leave behind in some place, i.e. (in a good sense) let remain over, or (in a bad sense) to desert: **KJV** - forsake, leave.

Present – NT:3568 νύν **nun** (noon); a primary particle of present time; "now" (as adverb of date, a transition or emphasis); also as noun or adjective present or immediate: **KJV** - henceforth, + hereafter, of late, soon, present, this (time). See also NT:3569, NT:3570.

REJECTION

2 Timothy 4 (cont)

¹⁰ For **Demas hath forsaken me**, having **loved this present world**, and is **departed** unto Thessalonica; **Crescens to Galatia**, **Titus unto Dalmatia**.

<u>Departed</u> – <u>NT:4198</u> πορεύομαι **poreuomai** (por-yoo'-om-ahee); middle voice from a derivative of the same as <u>NT:3984</u>; to traverse, i.e. travel (literally or figuratively; especially to remove [figuratively, die], live, etc.); KJV - depart, go (away, forth, one's way, up), (make a, take a) journey, walk.

2 Timothy 4

- ¹⁴ **Alexander** the coppersmith **did me much evil**: the Lord **reward** him according to his works:
- ¹⁵ Of whom be thou ware also; for he hath **greatly withstood our words**.
- ¹⁶ At my first answer no man stood with me, but **all men forsook** me: I pray God that it may not be laid to their charge.

2 Timothy 4

¹¹Only Luke is with me. Take Mark, and bring him with thee: for he is <u>profitable</u> to me for the ministry.

Profitable – NT:2173 εΰχρηστος **euchrestos** (yoo'-khrays-tos); from NT:2095 and NT:5543; easily used, i.e. useful: **KJV** - profitable, meet for use.

Ministry – NT:1248 διακονία **diakonia** (dee-ak-on-ee'-ah); from NT:1249; attendance (as a servant, etc.); figuratively (eleemosynary) aid, (official) service (especially of the Christian teacher, or techn. of the diaconate):

KJV - (ad-) minister (-ing, -tration, -try), office, relief, service (-ing).

2 Timothy 4

¹² And Tychicus have I sent to Ephesus.

2 Timothy 4

¹³ The **cloke** that I left at Troas with Carpus, when thou comest, bring with thee, and the books, but **especially the <u>parchments</u>**

Parchments – NT:3200 μεμβράνα **membrana** (mem-bran'-ah); of Latin origin ("membrane"); a (written) sheep-skin: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - parchment.

2 Timothy 4

⁹Do thy **diligence** to come shortly unto me:

<u>Diligence</u> – <u>NT:4704</u> σπουδάζω **spoudazo** (spoo-dad'-zo); from <u>NT:4710</u>; to use speed, i.e. to make effort, be prompt or earnest:

KJV - do (give) diligence, be diligent (forward), endeavour, labour, study. Shortly – NT:5030 ταχέως **tacheos** (takh-eh'-oce); adverb from NT:5036; briefly, i.e. (in time) speedily, or (in manner) rapidly: **KJV** - hastily, quickly, shortly, soon, suddenly.

PARTICIPATION

2 Timothy 4

⁷ I have <u>fought</u> a good <u>fight</u>, I have <u>finished</u> my <u>course</u>, I have <u>kept</u> the <u>faith</u>:

Fought – NT:75 ἀγωνίζομαι **agonizomai** (ag-o-nid'-zom-ahee); from NT:73; to struggle, literally (to compete for a prize), figuratively (to contend with an adversary), or genitive case (to endeavor to accomplish something): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - fight, labor fervently, strive. Fight – NT:73 ἀγών **agon** (ag-one'); from NT:71; properly, a place of assembly (as if led), i.e. (by implication) a contest (held there); figuratively, an effort or anxiety: **KJV** - conflict, contention, fight, race.

<u>Finished</u> – <u>NT:5055</u> Τελέω **teleo** (tel-eh'-o); from <u>NT:5056</u>; to end, ie. complete, execute, conclude, discharge (a debt):

KJV - accomplish, make an end, expire, fill up, finish, go over, pay, perform. <u>Course</u> – <u>NT:1408</u> δρόμος **dromos** (drom'-os); from the alternate of <u>NT:5143</u>; a race, i.e. (figuratively) career: **KJV** - course.

...from – NT:5143 Τρέχω **trecho** (trekh'-o); apparently a primary verb (properly, **threcho**; compare NT:2359); which uses **dremo** (drem'-o) (the base of NT:1408) as alternate in certain tenses; to run or walk hastily (literally or figuratively): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - have course, run.

Hebrews 12

¹ Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us,

Ecclesiastes 9

¹¹ I returned, and saw under the sun, that the **race** is not to the swift, nor the battle to the strong, neither yet bread to the wise, nor yet riches to men of understanding, nor yet favour to men of skill; but time and chance happeneth to them all.

<u>Kept</u> – <u>NT:5083</u> Τηρέω **tereo** (tay-reh'-o); from teros (a watch; perhaps akin to <u>NT:2334</u>); to guard (from loss or injury, properly, by <u>keeping the eye upon</u>; and thus differing from <u>NT:5442</u>, which is properly to prevent escaping; and from <u>NT:2892</u>, which implies a fortress or full military lines of apparatus), i.e. to note (a prophecy; figuratively, to <u>fulfil a command</u>); by implication, to detain (in custody; figuratively, to maintain); by extension, to withhold (for personal ends; figuratively, to keep unmarried); by extension, to withhold (for personal ends; figuratively, to keep unmarried): *KJV* - hold fast, keep (-er), (pre-, re-) serve, watch.

Faith – NT:4102 πίστις **pistis** (pis'-tis); from NT:3982; persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (of religious truth, or the truthfulness of God or a religious teacher), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation; abstractly, constancy in such profession; by extension, the system of religious (Gospel) truth itself: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - assurance, belief, believe, faith, fidelity.

CORONATION

2 Timothy 4

⁸ <u>Henceforth</u> there is <u>laid up</u> for me a <u>crown</u> of <u>righteousness</u>, which the Lord, the <u>righteous</u> judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but **unto all them also that love his <u>appearing</u>**.

<u>Henceforth</u> – <u>NT:3063</u> λοιπόν **loipon** (loy-pon'); neuter singular of the same as <u>NT:3062</u>; <u>something remaining</u> (adverbially):

KJV - besides, finally, furthermore, (from) henceforth, moreover, now, + it remaineth, then.

<u>Laid up</u> – <u>NT:606</u> ἀπόκειμαι **apokeimai** (ap-ok'-i-mahee); from <u>NT:575</u> and <u>NT:2749</u>; to be reserved; figuratively, to await:

KJV - be appointed, (be) laid up.

<u>Crown</u> – <u>NT:4735</u> στέφανος **stephanos** (stef-an-os); from an apparently primary stepho (to twine or wreathe); a chaplet (as a badge of royalty, a prize in the public games or a symbol of honor generally; but more conspicuous and elaborate than the simple fillet, <u>NT:1238</u>), literally or figuratively: **KJV** - crown.

Righteousness – NT:1343 δικαιοσύνη **dikaiosune** (dik-ah-yos-oo'-nay); from NT:1342; equity (of character or act); specially (Christian) justification: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - righteousness.

Righteous – NT:1342 δίκαιος **dikaios** (dik'-ah-yos); from NT:1349; equitable (in character or act); by implication, innocent, holy (absolutely or relatively):

KJV - just, meet, right (-eous).

Appearing – NT:2015 ἐπιφάνεια **epiphaneia** (ep-if-an'-i-ah); from NT:2016; a manifestation, i.e. (specially) the advent of Christ (past or future): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - appearing, brightness.

1 Corinthians 9

²³ And this I do for the gospel's sake, that I might be partaker thereof with you.

²⁴ Know ye not that they which **run in a race** run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain.

²⁵ And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible.

²⁶ I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air:

Fight with assurance and certainty...

Revelation 19

PROCLAMATION

2 Timothy 4

¹⁷ Notwithstanding, moreover, **the <u>Lord stood</u> with me**, and <u>strengthened me</u>; that by me the <u>preaching might be fully known</u>, and **that all the <u>Gentiles might hear</u>**: and I was <u>delivered</u> out of the mouth of the lion.

<u>Lord</u> – <u>NT:2962</u> κύριος **kurios** (koo'-ree-os); from kuros (supremacy); supreme in authority, i.e. (as noun) controller; by implication, Mr. (as a respectful title): *KJV* - God, Lord, master, Sir.

<u>Stood</u> – <u>NT:3936</u> παρίστημι **paristemi** (par-is'-tay-mee); or **prolonged paristano** (par-is-tan'-o); from <u>NT:3844</u> and <u>NT:2476</u>; to stand beside, i.e. (transitively) to exhibit, proffer, (specifically) recommend, (figuratively) substantiate; or (intransitively) to be at hand (or ready), aid:

KJV - assist, bring before, command, commend, give presently, present, prove, provide, shew, stand (before, by, here, up, with), yield.

Strengthened – NT:1743 ἐνδυναμόω **endunamoo** (en-doo-nam-o'-o); from NT:1722 and NT:1412; to empower: **KJV** - enable, (increase in) strength (-en), be (make) strong.

Preaching – NT:2782 κήρυγμα **kerugma** (kay'-roog-mah); from NT:2784; a proclamation (especially of the gospel; by implication, the gospel itself): **KJV** - preaching.

<u>Might be fully known</u> – <u>NT:4135</u> πληροφορέω **plerophoreo** (play-rof-or-eh'-o); from <u>NT:4134</u> and <u>NT:5409</u>; to carry out fully (in evidence), i.e. completely assure (or convince), entirely accomplish:

KJV - most surely believe, fully know (persuade), make full proof of.

...from – NT:5409 ϕ o ρ έω **phoreo** (for-eh'-o); from NT:5411; to have a burden, i.e. (by analogy) to wear as clothing or a constant accompaniment: **KJV** - bear, wear.

Gentiles – NT:1484 $\xi\theta$ VO ζ **ethnos** (eth'-nos); probably from NT:1486; a race (as of the same habit), i.e. a tribe; specially, a foreign (non-Jewish) one (usually by implication, pagan): **KJV** - Gentile, heathen, nation, people.

<u>Hear</u> – <u>NT:191</u> ἀκούω **akouo** (ak-oo'-o); a primary verb; to hear (in various senses): **KJV** - give (in the) audience (of), come (to the ears), ([shall]) hear (-er, -ken), be noised, be reported, understand.

<u>Delivered</u> – NT:4506 ρύομαι **rhoumai** (hroo'-om-ahee); middle voice of an obsolete verb, akin to NT:4482 (through the idea of a current; compare NT:4511); to rush or draw (for oneself), i.e. rescue: **KJV** - deliver (-er).

PRESERVATION

2 Timothy 4

And [in fact] the Lord shall <u>deliver</u> me from every <u>evil</u> <u>work</u>, and will <u>preserve</u> me unto his heavenly <u>kingdom</u>: to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

<u>Deliver</u> – <u>NT:4506</u> ρύομαι **rhoumai** (hroo'-om-ahee); middle voice of an obsolete verb, akin to <u>NT:4482</u> (through the idea of a current; compare <u>NT:4511</u>); to rush or draw (for oneself), i.e. rescue: **KJV** - deliver (-er).

Evil – NT:4190 πονηρός **poneros** (pon-ay-ros'); from a derivative of NT:4192; hurtful, i.e. evil (properly, in effect or influence, and thus differing from NT:2556, which refers rather to essential character, as well as from NT:4550, which indicates degeneracy from original virtue); figuratively, calamitous; also (passively) ill, i.e. diseased; but especially (morally) culpable, i.e. derelict, vicious, facinorous; neuter (singular) mischief, malice, or (plural) guilt; masculine (singular) the devil, or (plural) sinners: **KJV** - bad, evil, grievous, harm, lewd, malicious, wicked (-ness). See also NT:4191. Work – NT:2041 ἔργον **ergon** (er'-gon); from a primary (but obsolete) ergo (to work); toil (as an effort or occupation); by implication, an act: **KJV** - deed, doing, labour, work. Preserve – NT:4982 σώζω **sozo** (sode'-zo); from a primary sos (contraction for obsolete saoz, "safe"); to save, i.e. deliver or protect (literally or figuratively):

KJV - heal, preserve, save (self), do well, be (make) whole.

<u>Kingdom</u> – <u>NT:932</u> βασιλεία **basileia** (bas-il-i'-ah); from <u>NT:935</u>; properly, royalty, i.e. (abstractly) rule, or (concretely) a realm (literally or figuratively): *KJV* - kingdom, * reign.

1 Chronicles 18

¹³ And he put garrisons in Edom; and all the Edomites became David's servants. Thus the LORD **preserved David** whithersoever he went.

Salute – NT:782 ἀσπάζομαι **aspazomai** (as-pad'-zom-ahee); from NT:1 (as a particle of union) and a presumed form of NT:4685; to enfold in the arms, i.e. (by implication) to salute, (figuratively) to welcome: **KJV** - embrace, greet, salute, take leave.

Household – NT:3624 οἶκος **oikos** (oy'-kos); of uncertain affinity; a dwelling (more or less extensive, literal or figurative); by implication a family (more or less related, literal or

KJV - home, house (-hold), temple.

figuratively):

²⁰ Erastus [beloved] abode at Corinth: but Trophimus [nutritive] have I left at Miletum sick.

ANTICIPATION

2 Timothy 4

²¹ <u>Do thy diligence</u> to come before winter. Eubulus greeteth thee, and Pudens, and Linus, and Claudia, and all the brethren.

<u>Do thy diligence</u> – <u>NT:4704</u> σπουδάζω **spoudazo** (spoo-dad'-zo); from <u>NT:4710</u>; to use speed, i.e. to make effort, be prompt or earnest:

KJV - do (give) diligence, be diligent (forward), endeavour, labour, study.
